

Gym Or No Gym Finding - Your Ideal Exercise Routine

Versatile home equipment such as the Bowflex VeloCore Bike 22" (https://www.bowflex.com/bikes/velocore/100914.html) are great for getting in a cardio session without the need to go to a gym. With the JRNY app on the VeloCore bike, you can tour new cities, participate in trainer-led rides or catch up on your favorite shows on Netflix, Hulu, Amazon Prime Video, HBO Max and Disney+.

• Sweat the small stuff: Even small amounts of exercise can be beneficial. If you're at a desk or sitting still most of the day, try standing up at frequent intervals throughout the day, going for walks or doing short workouts such as jumping jacks or squats. This can help counter the negative effects of a sedentary lifestyle, which is especially important in the work-from-home era.

• Get outside: There's a strong link between time spent outdoors and physiological benefits, including reduced stress and mental fatigue and improved mood.

"Consider taking a daily walk or picking up an outdoor hobby to ensure you're getting enough time outside," suggests Holland. "Pets can be a great reason to get outside more frequently, so if you've ever thought about getting a dog, maybe now is the time!"

• Take up a family or group activity: Exercise doesn't have to be a solo activity. In fact, it can be a great opportunity to spend some quality time with ends and family. Recreational sports such as pickleball are easy to learn and can be accessible fun for the whole family, no matter the age or ability level.

"Pickleball is a new activity I've discovered and one my whole family has been enjoying," Holland adds. "If you're thinking about giving it a try but are concerned about your fitness level, I recommend exercises like bodyweight squats, skaters and jumping jacks as a warm-up to get your body in pickleball-playing shape."

Heritage Center Service Clubs Exhibit Opens to Public April 22

"Centuries of Service: A Salute to Slate Belt Service Clubs" opens to the public Saturday, April 22, from 12 - 3 pm at the Slate Belt Heritage Center.

Service is people helping people without any expectation of reward. The new show follows the growth of service clubs, from the mutual benefit societies that only aided members, to the 20th century clubs that gave men, women, boys, and girls a voice and promoted good citizenship, to today's national organizations that are open to all.

You'll discover why people formed these clubs, get a glimpse into some of the "secret" early rituals, and connect their causes and mission to the community. From the Knights of the Golden Eagle to the Weona Park Pals, all worked (and played) to serve the Slate Belt.



The dedication ceremony starts at 11 am and demonstrations will continue through the afternoon. The Heritage Center (adjacent to Bethel Park) will open from 12 - 3, serve light snacks, and have special displays of Flory Manufacturing material. You'll be able to view a continuous slide show that highlights the life of the hoist from the quarry to its new home.

The Heritage Center will also unveil the new outdoor signage sponsored by a Northampton County Department of Community and Economic Development Hotel Tax Grant. The NPS standard display signs bring Slate Belt history out of the museum and into downtown Bangor.

The Slate Belt Heritage Center is located in the 1907 Town Hall building at 30 North First Street, Bangor, PA. Founded in 1999, the Center is a not-You can also enjoy refreshed exhibits that feature early Slate Belt History, for-profit- 501 (c) 3 that collects, preserves, interprets and makes public the history, ethnic traditions and industrial heritage of the area. SBHC is open Saturdays and Sundays, noon to 3 PM from mid-April through October and Sundays, November through March, noon - 3PM. Tours and research time can be scheduled by appointment.




