## Celebrate the Earth With a New Vision On Eye Care

When it comes to recycling, you may not often think about something as small as your contact lenses. Did you know, though, that 45 million Americans who wear contact lenses flush anywhere between 1.8 and 3.36 billion lenses down the toilet or sink per year? As a result, contact lenses could be contributing to the trillions of microplastics in waterways that can harm marine wildlife and even enter our food supply.

This Earth Day, celebrated on April 22, is an excellent time to adopt new habits in an effort to go green. If you're like many people, you've probably already made a few changes to your routine, from switching to reusable water bottles and reusable grocery bags, even to composting.

Because of their small size, contact lenses can get filtered out of regular recycling center facilities and end up in landfills.

Understanding the impact this could have on the environment, Bausch + Lomb, the makers of Biotrue ONEday daily disposable contact lenses joined forces with TerraCycle, a global leader in recycling hard-to-recycle waste, to develop the first and only contact lens recycling program available in the U.S., the ONE-by-ONE Recycling Program.

The program collects contact lens waste, which is then separated based on composition and melted

into plastic that can be combined with other recycled materials to become playground sets and park benches. Most recently Bausch + Lomb took the program one step further by repurposing the recycled waste to create custom training modules that were donated to the Guide Dog Foundation, a national not-for-profit that trains guide dogs for people who are blind or visually impaired.

The modules, which were funded by the Bausch Foundation, included benches, tables, waste stations and an agility ramp used to train the dogs and to further enhance the organization's Smithtown, N.Y. campus for those who visit.

This free recycling program accepts used contact lens materials from Biotrue ONEday, as well as other brands. To participate, simply collect your used contact lenses, plus the blisters and foil they come in, and bring them to a participating eye care provider. While this change may seem small, it has the power to make a big impact on global recycling efforts, making it an excellent habit to start adopting today. StatePoint)

## Bangor's Fielding Key to 6-2 Win Over Solehi

If you follow baseball you know that mighty home runs and crucial hitting often grab the headlines.

It's very seldom that teams are credited for their fielding excellence in winning baseball games. But if you look at the line score for Bangor and Southern Lehigh from last night's game, you see that Bangor outscored the Southern Lehigh 6-2, however, a less conspicuous but nonetheless crucial stat, was the Spartans' six errors to only one for the Slaters.

Combine that with the effort of Bangor starting pitcher Rein Farensbach scattering eight hits in six-plus innings with relief help from Hunter Rydell and you have the Slaters' formula for beating the Spartans which came into last night's game with only one Colonial League loss.

Bangor scored in the top of the first when Farensbach singled, moved to second on a fielder's choice and scored on the first of six Spartan errors.

In the third inning, Farensbach reached first on an error and stole second. Kael Godshalk was hit by a pitch putting a pair of runners on base with no outs. An error on a ball hit by Alec Rutt sent Farensbach home. Godshalk then scored on an RBI single by Greg Campbell, making the score 3-1 going to the bottom of the third.

Bangor scored three times in the fifth to take a 6-1 lead. Rutt and Campbell walked to start the inning. Zach Karner's single was followed by two Southern Lehigh errors and Braydon Strohe's sacrifice fly increasing the Slaters' lead by three runs going to the bottom of the fifth.

In winning their third straight game, Bangor improved to 4-2 in the Colonial League and 4-3 overall. Monday they will entertain Moravian Academy and Tuesday they will travel to Pen Argyl.

Farensbach gave up eight hits, struck out four and walked one while throwing 100 pitches in six and two-thirds innings. Rydell came on in the seventh with two runners on base and two outs and got the final out.

Godshalk led the team with two hits.

The Bangor softball team won 5-3, improving their record to 6-1 overall. No other details available.

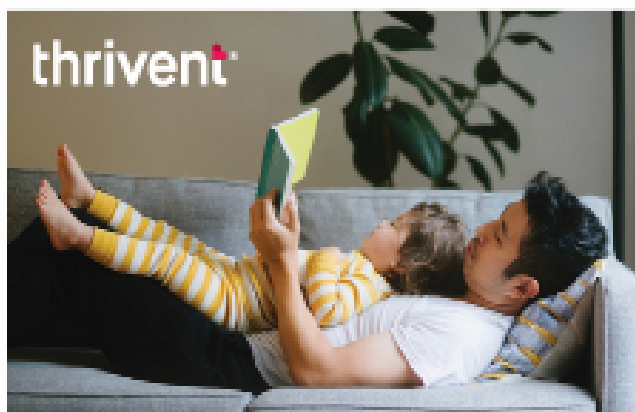

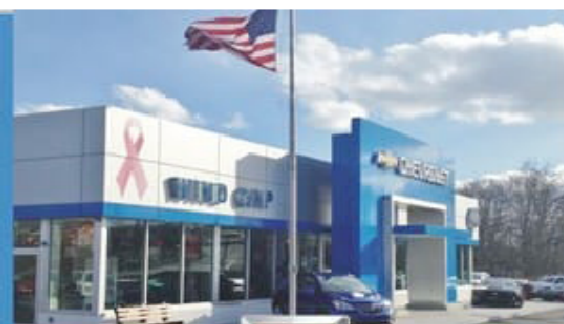

## State Food Assistance

Pennsylvania State officials have encouraged all Pennsylvania residents to take full advantage of all food assistance programs, if needed, over the holiday season.

"Pennsylvania's food assistance programs were built for times like these. No one should be too shy to take advantage of the offer," said Russell Redding, secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

But those assets haven't stopped the covid-19 pandemic from destabilizing personal finances and causing heightened food insecurity for millions of residents. Compared to 2018, when roughly 11% of adults in Pennsylvania were food insecure, Redding said 15.5% experience the issue this year.

The difference is even starker when it comes to children in the state. In 2018, 15% children experienced food insecurity. That number has climbed to 24% in 2020.

Local food pantries saw greater demand especially early in the pandemic and through the summer, with miles-long lines at each weekly distribution and millions of pounds of food provided.

"Food insecurity was a problem for millions of Americans before March 2020," said Teresa Miller, secretary of the Department of Human Services.

## GKEDC Scholarships

The Green Knight Economic Development Corp (GKEDC) has awarded approximately \$200,000 in scholarships to over 50 high school seniors who live in the Pen Argyl School District and who will be continuing his/her education in a college program. GKEDC accepts scholarship applications annually from approximately April 1 through May 8th.

### Scholarship Information

1. The scholarships will be awarded to individuals who reflect the ideals of community service and environmental stewardship, and who are seeking a higher education to further advance these ideals into their professional careers.

2. Any graduating high school senior who lives in the Pen Argyl School District and who will be continuing his/her education in a college program is eligible to receive this award.

3. This scholarship will be in the amount of \$4000, to be distributed in four segments over the course of a four-year college program.

- The first segment of \$1000 will be rewarded upon receipt of a certificate of admission or a letter of acceptance received by GKEDC by June 1.

- The remaining yearly distributions of \$1000 are dependent on the student taking at least 24 credits per year and successfully maintaining, at a minimum, a cumulative grade point average of 2.5. Grades received during the freshman, sophomore, and junior years must be submitted to GKEDC as proof each June before the next segment of the award will be given.

- Students attending a two-year college and continuing on to obtain their bachelor's degree will qualify for the entire scholarship.

- Monies not rewarded due to ineligibility will remain the property of GKEDC. If a recipient leaves the institution and there are scholarship funds remaining, the institution shall return the balance of the GKEDC Scholarship Award.

4. Parents are urged to encourage their children to apply for the scholarship.

5. The recipients will be announced at their high school's Awards Banquet or equivalent.

6. Scholarships can be used for tuition, books, laboratory fees, and other academic costs; additionally, the scholarship may be used for room and board when the student is housed under the control of the institution.

7. Scholarship checks will be sent directly to the Financial Aid Offices of the institutions involved at the end of the third week of August.

8. If a scholarship winner must delay their education for any reason, the recipient must contact the GKEDC in writing as soon as possible. The scholarship will be held up to two years from the date of high school graduation. After that time, the GKEDC will have the discretion to continue holding or to withdraw the scholarship award as they see fit.

## Home Heating Assistance

LIHEAP is a federally funded program that helps individuals and families pay their heating bills through home heating energy assistance grants. It also provides crisis grants to help in the event of an emergency or if a resident is in danger of losing his or her heat due to broken equipment, lack of fuel or termination of utility service.

The income eligibility guidelines for LIHEAP are set at 150% of the federal poverty income level. For example, the income limit for an individual is \$18,735; for a couple, the limit is \$25,365; and for a family of four, it is \$38,625. Residents may apply for LIHEAP online or by contacting the County Assistance Office in their county of residence.

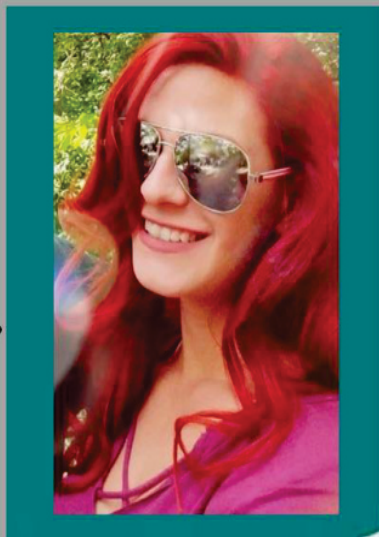
