According to euro.com, if someone asked you - term physical health. Every year an estimated 5.3 pre-pandemic - to think about public health, your million people die from causes related to inactive mind would likely go towards the flu, healthy eating campaigns, and posters warning us of the dangers of extraordinary 80 per cent of British children smoking. You probably wouldn't think about urban move so little that they face a future with poorly planning - but if we want to truly combat one of the developed cardiovascular systems, weak bones worst health crises on our hands, it should be a public and chronic illness." health concern.

Inactivity is currently the world's fourth leading cause of death. It's a problem often confused and conflated with laziness and personal choice, but in reality the issue is geographic, systemic, and woven into the structure of modern living.

In short: if we want to fix our increasingly sedentary world, we have to redesign it.

Political correspondent and cycling enthusiast Peter Walker dedicates a chapter of his new book to this exact issue. The Miracle Pill: Why a sedentary world is getting it all wrong is an eye-opening read, addressing our global inactivity problem and suggesting solutions for readers.

He says that, "Currently, 1.5 billion people around person's choice to swap exercise for Netflix. the world are so inactive they are risking their long-

living - roughly the population of Norway. An

These are just three of many statistics Walker presents and explores in his book. But far from being a guilt-inducing read, making a reader feel ashamed of their desk job or reliance on their car, Walker manages to instill a relentless sense of hope throughout.

During the book it is repeatedly made clear that patterns can be reversed, health can be improved, and it's never too late to start moving.

Most importantly, however, Walker never assigns blame for this public health crisis to individuals. We haven't all become collectively lazy on a catastrophic, global scale: the problem is far bigger and more structural than any one



State Food Assistance

Pennsylvania State officials have encouraged all Pennsylvania residents to take full advantage of all food assistance programs, if needed, over the holiday season.

"Pennsylvania's food assistance programs were built for times like these. No one should be too shy to take advantage of the offer," said Russell Redding, secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

But those assets haven't stopped the covid-19 pandemic from destabilizing personal finances and causing heightened food insecurity for millions of residents. Compared to 2018, when roughly 11% of adults in Pennsylvania were food insecure, Redding said 15.5% experience the issue this year.

The difference is even starker when it comes to children in the state. In 2018, 15% children experienced food insecurity. That number has climbed to 24% in 2020.


Local food pantries saw greater demand especially early in the pandemic and through the summer, with miles-long lines at each weekly distribution and millions of pounds of food provided.

"Food insecurity was a problem for millions of Americans before March 2020," said Teresa Miller, secretary of the Department of Human Services.

LIHEAP is a federally funded program that helps individuals and families pay their heating grants. It also provides crisis grants to help in the event of an emergency or if a resident is in danger of losing his or her heat due to broken equipment, lack of fuel or termination of utility service.

The income eligibility guidelines for LIHEAP are set at 150% of the federal poverty income level. For example, the income limit for an individual is \$18,735; for a couple, the limit is \$25,365; and for a family of four, it is \$38,625. Residents may apply for LIHEAP online or by contacting the County Assistance Office in their county of residence.

Unwanted Med Disposal

Residents are urged to remove expired, unwanted, or unused medicines from the home to reduce the chance of accidents or misuse and to prevent the drugs from entering the environment.
