Enhanced Threat for Fire Spread Today

The combination of lower humidity values, breezy conditions, and drying fine fuels will lead to an enhanced threat for fire spread today in the Slate Belt. Relative humidity values are forecast to drop into the 20s to around 30 percent, while winds will gust out of the northwest around 20 to 25 mph at times. Residents are urged to exercise caution handling any potential fire source, including machinery, cigarettes, and matches. Be sure to properly discard all smoking materials. Any dry grasses and tree litter that ignites will have the potential to spread. fire quickly.





National Day of Silence


National Day of Silence in April each year is a student-led movement to protest bullying and harassment of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) students and those who support them. The Day of Silence brings awareness and illustrates to the schools and the colleges how intimidation, name-calling, and general bullying have a silencing effect. Participating students take a day-long vow of silence.



Bullying and harassment come in several forms. Whether it comes in a physical or verbal form, both are harmful and leave lasting damage. Bullies also harass by damaging property, manipulation or intimidation. No matter the form, the effects on the individual and

surrounding community can be destructive. Show your support for the LGBT community by using on Social Media to bring awareness to this special day. As part of a class assignment on non-violent protests, the University of Virginia students organized the first Day of Silence in 1996. Since then, the National Day of Silence has been observed each year in April.

The First Earth Day



Earth Day, an event to increase public awareness of the world's environmental problems, is celebrated in the United States for the first time on April 22, 1970. Millions of Americans, including students from thousands of colleges and universities, participated in rallies, marches and educational programs across the country.

Earth Day was the brainchild of Senator Gaylord Nelson of Wisconsin, a staunch environmentalist who hoped to provide unity to the grassroots environmental movement and increase ecological awareness. "The objective was to get a nationwide demonstration of concern for the environment so large that it would shake the political establishment out of its lethargy," Senator Nelson said, "and, finally, force this issue permanently onto the national political agenda."

The 1962 publication of Rachel Carson's book Silent Spring—about the effects of pesticides—is often cited as the beginning of the modern environmental movement in the U.S. Sustainability, organic eating and the "back-to-the-land" movement continued to gain steam throughout the 1960s.





The Slate Belt Heritage Center, Bangor, PA will give a glimpse into the African American experience in the Slate Belt in a new book and exhibit, starting April 30th.

A small community of African Americans settled in the upper tier of Northampton County from 1880-1970. Their story is told in a book and exhibit available to the public April 30th. You will discover why people left their old homelands and moved to a new place, how they dealt with challenges but kept their identity, what contributions they made to American life and how they were part of the waves of people who found a home in the Slate Belt.

The new book, The African American Experience in the Slate Belt by Jennie Dubin-Rodin, will be available for sale at the Center for \$20.00.

You can also enjoy refreshed exhibits that feature early Slate Belt History, from the Lenape to the European settlers who established villages like Flicksville, to the waves of 19th and 20th century European immigrants that found employment in the slate, textile and garment industries and built local municipalities. The new firefighting exhibit features antique apparatus form the Slate Belt's golden industrial age.

The Slate Belt Heritage Center is located in the 1907 Town Hall building at 30 North First Street, Bangor, PA. Founded in 1999, the Center is a notfor-profit-501 © 3 that collects, preserves, interprets and makes public the history, ethnic traditions and industrial heritage of the area. SBHC is open Saturdays and Sundays, noon to 3 PM from April through October and Sundays, November through March, Sundays Noon - 3PM. Tours and research time can be scheduled by appointment.
