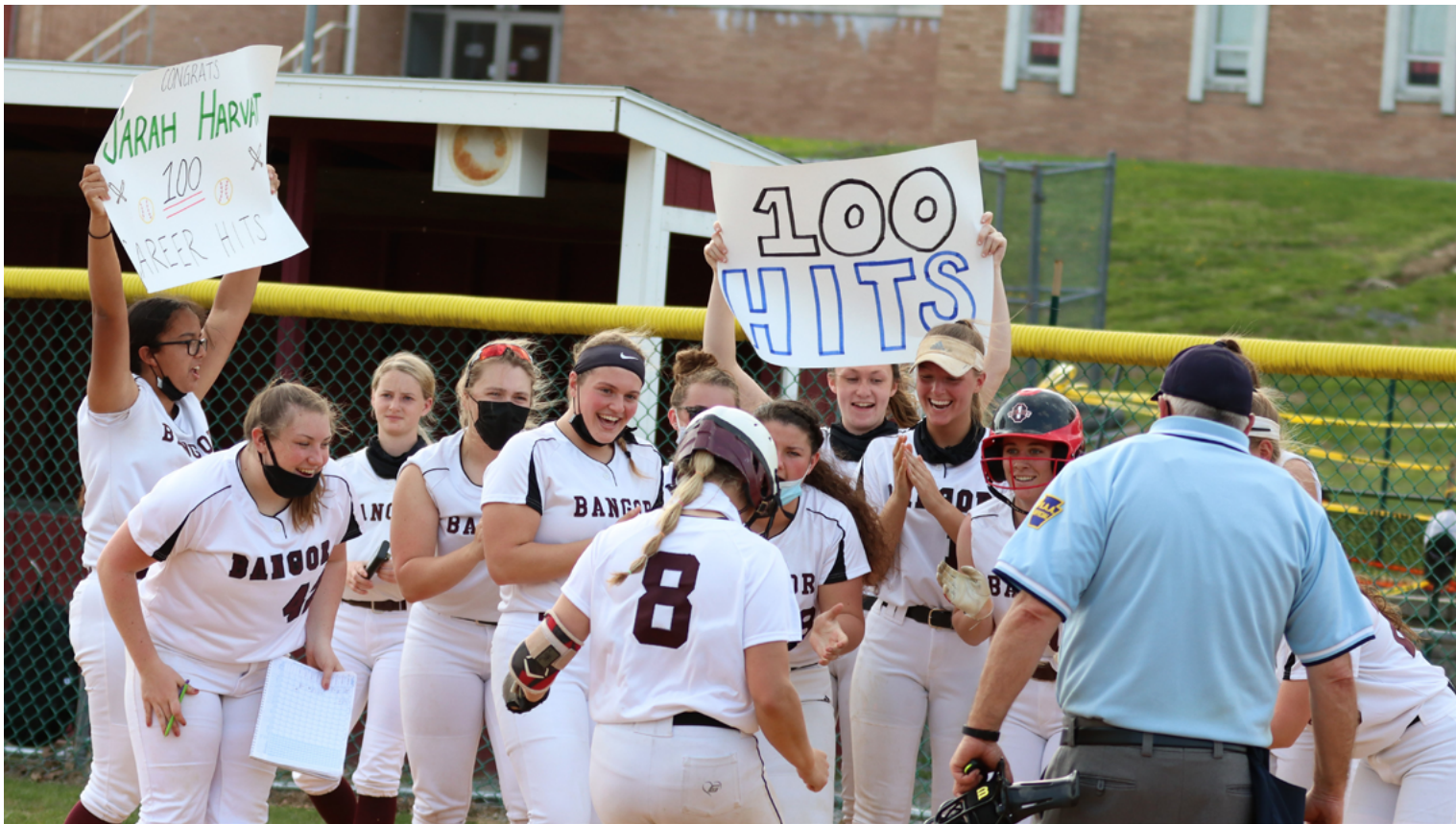

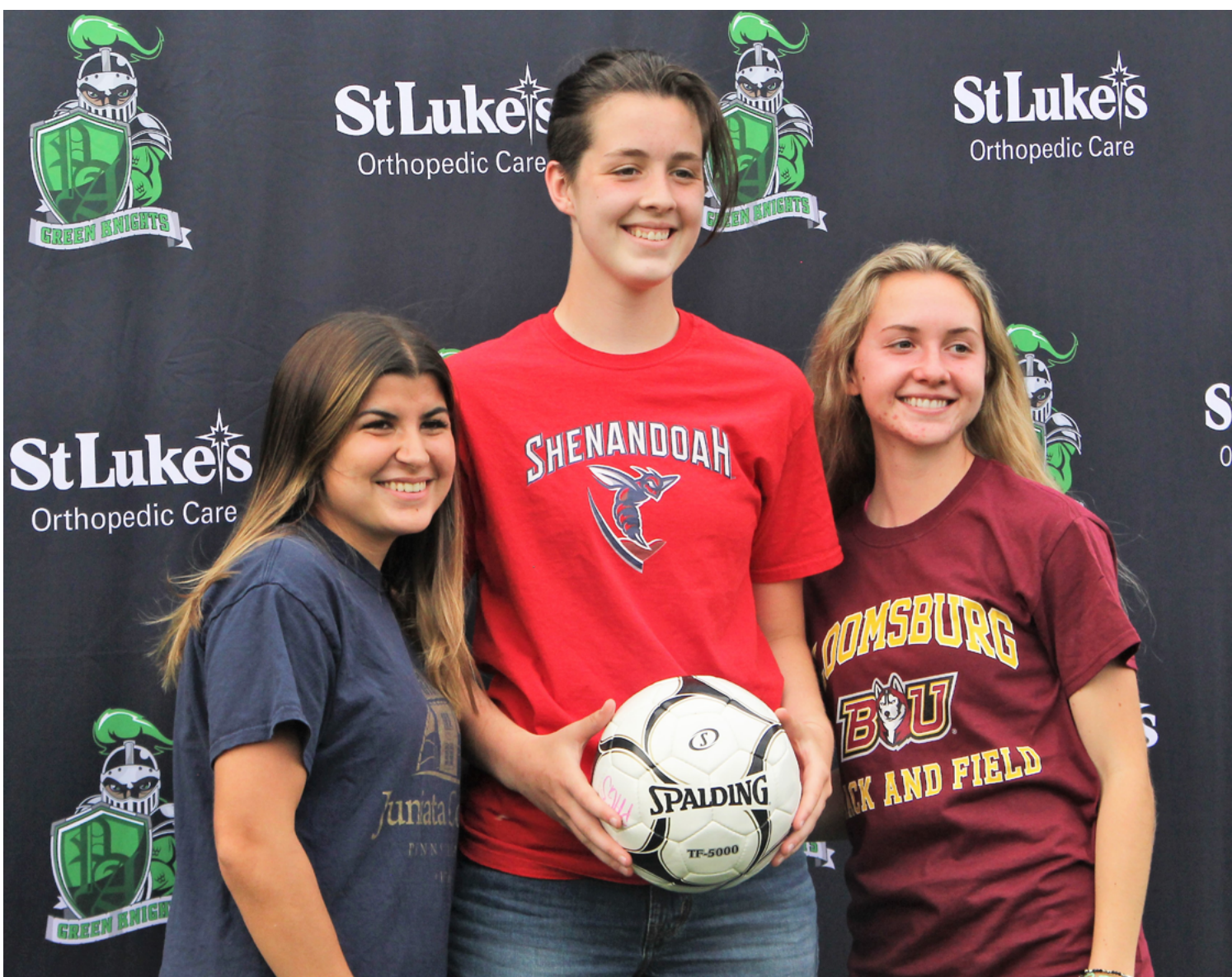

Pen Argyl Senior Athletes Announce College Choices

Wednesday at Pen Argyl High School, nine seniors committed to their colleges where they will continue to play sports. The signing ceremony was held outside of the Pen Argyl football stadium and recorded for the high school's YouTube page.

"They're all great kids," Pen Argyl athletic director Tim Egan said. "We're a small school, and most of our students are three or four-sport athletes. The reason why they're here today is because they work hard, and they'll continue doing that next year at college. They're going to be a great asset to each of the sports' teams and I'm sure they'll find a niche that fits them well."

Senior Emma Greggo, who has played on many of Pen Argyl's teams, committed to play soccer at Juniata College.

"We visited the campus a little while ago, and it just felt really nice and I loved it," Greggo said. "I like smaller private schools like that, and I felt more comfortable going to a smaller school where I could also continue to play."

"They have a lot of school traditions like we do here, which was a big part in my decision because that's one thing I love about this school," she continued. "They do stuff like coming up the hill with all of the football players, and I'm really excited about it."

Senior Delaney Porter, who has been breaking records this year for the track team, committed to continue running at Bloomsburg University.

"Two of my older brothers go to Bloomsburg, so it's been a family tradition," Porter said. "I also really like the campus. I'm excited to be with my brothers and have them help me along the way."

Senior Dana Fisher has spent her senior year on campus at Johnson & Wales University as a freshman in college while completing her senior year remotely. Fisher is now transferring to Northampton Community College and is looking forward to playing softball again.

"The atmosphere of the school where I was wasn't my cup of tea since it was in the city," Fisher said. "I decided to transfer to Northampton because they have a better program and it gave me a chance to continue my athletic career."

"You wouldn't believe how excited I am to play sports again," she continued. "I've missed playing so much. Not playing these past two years has really hit me. It was a big change in my life, and I'm excited to start back up in the fall."

Senior Tyler Taylor committed to continue playing football at King's College.

"I got a really good feel for their football program during my visit and they had everything I personally needed for education," Taylor said. "I'm excited to get to experience the atmosphere of such a new place."

Senior Katya Hoover committed to continue in the shot put at Shenandoah University.

"I've always wanted to get out and experience something different from Pen Argyl, and every time I went there, it was a place that I really loved," Hoover said. "That was a huge factor, but I also really love the school."

"I really liked the coaches there," she continued. "They were very welcoming and friendly, but I could also tell that they were very serious about what they do, and that's something I really appreciate. I'm looking forward to the heightened level of competition and getting to meet new people."

And while we're excited for the opportunities that lay ahead for our seniors, we'll definitely miss having their presence here with us.

"I really hope that they all enjoyed their time here at Pen Argyl and that our coaches and teachers have prepared them well for this next stage of their lives," Egan said. "I wish my congratulations to all of them."

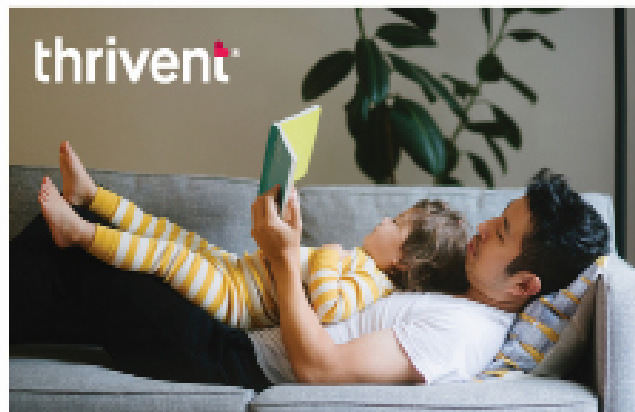

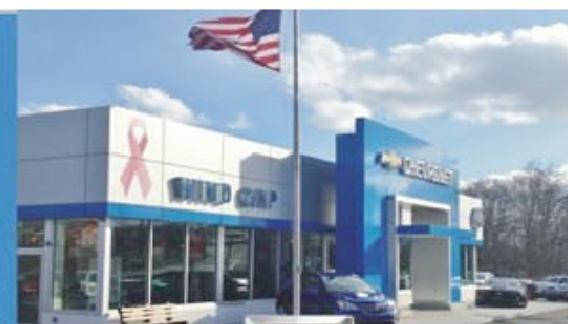

State Food Assistance

Pennsylvania State officials have encouraged all Pennsylvania residents to take full advantage of all food assistance programs, if needed, over the holiday season.

"Pennsylvania's food assistance programs were built for times like these. No one should be too shy to take advantage of the offer," said Russell Redding, secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

But those assets haven't stopped the covid-19 pandemic from destabilizing personal finances and causing heightened food insecurity for millions of residents. Compared to 2018, when roughly 11% of adults in Pennsylvania were food insecure, Redding said 15.5% experience the issue this year.

The difference is even starker when it comes to children in the state. In 2018, 15% children experienced food insecurity. That number has climbed to 24% in 2020.

Local food pantries saw greater demand especially early in the pandemic and through the summer, with miles-long lines at each weekly distribution and millions of pounds of food provided.

"Food insecurity was a problem for millions of Americans before March 2020," said Teresa Miller, secretary of the Department of Human Services.

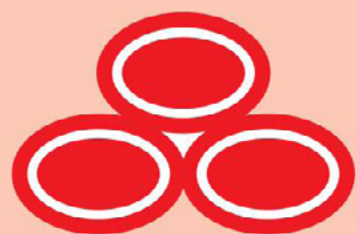

GKEDC Scholarships

The Green Knight Economic Development Corp (GKEDC) has awarded approximately \$200,000 in scholarships to over 50 high school seniors who live in the Pen Argyl School District and who will be continuing his/her education in a college program. GKEDC accepts scholarship applications annually from approximately April 1 through May 8th.

Scholarship Information

1. The scholarships will be awarded to individuals who reflect the ideals of community service and environmental stewardship, and who are seeking a higher education to further advance these ideals into their professional careers.

2. Any graduating high school senior who lives in the Pen Argyl School District and who will be continuing his/her education in a college program is eligible to receive this award.

3. This scholarship will be in the amount of \$4000, to be distributed in four segments over the course of a four-year college program.

- The first segment of \$1000 will be rewarded upon receipt of a certificate of admission or a letter of acceptance received by GKEDC by June 1.

- The remaining yearly distributions of \$1000 are dependent on the student taking at least 24 credits per year and successfully maintaining, at a minimum, a cumulative grade point average of 2.5. Grades received during the freshman, sophomore, and junior years must be submitted to GKEDC as proof each June before the next segment of the award will be given.

- Students attending a two-year college and continuing on to obtain their bachelor's degree will qualify for the entire scholarship.

- Monies not rewarded due to ineligibility will remain the property of GKEDC. If a recipient leaves the institution and there are scholarship funds remaining, the institution shall return the balance of the GKEDC Scholarship Award.

4. Parents are urged to encourage their children to apply for the scholarship.

5. The recipients will be announced at their high school's Awards Banquet or equivalent.

6. Scholarships can be used for tuition, books, laboratory fees, and other academic costs; additionally, the scholarship may be used for room and board when the student is housed under the control of the institution.

7. Scholarship checks will be sent directly to the Financial Aid Offices of the institutions involved at the end of the third week of August.

8. If a scholarship winner must delay their education for any reason, the recipient must contact the GKEDC in writing as soon as possible. The scholarship will be held up to two years from the date of high school graduation. After that time, the GKEDC will have the discretion to continue holding or to withdraw the scholarship award as they see fit.

Home Heating Assistance

LIHEAP is a federally funded program that helps individuals and families pay their heating bills through home heating energy assistance grants. It also provides crisis grants to help in the event of an emergency or if a resident is in danger of losing his or her heat due to broken equipment, lack of fuel or termination of utility service.

The income eligibility guidelines for LIHEAP are set at 150% of the federal poverty income level. For example, the income limit for an individual is \$18,735; for a couple, the limit is \$25,365; and for a family of four, it is \$38,625. Residents may apply for LIHEAP online or by contacting the County Assistance Office in their county of residence.
