Miss Rose's Preschool Accepts Donations for Ukraine

hen Russia began its invasion of Ukraine on February 24th, the world was instantly moved into action. Here in our little town of Pen Argyl, Miss Rose's Preschool felt that same urge to help and ran a donation drive with a surprising response. Owners Jen Taylor and Suzanne Engler shared the experience and the importance of the drive.

"The response was very overwhelming," Taylor said. "I think the biggest thing is that everyone wanted to help but nobody knew what to do."

"Our first question was what can we do and how can we get it to where it needs to go?" Engler said. "I knew that there was a Ukrainian church in Easton, so Jen called the priest there and spoke to him. They were collecting donations themselves, and they said if we could get the donations to them, they'd send it off with their donations to be flown to Ukraine."

While many people were willing to donate, they found their drive to create a donation dropoff from within their own little school.

"We have a student from Ukraine this year and we've had others in the past," Engler said. "The mom would

come in crying some days because they were dealing with this personally. Because it affected their friends and their family personally, we wanted to do something to help."

"I think the one thing we have found is that even though Ukraine is on the other side of the world, there are more people in our community than you realize who know someone that is affected by this," Taylor said.

Thankfully, it seemed the community had the same big hearts as these two teachers did.

"We had given Suzanne's address to drop off donations in case

they couldn't make it to the preschool during the day," Taylor said. "She came home one day and her porch was stacked with donations that people had dropped off during the day. We filled an SUV twice bringing the donations here."

"It was fantastic!" Engler said. "Cars would pull up and pop their trunk, and we would go out to greet them and just see bags and boxes of donations. The kids were great because they'd see these come in and they'd want to help. They'd help carry boxes in."

"And it was so great to see the kids working together carrying a box if something was too big," Taylor added.

Taylor and Engler made sure to help the children understand why they were doing what they were doing while also keeping it simple.


"We told them that in another country, there were families that had to leave their houses really quickly and they didn't know when they could go back," Engler said. "We explained that the drive was to help them until they could go back to their homes.

"I think a big part of everything we

do is being kind," she continued. "If our kids leave here being more aware of how to be kind then we've done our job. Every one of us can do a tiny bit, and those little ones have huge hearts."

"It doesn't take someone big to be kind," Taylor said. "Our families here are beyond wonderful, and they're a huge part of what makes our little preschool such a magical place. Everybody was jumping in to help, even with something as simple as boxes."

And at the end of the day, that message of kindness is the most important part.







Violence Erupts in Rwanda



Violence erupts in Rwanda, foreshadowing genocide On April 7, 1994, violence fuels the launch of what would become the worst episode of genocide since World War II: the massacre of an estimated 500,000 to 1 million innocent civilian Tutsis and moderate Hutus. Following the first wave of massacres, Rwandan forces manage to discourage international intervention with the murder of 10 Belgian peacekeeping officers. The Tutsis, a minority group that made up about 10 percent of Rwanda's population, received no assistance from the international community, although the United Nations later conceded that a mere 5,000 soldiers deployed at the outset would have stopped the wholesale slaughter.

The immediate roots of the 1994 genocide dated back to the early 1990s, when President Juvenal Habyarimana, a Hutu, began using anti-Tutsi rhetoric to consolidate his power among the Hutus. Beginning in October 1990, there were several massacres of hundreds of Tutsis. Although the two ethnic groups were very similar, sharing the same language and culture for centuries, the law required registration based on ethnicity.






