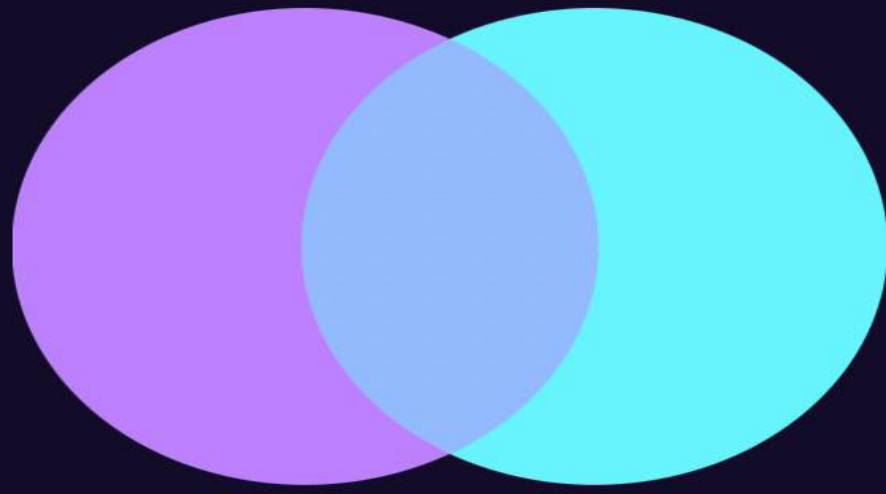

Slate Belt Weather

Heat Advisory Until 8:00 pm Tuesday

A heat advisory is in effect until 8:00pm tomorrow night. Heat index values near 100-104 in the Slate Belt, parts of southeastern Pennsylvania and northwestern New Jersey.

Hot temperatures and high humidity levels will increase the threat of heat related health issues.

Low temperatures should favor the 70s, providing little relief from the heat at night. Drink plenty of fluids, stay in an air-conditioned location, stay out of the sun when possible, Young children and pets should never be left unattended in a vehicle under any circumstance.

Deadline Extended for 2021 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program

The deadline for senior citizens and Pennsylvanians with disabilities to apply for rebates on rent and property taxes paid in 2021 has been extended to Dec. 31.

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The income limit is \$35,000 annually for homeowners and \$15,000 annually for renters, and half of Social Security income is excluded.

The maximum standard rebate for homeowners is \$650, but supplemental rebates for certain qualifying homeowners can boost rebates to \$975. The Department of Revenue automatically calculates supplemental rebates for qualifying homeowners.

Claimants are encouraged to file their rebate applications online by visiting mypath.pa.gov. No account is required. Applicants who still wish to file a paper application form may obtain Property Tax/Rent Rebate claim forms (PA-1000) and related information on the Department of Revenue's website or by calling 1-888-222-9190.

Rebates will be distributed beginning July 1, as required by law. The easiest way to check the status of your rebate after July 1 is to use the Where's My Rebate? tool. To check on the status of your claim, you will need your Social Security number, claim year and date of birth

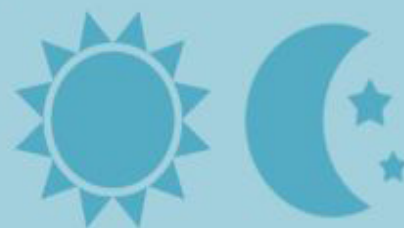

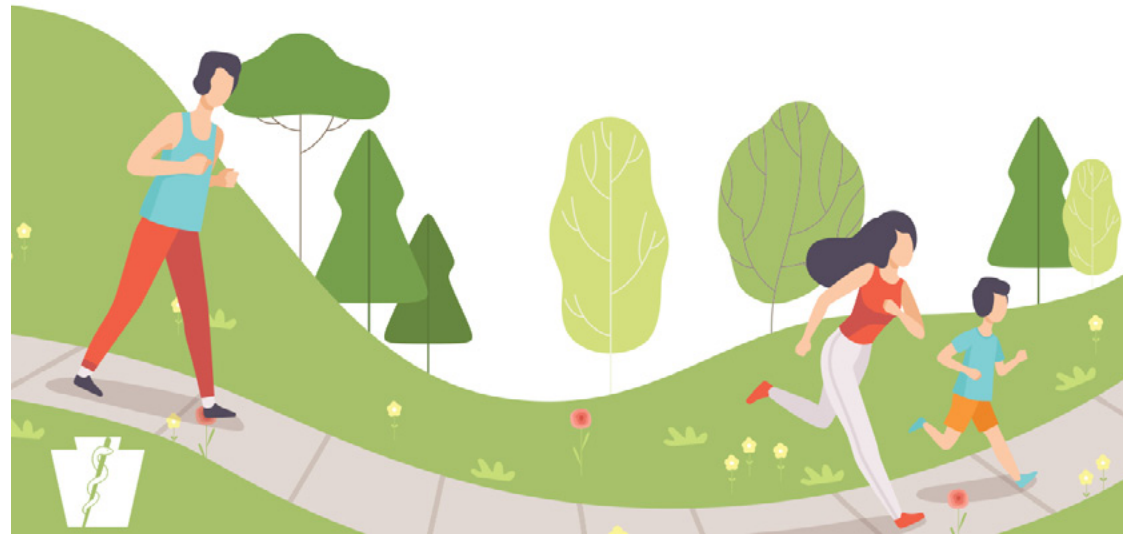

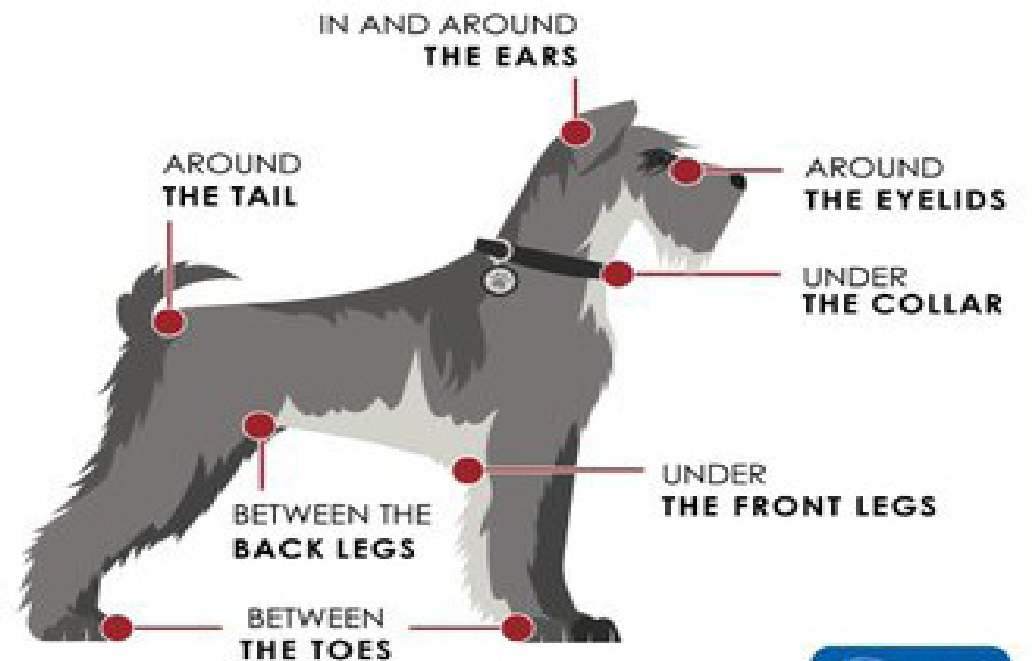

Ways to Help NATIVE BEES



- Plant native trees. Trees provide a large nectar source from their blossoms and habitat for some bees.
- Plant native plants that bloom during the spring, summer, and fall to provide a continuous food source.
- Avoid using herbicides, pesticides, and insecticides. Find organic ways to garden and remove pests.
- Provide water and habitat such as bare soil in your garden for ground-nesting bees, leave plant stems standing in winter, dead trees or fallen logs, or bee nesting houses.
- Participate in citizen science opportunities to help count bees like the Bumble Bee Watch, Great Sunflower Project, and more.
- Spread the word! Let others know how they can help.



Tips for planting a POLLINATOR GARDEN

- Choose native plants which provide nutritional value for pollinators and require less maintenance
- Choose native plants that bloom at different times (early spring – late fall), providing food all season
- Choose plants with flowers of different sizes, shapes, and colors for the diversity of pollinators
- Plant at least 3 or more of one kind of plant together to provide larger drifts of color to attract pollinators
- Form a weed barrier by planting natives closer together instead of using mulch or landscape fabric
- Save garden clean up until spring! Pollinators overwinter in different life stages

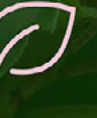

Ways to Help Eastern MONARCHS



- Plant native nectar plants that bloom in the spring, summer, and fall in a sunny area.
- Plant the caterpillar host plant milkweed (butterfly weed *Asclepias tuberosa*, common milkweed *Asclepias syriaca*, swamp milkweed *Asclepias incarnata*).
- Avoid using herbicides and pesticides. Find organic ways to garden.
- Enhance monarch habitat by providing water and a place to shelter with dense patches of wildflowers and shrubs.
- Participate in citizen science opportunities where you can help track monarch sightings in spring and fall.
- Spread the word! Let others know how they can help.

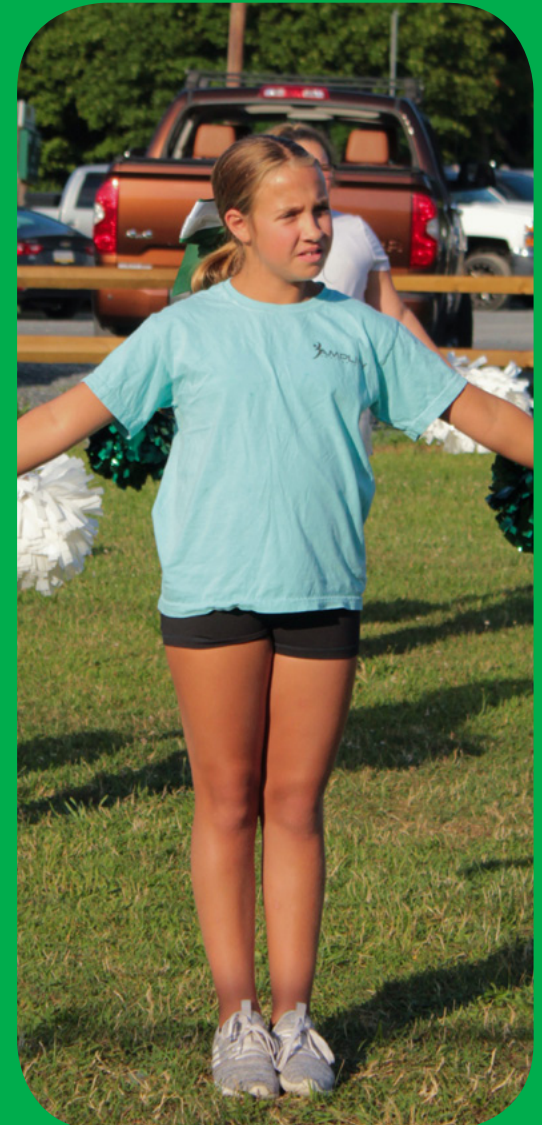

Pennsylvania Legislative Report

Senior Fair

Law to Support Crime Victims

The Pennsylvania General Assembly has enacted a new law that will better ensure the rights of crime victims are protected.

Act 77 of 2022 will grant crime victims legal standing in court, clarify definitions of “crime” and “personal injury crime” in state law, update crime victims’ compensation, provide notice of events in the judicial process, and enhance victims’ confidentiality for domestic and sexual violence crimes.

By granting legal standing, people who have been victimized by crime are better able to assert and enforce the rights granted to them under state law.

Protecting Senior Citizens

A new state law will help protect senior citizens receiving care in nursing homes or other health care settings.

Act 61 of 2022 extends the protections of the institutional sexual assault statute to cover elders and other care-dependent persons who are assaulted by those who have the responsibility of providing care.

Current law gives extra protections to students, inmates, dependent children and others who are most vulnerable because of the institutional setting in which they find themselves. This new offense would be triggered when a caretaker engages in sexual intercourse or indecent contact with a care-dependent person who receives care in or from a facility. It will not criminalize consensual sexual relations between spouses or other intimate partners.

A person convicted under this new subsection of institutional sexual assault would commit a third-degree felony, punishable by up to seven years imprisonment and/or a fine of up to \$15,000. Under this legislation, a facility is defined to include but is not limited to places such as nursing homes, assisted living facilities, private care residences and adult daily living centers.

The law will take effect by mid-September.

PennDOT Expands Online Services for People with Disabilities

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced

this week customers who have a Person with Disabilities Parking Placard can now renew it, receive a replacement or update their address on permanent placards online.

The initiative will help save time for customers by eliminating the mail-in process and subsequent processing of paperwork. Customers with Temporary Person with Disabilities Parking Placards will also be able to update their address and request replacement identification credentials through this online service.

To renew a placard online or to obtain additional information on services provided, including how to obtain a placard, please visit the Person with Disabilities Information page on the Driver and Vehicle Services website.

Placard holders will continue to receive a renewal form by mail approximately 60 days prior to their expiration.

Fraudsters Targeting Businesses

The state Department of Revenue continues to warn Pennsylvanians of a new scam in which fraudsters are sending phony letters to Pennsylvania business owners aiming to trick them into turning over their accounting records.

The fraudulent letters include the Department of Revenue’s name and logo, leading the recipients of the letter to believe they are under investigation for failing to pay Pennsylvania taxes. The goal of the scam is to obtain records containing sensitive information, such as bank account numbers and other financial data, which could be used to make unauthorized transactions, request fraudulent tax refunds, and even apply for loans under the name of the business.

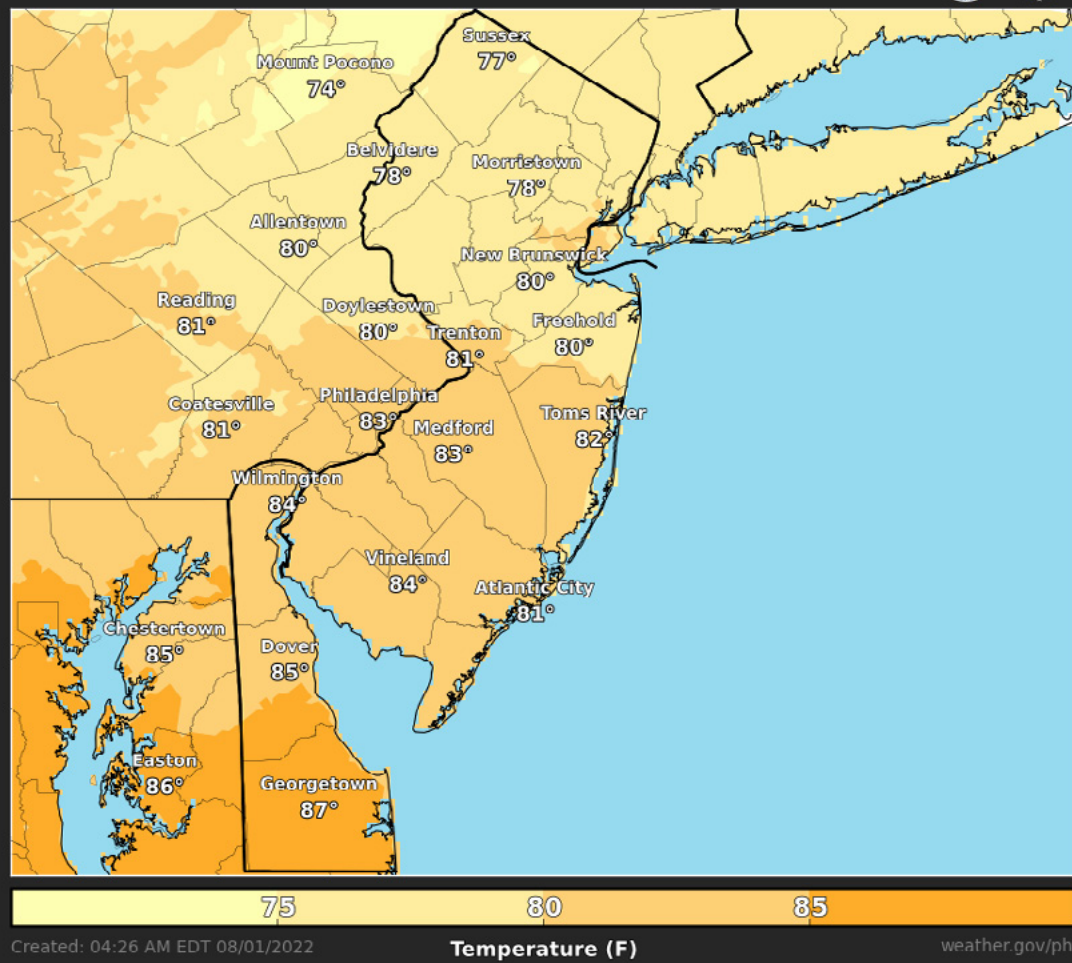
Slate Belt Had Warm, Dry July

Many Americans Think They Can Easily Guess People's Passwords



by Talker Research

The Americans think they can hack their significant other's devices in just five attempts – according to new research.

A new study asked 2,000 Americans about their password habits and found respondents think they could guess their significant other's password after five attempts.

Respondents shared they have four "go-to" passwords themselves – with 31% saying these passwords are just different variations of the same password, with these respondents just adding on additional punctuation or numbers.

Even so, **79% have six or fewer go-to passwords.**

Although respondents think they could guess their significant other's password in five attempts – they don't have as much patience for their own. It only takes three failed password attempts before respondents abandon trying to log in to an account at all.

Conducted by OnePoll on behalf of Prove, the survey found this password abandonment might be due to sheer frustration that comes along with signing up to use a service – as **18% of respondents said they "always" get frustrated when they have to create a new account** (for retail, banking and healthcare among others).

On top of that, another 65% either "often" or "sometimes" feel frustrated by the process.

On average, respondents believe it should take about 33 seconds to create a new account online, but almost half (45%) will cap it at 30 seconds or less.

A further 76% said they'll only make an account if it's something they're going to use more than once.

The average respondent has six online accounts they've never even used because they didn't need to use it again (46%), they lost interest in the service (43%) or they forgot their password (39%).

"The internet wasn't built with security in mind and so as consumers, we all experience how tedious passwords and two-factor security can be. Screw up your password entry a few times, and now you are locked out and spending 20 minutes with a call center agent to fix things. It's just a broken model held together with duct tape," said Rodger Desai, CEO & Founder of Prove.

Major Flood Ravages Bangor and the Slate Belt

55th Anniversary of August 1967 Flood Tomorrow



Seven inches of rain in six hours created the worst weather event in the history of the area as torrential rains and the rampaging Martins Creek completely flooded the Bangor business district Thursday August 3, 1967, causing damages estimated in the millions of dollars.

Bangor merchants were unable to reach their stores as swirling waters filled basements and rose to three feet in the business section. Heavy inventories of merchandise stored in basements were a total loss.

Mayor William D. Scott wired Congressman Fred B. Rooney and Governor Raymond Schaefer for help.

At Blue Ridge Winkler Textile on Kline Street in South Bangor, which was heavily damaged by a storm less than two weeks prior, the water was reported up to five feet deep. Bolts of cloth were seen floating in the streets nearby. Damages were expected to exceed \$100,000 (\$888,000 in today's money). Electric and telephone lines were out of order. Three crews from Commonwealth Telephone Company were sent from Dallas, Pa. to repair cables.

The flood encompassed an area from First Street to North Main, including the main arteries of Broadway and Market Streets, which was the core of the business district.

The Bangor Municipal Building was surrounded by water and all affected streets were roped off as traffic clogged fringe areas and roads leading to Portland, Pen Argyl, and Easton.

Only one family on South First Street had to be evacuated. Scores of others, however, moved their belongings to the second floor. The cellar of the American Legion on Main Street was filled with water. Water ran through the office of the Bangor Daily News, next door to the Legion, spreading into the press room causing several thousand dollars damage.

Pritchard's clothing store at the corner of Main and Market streets reported winter clothes stocked in a basement was a total loss.

Because of the topography of Bangor, water cascading downhill on Messinger, Kline, Market, Broadway, East and West High streets joined the already swollen waters of the Martins Creek which runs right through town.

A tangle of debris, including brush, trash and large rocks, made many streets impassable. Washouts necessitated roping off borough streets.

Firemen with equipment from the Acme Hose Fire Company in East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg firemen under the direction of William Schroeder also came to Bangor to assist in efforts.

Several families from Flicksville Road were placed in motels after being driven from their homes by rising waters.

Almost as quickly as the flood began in the early morning, the water began to recede by 6pm, and by 9pm Thursday night, only a thick film of sludge remained.

All electricity was restored in Bangor by early Friday. The road between Bangor and Martins Creek remained closed because of flood damage. Police reported that they evacuated some 40 families from a six-square block area in Bangor.

Pen Argyl

In Pen Argyl, local officials estimated damages at \$50,000 to the community's largest textile mill. A spokesman at the plant reported water inside was three to four feet deep.

Martins Creek

A number of residents of homes in the vicinity of Martins Creek had to be evacuated. Civil Defense workers in Martins Creek said the creek there ran 10 feet higher and was more than 400-feet wider than normal. They said the creek usually is four to 10 feet wide and about four feet deep. Volunteers said 12 families in Martins Creek refused evacuation.

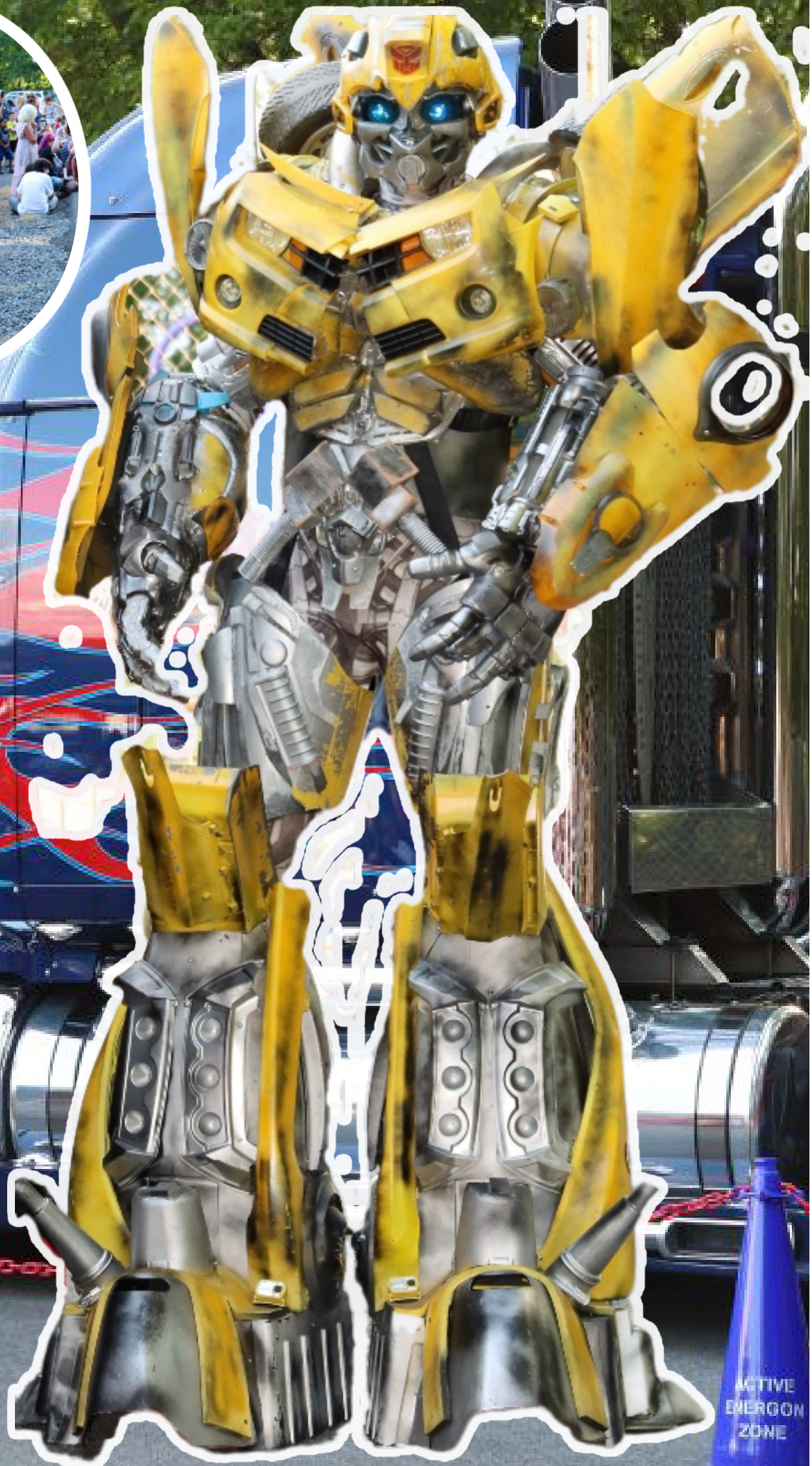
