

Most People Believe Misinformation is a Problem

WASHINGTON (AP) — Nearly all Americans agree that the rampant spread of misinformation is a problem.

Most also think social media companies, and the people that use them, bear a good deal of blame for the situation. But few are very concerned that they themselves might be responsible, according to a new poll from The Pearson Institute and the Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research.

Ninety-five percent of Americans identified misinformation as a problem when they're trying to access important information. About half put a great deal of blame on the U.S.



government, and about three-quarters point to social media users and tech companies. Yet only 2 in 10 Americans say they're very concerned that they have personally spread misinformation.

More — about 6 in 10 — are at least somewhat concerned that their friends or family members have been part of the problem.

Although Napoleon was born on newlydeclared French soil, his relationship to the nation was largely informed by the tumultuous politics of the late 16th century. As he was completing his studies in Corsica, he was promoted to be an officer in the artillery division of the French army.

Saint Nicholas Day


On December 6th, Saint Nicholas Day recognizes the third-century saint who became an inspiration for the modern-day Santa Claus.

St. Nicholas is known for selling all his possessions and giving his money to the poor. Raised as a devout Christian, St. Nicholas dedicated his whole life to serving the sick and suffering.

Legendary stories about St. Nicholas later become part of the inspiration for the modern-day Santa Claus. For example, during the third century, a daughter's

chances of marriage increased when her father offered a large dowry to prospective husbands. One story tells of a poor father with three daughters. He had no dowry to offer.

Thirteenth Amernment is Ratified



On December 6, 1865, the 13th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, officially ending the institution of slavery, is ratified. "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction." With these words, the single greatest change wrought by the Civil War was officially noted in the Constitution. The ratification came eight months after the end of the war, but it represented the culmination of the struggle against slavery. When the war began, some in the North were against fighting what they saw as a crusade to end slavery. Although many northern Democrats and conservative Republicans were opposed to slavery's expansion, they were ambivalent about outlawing the institution entirely. The war's escalation after the First

Battle of Bull Run, Virginia, in July 1861 caused many to rethink the role that slavery played in creating the conflict.

was ready to take her participation to the next level with 812 donations.

"I donated a couple of items my freshman year," Heimbach said. "After unstuffing the bus freshman year, I saw what a difference the community can make if we come together to provide a great Thanksgiving meal to families who are not as fortunate to buy a whole dinner."

For Heimbach, she went out of her way to provide donations, dropping off multiple times and using her own money to bring in more donations.

"I honestly didn't have a plan for my donations for the bus," Heimbach said. "Once I started spending a lot more money than I knew I was able to put out, I started working a couple extra shifts at my job so I could have some extra spending money with my donations."

And after seeing all of the donations come together once more, Heimbach knew that she had made the right decision.

"Being a part of the process of unstuffing the bus is so amazing," Heimbach said. "Numbers are just numbers, but to actually see with your own eyes the huge amount of food our school and the community has collected for this event

Is amazing. It makes me speechless that such a small town can do so good to give back to the community." Our small town can make a huge impact. Even the smallest individuals can give back.

Senior Joey DiAngelo has been a huge supporter of the Stuff the Bus event. Last year, he donated 955 items, making a much-needed impact during the first year of the pandemic. Yet never one to settle, DiAngelo topped his already impressive record with a jaw-dropping 1,563 donations this year, which accounted for 21% of the donations received on the bus.

"I've been planning this since the last stuff the bus to donate even more than before," DiAngelo said. "It feels really nice to donate to charity, and it feels even better that it's going to the community so I know I helped local families."

Like Heimbach, DiAngelo used a lot of his own money to buy his donations. He even went the extra mile to ask a local business for donations, helping spread awareness of the need within the community.

"I have an acquaintance at Giant through my mom, who is friendly with a lot of people there," DiAngelo said. "We talked to them and got some people to donate and received a few donations from the store as well."

And while this is DiAngelo's last year at the high school, he will always reme mber the impact he was able to have and stay involved in the future.

"It felt good to be involved with a bunch of great people that care to help others,"

DiAngelo said. "My favorite part was probably sorting it all because I like to organize things. If Ican continue to donate in the future I'd hope it'd be in my name, but if I can't do that I'll send it through my little sister in the middle school."

But the most important message of these top donors isn't to bring in 1,000 items; it's to put in the work and get involved in an important way.

"I think it is important for people to get involved in Stuff the Bus because that way they can contribute to our community, which is important," Bayraktarova said.

"For future Stuff the Bus events, I want to get more people involved!" Heimbach said. "More students, more faculty, more businesses! I want everyone in the community to know that our school sets up this big event so we can give back to the community for the best time of the year, Thanksgiving! I would also, personally, like to donate more than 1,000 items, but that is just a goal of mine for next year!"

"I think it is important that students and the community come together and get involved with Stuff the Bus because it is a once a year tradition where we can give back to our families and put the biggest smile on their faces," she continued. "Stuff the Bus is such an easy event to participate in, so I would encourage everyone to donate, any little item counts!"

"It's important to donate because you are reaching into the lives of families that may notbe able to afford a Thanksgiving meal," DiAngelo said. "It's a great way to give back to the community, and it feels really good to lend a helping hand." It's students like these that continue to impress and amaze us here at Pen Argyl, and we thank them for all of their hard work and dedication towards such an important event.







Slaters Rewrite Bangor Record Book

football team made more than a few changes in the Slater football record book,

As a team, the 2021 Slaters scored 400 points this season which is more points than any team in the 102-year history of Bangor football. The Slaters also rushed for 3,143 yards breaking the old record of 2,673 yards set in 2012.


The seven wins this year improved the Slaters' Wing (2011) for second. Phil Vass is first with

overall record to 493 wins since they began playing football in 1922, meaning Bangor could crack the 500-win threshold next fall.

Coach Paul Reduzzi won his 150th career game and his ninth rivalry game. Reduzzi's 9-3 overall record is second only to Paul Farnan who was 16-6-1. Reduzzi, who won 8 rivalry games while coaching at Pen Argyl, broke a second-place

tie with Elwood Petchel who was 8-4 in rivalry games as head coach of the Green Knights from high of 6 set by Joe

Kael Godshalk set a school record of Casciano's school 142 points in a season record set in 1949 and Eric Striba scored 122 for fourth best in history. Godshalk also moved up to fifth place in career single season is 11th

It's a safe bet to say the Bangor Slaters 2021 all-time career best is Scott LaValva with 308 points. Godshalk and Striba each scored 19 rushing touchdowns in 2021 which is second to Phil Vass (2012) and Josh Wing (2011) each of whom scored 20. Godshalk moved up to fifth on the career rushing TD list with 25 and Striba to seventh with 23.

Godshalk's 21 touchdowns in a season tied Josh

22 in 2012. Striba is tied for fourth with 19.

Godshalk and Striba are the only players in Bangor football history to each rush for over 1,000 yards in one season. Godshalk also rushed for 295 yards in a single game versus Saucon Valley which second best in school history to Josh Wing's 337 versus Catasauqua in 2011.

Godshalk also set a school record with 8 rushing conversions topping the previous

Ciliberti in 1931.

Striba tied Tom for longest rushing touchdown of 94 yards. Striba's 1257 rushing yards in a scoring with 178. The on the all-time list.
