



Research Uncovers The Best Way To Help Babies Learn To Talk

Scientists Say Babies Do Not Process Phonetic Information Until Seven Months

peaking to babies in 'sing-song' speech - such as nursery rhymes - is the best way for them to learn how to talk, according to a new study.

Linguists have long considered phonetics - the smallest sound elements of speech, typically represented by the alphabet – to be the foundation of language.

Babies were thought to learn these small sound elements and add them together to make words.

However, new research by the University of Cambridge and Trinity College Dublin has found that babies do not process phonetic information until they are around seven months old, and still struggle to do so at around 11 months old – when they tend to say their first words.

This means, the study said, babies instead learn in their early months from rhythmic speech and information – with moments of emphasis in a song helping them learn when an individual word starts and ends.

Professor Usha Goswami, a neuroscientist at the University of Cambridge, said: "Our research shows that the individual sounds of speech are not processed reliably until around seven months old, even though most infants can recognize familiar words like 'bottle' by this point.


"We believe therefore that speech rhythm information is the hidden glue underpinning the development of a well-functioning language system.

"Infants can use rhythmic information like a scaffold or skeleton to add phonetic information on to.

"For example, they might learn that the rhythm pattern of English words is typically strong-weak, as in 'daddy' or 'mummy', with the stress on the first syllable.

"They can use this rhythm pattern to guess where one-word ends and another begins when listening to natural speech.

"So parents should talk and sing to their babies as much as possible or use infant-directed speech like nursery rhymes because it will make a difference to language outcome."

Two-Year-Old Girl Gets New Heart For Christmas

She Underwent Emergency Surgery After Going Into Cardiac Arrest.

The parents of a little girl kept alive for 14 months by a machine say she is now looking forward to her best Christmas ever - after getting a new heart.

Brave Beatrix Adamson-Archbold, two, was rushed into hospital with suspected Covid, but was actually suffering from heart failure.

Doctors diagnosed her with dilated cardiomyopathy and after emergency surgery she went into cardiac arrest.

She was then connected to a mechanical heart at Newcastle Royal Infirmary for 14 months while her parents waited anxiously for a transplant.

Now, after being given a new heart, dad Terry Archbold and mum Cheryl Adamson are looking forward to her spending Christmas at home with the family.

The couple, who lost their daughter Isabel in 2018 to an unrelated heart condition, donated her heart for research.

And they have urged other parents to consider donating their children's organs.

Cheryl, of Burnopfield, County Durham, said: "If you asked someone if they would accept a donated organ, most likely the answer will always be yes, without hesitation.

"If you asked if they would provide the same gift to someone else, this reply can sometimes be met with uncertainty.

"The hesitation grows when it comes to considering your child being the donor of a lifesaving organ.

"When we were asked about donating Isabel's organs initially I did not want to agree.

"We eventually did agree to donate Isabel's heart for research and now I have seen how life changing this can be for families I would agree without hesitation.

"It could help save a life."

Little Beatrix, known as Bea, was rushed to hospital in May 2022 and spent the next 15 months there.



FREE LEAD WATER SUPPLY LINE HAZARDS REPLACEMENT

This is to ensure that you are aware of the new Slate Belt Rising partnership with Northampton County to serve the residents of East Bangor Borough. Slate Belt Rising is working on a press release and social media posts that will be sent out this week. Please keep an eye out. SBR would appreciate your help in spreading the word.

Dear Homeowner:

You are receiving this letter because your home is located in an area in need of a safety check to make sure there are no older water supply lines or fixtures in the service area of the East Bangor Municipal Authority. Several older water meters were found to be in service and the plan is to complete a safety check to make sure that there are no other older water supply lines or fixtures in this neighborhood.

Northampton County is working with our local partners Slate Belt Rising, Community Action Lehigh Valley, and the East Bangor Municipal Authority to offer a safety check of residents' interior home water supply lines for any hazards that may be present. We want to be able to say these neighborhood homes are free from any potential water supply line hazards.

Program participation is 100% FREE for residents in the East Bangor Municipal Authority service area.

Northampton County will check for the presence of water line hazards especially in any water line or fixture where lead may be an ingredient. As a rule, older homes are more likely to still have some lead presence in service lines and possibility in some interior plumbing fixtures. Northampton County will also check and replace any water supply line containing lead on the homeowner's side of the water meter. Northampton County's program will look at replacing manifolds/goosenecks, water meters, and older plumbing fixtures still containing lead. The program will use a PA-licensed plumber in any replacement and it will be free of charge for Northampton County homeowners.

Why are we so concerned with Lead?

Exposure to lead has been shown to harm especially very young child living in the home, exposure hasbeen shown to effect brain development, contribute with learning-behavioral problems, and lower IQ's. Very young children are particularly susceptible to the build-up of lead hazards, as their smaller size increases their exposure levels, which is far more damaging to them than adults. As studies have shown that there is no safe level of lead. Lead is this public health menace take away the lead and the problem goes away.

How does lead get into drinking water?

Lead can enter drinking water when pipes and plumbing fixtures that contain lead corrode, especially where the water has high acidity or low mineral content. There are three main sources of lead:

- · Lead pipes
- · Lead service lines, the pipe that connects the water main under the street to the home's plumbing. Lead pipes were also used in inside plumbing, but it is unusual. Congress banned the use of lead pipes in 1986
- · Leaded solder Solder is used to connect copper pipe and fittings. Congress banned the use of leaded solder in 1986.
- · **Leaded alloys** Brass is frequently used in faucets and other plumbing components. In 1986, Congress limited the amount of lead in brass to 8% (close to the level of lead typical of products at the time) and later in 2014, reduced the limit to a much lower level (0.25%). Understanding

Infants Found To Have Signs Of Self-Awareness: Study

Scientists Found Babies As Young As Four Months Have A Sense Of Consciousness

Babies as young as four months old have been found to have signs of self-awareness, according to a new study.

The research showed that four-month-old infants can make sense of how their bodies interact with the space around them, moving scientists closer to discovering the origins of consciousness.

To get these results the team, from the University of Birmingham, showed babies a ball on a screen moving towards or away from them.

The babies were then simulated with a touch using small vibrations on their hands as their brain activity was closely studied.

The researchers found that from just four months old, babies show enhanced brain activity when a touch is preceded by an object moving toward them.

Dr. Giulia Orioli said: "Our findings indicate that even in the first few months of life, before babies have even learned to reach for objects, the multisensory brain is wired up to make links between what babies see and what they feel.

"This means they can sense the space around them and understand how their bodies interact with that space. This is sometimes referred to as peripersonal space.

"Of course, humans do this all the time as adults, using our combined senses to perceive where we are in space and making predictions about when we will touch an object or not.

"But now that we know that babies in the early stages of their development begin to show signs of this, it opens up questions about how much of these abilities are learned, or innate."

The researchers also explored how an unexpected touch would affect some of the older babies in the study.

They found that in babies aged eight months old when the touch on their hand was preceded by the ball on the screen moving away from them there were signs of surprise.

Professor Andrew Bremner said: "Seeing the older babies show surprise responses suggests that they had not expected the touch due to the visual direction the object was moving in.

Overall, hot flashes were reduced by 95 percent, with moderate to severe flashes reducing by 96 percent and severe hot flashes being completely eliminated.

Participants who started the vegan diet also lost around 6.4 pounds in a 12-week study.

These results, from the Physicians Committee for Responsible Medicine in Washington DC, were caused by changes in gut microbiome that come with a low-fat vegan diet.

This lifestyle change can also decrease the risk of developing health problems such as heart disease and type 2 diabetes, as the bacteria that can lead to these issues are less abundant.

Co-author Dr. Hana Kahleova said: "Women who want to fight hot flashes should feed the bacteria in their gut a vegan diet rich in fruits, vegetables, grains, and beans, which also leads to weight loss and protects against heart disease and type 2 diabetes."

This new research, published in the journal Complementary Therapies in Medicine, comes from a secondary analysis of the WAVS trial.

In the study, 84 postmenopausal women reporting two or more moderate-to-severe hot flashes daily were assigned 12 weeks on either a vegan diet or sticking to their usual eating habits.

For the secondary analysis, stool samples from 11 of the participants were used to study changes in gut microbiome.

The study is the first to find reductions in microbes Porphyromonas and Prevotella corporis are associated with a decrease in severe daytime hot flashes.

Prevotella corporis has also been found in the gut of people with rheumatoid arthritis and seems to have pro-inflammatory properties.

Changes in the abundance of other bacteria looked at in the study may play a role in alleviating hot flashes by stabilizing estrogen levels, reducing inflammation, and increasing satiety, among other benefits.

Merlin Repsher A Fire Fighter For Life

It's safe to say that Merlin Repsher has been a fire fighter in the making most of his life, and therefore not surprising that he is celebrating 60 years of service with the Bangor Fire Department.

Much of his career path has been filled with many memorable experiences that have led him to a satisfying, lifelong experience as a fire fighter. As a child, he lived on Miller Street just a short distance from the Second Ward Fire company in South Bangor. One night, while he and his family were visiting friends on Messinger Street in Bangor, a few blocks from home, they received a call that the A & P (now the Bangor General Store on Broadway) was on fire. He was asked if he wanted to walk "uptown" to see the fire, which was an experience that he would never forget.

His uncle was the fire chief in Cornwall Heights, Bucks County where Repsher recalls him responding to fire calls. "One time he took me to the station and showed me how to operate the siren on one of the fire engines," Repsher said. "He had to lift me up so I could stand on the running board and depress the siren switch with my hands. I kept at it until he lifted me off the running board."



At play in his youth, he fondly

remembers spending time playing with toy fire trucks, and when the fire whistle sounded, he knew that the real fire trucks would be rolling ASAP.

"I guess the bottom line is, from early childhood with my uncle's influence, I (always) wanted to be a fire fighter," he said.

After serving his country with the Air Force, he returned

home and submitted an application

to Rescue Fire Company to

He was accepted into active membership on October 6,1963 to serve a one-year probationary period. Sixty years later, he continues his service to the community as an active fire fighter. During his career he has

served as Chief Engineer of the Pumper for 35 years and was Assistant Fire Chief for five years. He also served in every position from Fire Recorder to President, except for Trustee.

In 2013 he was given a citation by Matt Cartwright honoring him for 50 years of service, and just a short time ago, he received a similar citation from Ann Flood for 60 years of service.

In 1964, he began attending Northampton County Fire School classes and their monthly business meetings. In 1972, he was elected Treasurer, a position he still holds 51 years later.

Repsher was a PA State Fire Academy Certified Non-Suppression Instructor and Northampton Community College Adjunct Professor, teaching 30-hour classes in Pump Operations as well as a VFIS Certified Emergency Vehicle Driver Training Instructor.

One of the accomplishments which Merlin is most proud of is when he and Anthony Curcio in 1972 introduced the idea of using a new alerting system, where each member had an alerting unit which was activated by Blue Mountain Control Center. This took the place of the pull stations throughout the town which had activated the siren.

He also is well known for his rendition of taps on Veterans Day and Memorial Day.
