Pen Argyl's Aiden Mains off to Regionals

This year has been a big year for Pen Argyl High School's music department; concerts are in full swing again, and students even made it through District competitions. One of these students, senior Aiden Mains, recently moved forward to the Regional level after his PMEA District 10 Band performance in late January!

"Making it to Districts felt surreal," Mains said. "I auditioned last year, and I wasn't close at all to making it in. It seems that this year all of my hard work has paid

off."

"Districts was something completely different from anything I've experienced," he continued. "Four bassoons, eight tubas, and almost an entire row of french horns! Every musician there was extremely talented. I had listened to the concert pieces multiple times while practicing, and I thought 'yeah, this is okay.' But being there, being surrounded by it, was beyond belief."

Once Mains made it to
Districts, he had to reaudition
to keep his spot in the band. That
reaudition also counted as his audition for
Regionals.

"I got the etude for the Region V audition in the folder for District Band," Mains said. "I was a little lost on how the reaudition worked. For this year, you had to record yourself playing the etude and an excerpt from one of the songs. For Region V, I was in competition against District 10 and District 7."

"Before the concert, we were told that those accepted to Region band would be on the door to our respective dressing rooms," he continued. "We returned from the concert feeling proud of doing something amazing in such little time, and there it was.

But even with big accomplishments behind him, Mains still has a lot of work ahead of him.

"The next step for me is the All-State audition, preparing for Region V band, and just playing in general," Mains said. "As of writing this, I have finished and submitted my All-State audition. It was three different excerpts that I had five days to learn, practice, and

record. The pieces were certainly challenging, but I feel as though I worked well with the time I had.

Mr. Reiche, my band director, helped me with the recording as he has a high-quality microphone."

And while this may seem like a big accomplishment with a lot of work, for Mains, it's another opportunity to share music with others.

"I've been playing the saxophone since 4th grade," Mains said. "Like every fourth grader, I started playing the alto. My freshman year of high school, I moved to the tenor saxophone, and then to the baritone the next year. I'm happy to say that I've landed on my personal favorite."

"I hope I never stop playing,"
he continued. "I plan on going to
college, and playing in the ensembles
is absolutely on my list. I am going to

major in physics, and I've thought about a minor in music, but I'm not sure I'll need the extra workload. It gives me a long-term goal, besides the usual ones. Eventually, I'd like to get a baritone saxophone, but for now, I'll happily play my tenor until then."

We'll certainly happily listen along to whatever he plays, and we hope that he continues to play his way through future rounds of auditions!

Think Spring! Trout Stocking Schedules Available

The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) announced this week its 2022 trout stocking schedules are now available online (https://www.fishandboat. com/Fish/Stocking/Pages/default.aspx) and on the FishBoatPA mobile app.

The PFBC will stock approximately 3.2 million adult trout in 696 streams and 128 lakes open to public angling. This includes approximately 2.2 million Rainbow Trout, 686,000 Brown Trout and 293,000 Brook Trout. As with past practice, the average size of the trout produced for stocking is 11 inches in length with an average weight of 0.58 pounds.

Volunteers will once again be welcome to participate in stocking activities. Stocking is set to begin the week of

Feb. 21 in advance of the statewide Mentored Youth Trout Day on Saturday, March 26, and the statewide opening day of trout season on Saturday, April 2.



NAACP Is Founded



On February 12, 1909, the 100th anniversary of Abraham Lincoln's birth, a group that included African American leaders such as W.E.B. Du Bois and Ida B. Wells-Barnett announced the formation of a new organization. Called the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, it would have a profound effect on the struggle for civil rights and the course of 20th-century American history.

The conference that led to the NAACP's founding had been called in response to a race riot in Illinois. The founders also noted the disturbing trends of lynchings, which reached their peak not during or immediately after the Civil War but in the 1890s and early 1900s, as segregation laws took

effect across the South and white supremacists once again gained total control of state governments.

Many of the organization's early members came from the Niagara Movement, a group created by Black activists who were opposed to the concepts of conciliation and assimilation.

Also known as the European flag, the Flag of the European Union features a circle of 12 gold stars on a blue background. The circle of stars has nothing to do with the number of member countries, but rather is a symbol of unity.

As a signifier of the unity and identity of Europe, the stars on the European flag stand for ideals of unity, solidarity, and harmony among the people of Europe. In 1955, the Council of Europe — which defends human rights and promotes European culture — chose the present design for its own use. In the years that followed, it encouraged the emerging European institutions to adopt the same flag. By 1985, it was adopted by all EU leaders as the official emblem of the European Communities, later to become the European Union.



February 2022's feature is The Cry of Jazz, a 1959 documentary from director Edward O. Bland that connects Jazz to African American history. Rather than being strictly a documentary about jazz as a musical genre, the film uses jazz as a metaphor for understanding the African American experience of living in Chicago in the 1950s.

In 2010, The Cry of Jazz was selected by the Library of Congress for preservation in the United States National Film Registry, citing it as a "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant" film.






