Omicron Sub-Variant May Cause African Surge • Sub-variant spreading rapidly in South Africa, scientist says

- New strain more transmissible, but with similarly mild disease

A sub-variant of the omicron coronavirus strain, known as BA.2, is spreading rapidly in South Africa and may cause a second surge of infections in the current wave, one of the country's top scientists said.

BA.2 is causing concern as studies show that it appears to be more transmissible than the original omicron strain, the discovery of which was announced by South Africa and Botswana in November.

Research also shows that getting a mild infection with either of the two strains may not give a robust enough immune response to protect against another omicron



infection. There's no indication that the sub-variant causes more severe disease from infection surges seen in Denmark and the U.K.

The omicron wave of infections "may end up like a camel," Tulio de Oliveira, a bio-informatics professor who runs gene-sequencing institutions and advises the government on the pandemic, said at a presentation at Stellenbosch University on Wednesday. "A wave with another hump."

So far the strain has infected a significant number of people in seven of South Africa's nine provinces, is dominant in Limpopo region and is on the verge of becoming so in Gauteng, the most populous province, according to de Oliveira's presentation.

Still, while South Africa was the first country to experience a major omicron wave the number of infections has tapered off. On Tuesday the country reported 3,085 new cases, down from a record of almost 27,000 on Dec. 15. The original omicron strain is itself significantly more transmissible than earlier variants such as delta, but appears to cause milder disease.

De Oliveira was involved in the discovery of the beta variant in South Africa in late 2020.



Madame Butterfly Premiers



On February 17, 1904, Giacomo Puccini's opera Madame Butterfly premieres at the La Scala theatre in Milan, Italy.

The young Puccini decided to dedicate his life to opera after seeing a performance of Giuseppe Verdi's Aida in 1876. In his later life, he would write some of the best-loved operas of all time: La Boheme (1896), Tosca (1900), Madame Butterfly (1904) and Turandot (left unfinished when he died in 1924). Not one of these, however, was an immediate success when it opened. La Boheme, the now-classic story of a group of poor artists living in a Paris garret, earned mixed reviews, while Tosca was downright panned by critics.

While supervising a production of Tosca in London, Puccini saw the play Madame Butterfly, written by David Belasco and based on a story by John Luther Long. Taken with the strong female character at its center, he began working on an operatic version of the play, with an Italian libretto by Giuseppe Giacosa and Luigi Illica. Written over the course of two years—including an eight-month break when Puccini was badly injured in a car accident—the opera made its debut in Milan in February 1904.

Think Spring! Trout Stocking Schedules Available

The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) announced this week its 2022 trout stocking schedules are now available online (https://www.fishandboat.com/Fish/Stocking/Pages/default.aspx) and on the FishBoatPA mobile app.

The PFBC will stock approximately 3.2 million adult trout in 696 streams and 128 lakes open to public angling. This includes approximately 2.2 million Rainbow Trout, 686,000 Brown Trout and 293,000 Brook Trout. As with past practice, the average size of the trout produced for stocking is 11 inches in length with an average weight of 0.58 pounds.

Volunteers will once again be welcome to participate in stocking activities. Stocking is set to begin the week of Feb. 21 in advance of the statewide Mentored Youth Trout Day on Saturday, March 26, and the statewide opening day of trout season on Saturday, April 2.

The 2022 adult trout stocking schedule is searchable by county, lists the waterways in alphabetical order, and indicates stocking dates and the species of trout that will be stocked.
