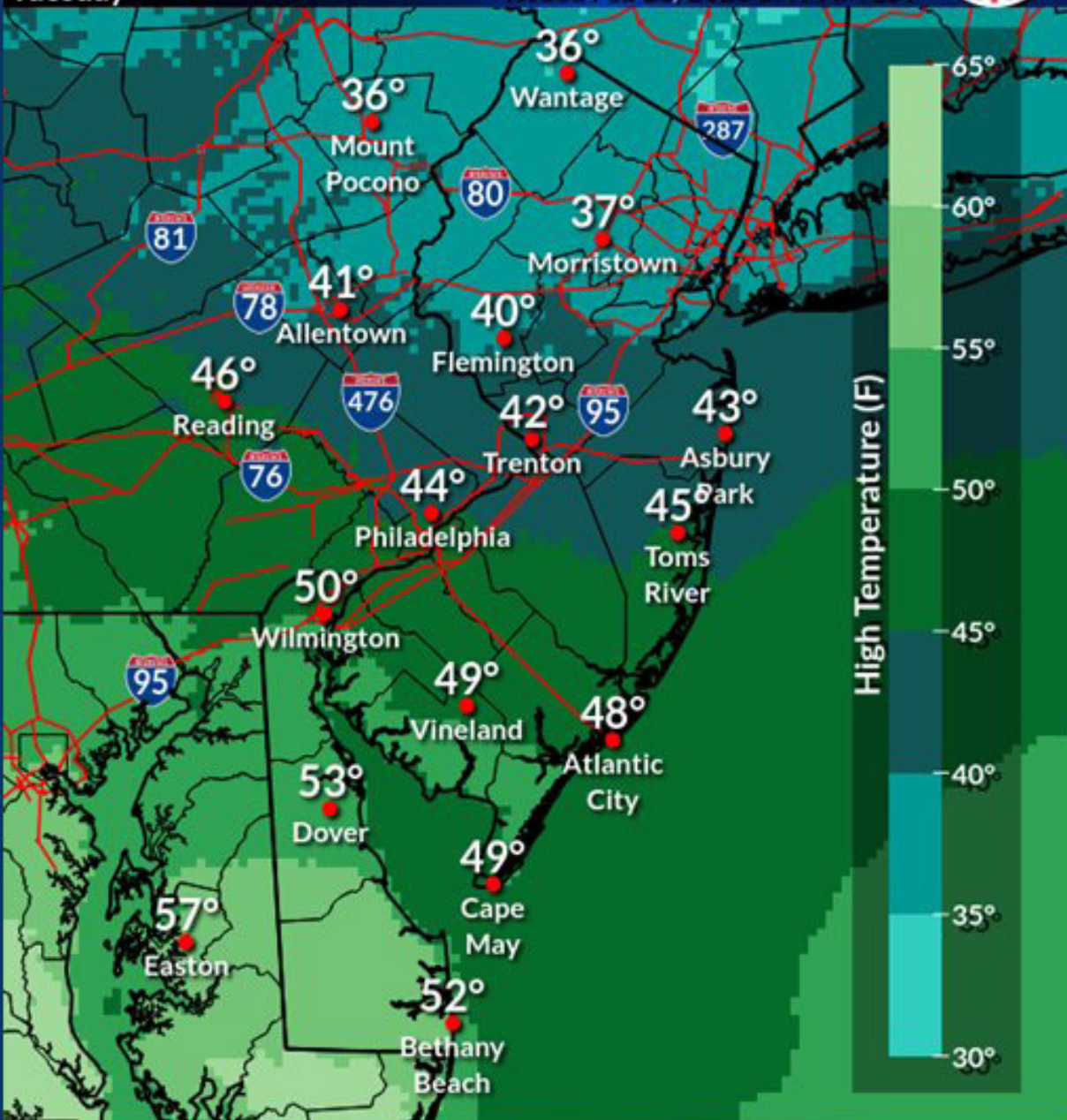

Free Ham Radio Classes Start March 7

Starting on March 7, the Delaware Lehigh Amateur Radio Club, Inc. will offer free classes for people who would like to obtain an amateur radio license. The class will run for 10 weeks and will prepare students to take the Federal Communications Commission's Amateur basic license examination.

Ham radio has played an important role in communications for more than 100 years and continues to do so. It is part of many emergency management plans because it can be used to communicate if landline telephone lines, cell towers and/or electric grids fail.

It also is a fun hobby for people who enjoy talking with amateur radio operators locally and around the world, participating in contests and field days, and even making contact with the International Space Station.

According to the American Radio Relay League (ARRL), the nationally recognized organization for ham radio operators, there are more than 750,000 amateur radio license holders in the United States and more than 3 million worldwide.

Based in Bethlehem, the Delaware Lehigh Amateur Radio Club (DLARC) has more than 100 members. It is a non-profit 501(C)(3) charitable organization. Classes are offered as a community service.

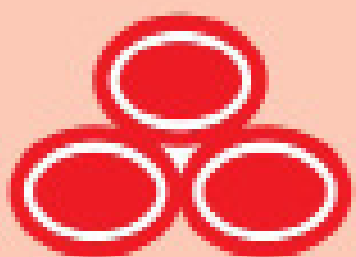



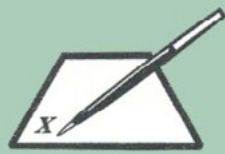

ASH WEDNESDAY

In 2023, like in every year, Ash Wednesday is the first day of the liturgical season of Lent. It always falls six and half weeks before Easter, beginning the Lenten season of preparation for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Origin

Ash Wednesday dates back to the 11th century. Yet, the tradition of receiving ashes has even earlier roots — to the ancient Hebrew custom of clothing oneself in sackcloth and dusting oneself with ashes as a sign of penance

How Is The Date For Easter Determined Every Year?

The simple standard definition of Easter is that it is the first Sunday after the full Moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox. If the full Moon falls on a Sunday then Easter is the next Sunday.

Easter, also called Pascha or Resurrection Sunday, is a Christian festival and cultural holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day of his burial following his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary

It marks the first day of Lent in Western churches. The ashes symbolize penance and the dust from which God made people. When priests mark Christian's forehead with the ashes they often say, "Repent and believe in the Gospel," or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return



FASTNACHT DAY

Fastnacht Day or in Pennsylvania German: Faasenacht) is an annual Pennsylvania Dutch celebration that falls on Shrove Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday. The word translates to “Fasting Night” or “Almost Night” in English. The tradition is to eat the very best foods, which are part of the German tradition, and much of them, before the Lenten fast. Fastnachts (pronounced /'fastnaxt/ in German) are doughnuts.

aka FAT TUESDAY

Festive day celebrated in France on Shrove Tuesday **ALSO KNOWN AS** Mardi Gras, (French: Fat Tuesday) (the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday), which marks the close of the pre-Lenten season. Fat Tuesday is the custom of using all the fats in the home before Lent in preparation for fasting and abstinence.

aka SHROVE TUESDAY

The Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, which marks the close of the pre-Lenten season. aka Pancake Tuesday is the day before Ash Wednesday, observed in many Christian countries through participating in confession and absolution, the ritual burning of the previous year's Holy Week palms, finalizing one's Lenten sacrifice, as well as eating pancakes and other sweets

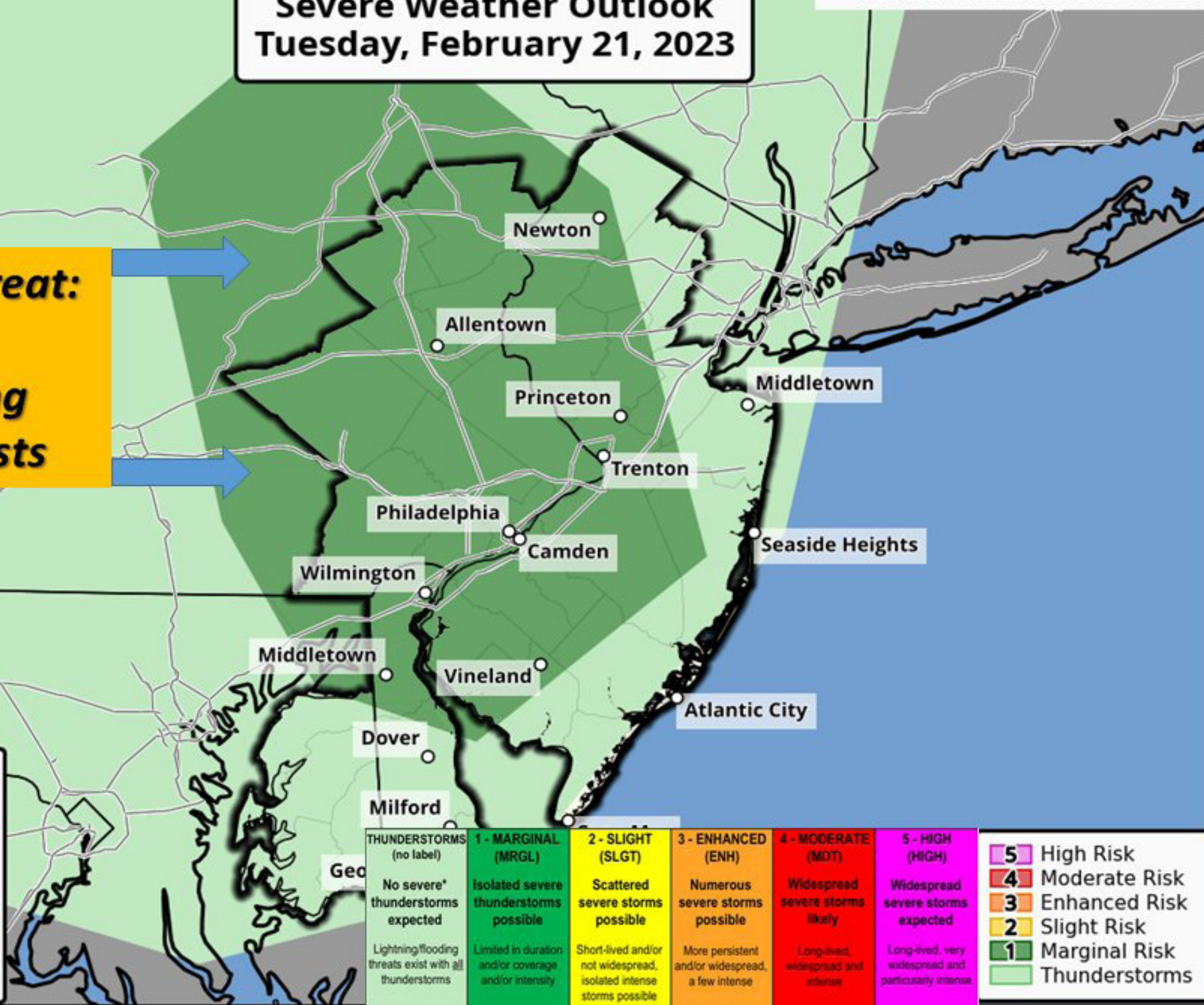

Lincoln and Washington's Birthday Morphed Into Presidents Day

Birthday Observance History

1876 - U.S. House of Reps proposed that April 14 (Lincoln) Assassination Date) would be a national holiday for Lincoln.

1900 - Post Offices closed in the afternoon.

1907 - All Northampton County Schools observed Lincoln's Birthday.

1909 - at the Music Hall in Bangor (next to the present Bangor PD office) Union Defenders Day and Lincoln's Birthday were observed by the Sons of Veterans of the Civil War.

1909 - The Shakespearian Literary Society in Pen Argyl observed Lincoln's Birthday.

1914 - Lehigh New England Railroad Shops closed.

1923 - Pen Argyl Schools observed Lincoln's birthday as a holiday.

1924 - Lincoln and Washington's Birthdays were observed in all Bangor Schools.

1924 - PAHS Class of 1924 held a Lincoln Birthday Party.

1936 - Bethlehem Schools Closed.

1939 - Merchants bank of Bangor's move to Broadway delayed by observance of Lincoln's Birthday.

1947 - Banks and Municipal offices closed but schools and post offices were open on Lincoln's Birthday.

Presidents Day History

By the end of WWII, the observance of Lincoln and Washington's birthdays waned except as magnets for special February sales.

Today their birthdays are included in Presidents' Day, which is a holiday in the United States celebrated on the third Monday of February to honor all people who served as presidents of the United States and, since 1879, has been the federal holiday honoring George Washington, who led the Continental Army to victory in the American Revolutionary War, presided at the Constitutional Convention of 1787, and was the first U.S. president.

Washington's Birthday was celebrated on February 22 from 1879 until 1970. To give federal employees a three-day weekend, in 1968 the Uniform Monday Holiday Act moved it to the third Monday in February, which can occur from February 15 to the 21st.

Lincoln's Birthday, February 12, was never a federal holiday, but nearly half the state governments have officially renamed their observances "Presidents' Day", "Washington and Lincoln Day", or other such designations. (In historical rankings of presidents of the United States, Lincoln and Washington are often the top two.

Recently, the Sokal Fitness and training center in Pen Argyl took a group to DeSales and Villanova University and came home with 10 gold medals, 10 silver medals and eight bronze medals.

"I was very proud of the kids that went," said Sokol director Erl Person. "We had 13 kids trained (and) for ten weeks in the fall for Special Olympics power-lifting, we had 11."

According to their website: "Sokol 5-Tool Fitness is a not-for-profit organization that operates a sport fitness and baseball/softball training facility. It is administered and maintained by the Sokol USA Lodge 410 Board of Directors and members. The goal is to provide quality strength/conditioning/agility training and baseball/softball skill development for our members and local baseball and softball organizations. The facility is also available for rent."

Person is currently training his group for their next competition,

"We're probably taking eight or ten kids to Parkland February 25th for high school, teenage high school and team championships," he said. "Probably two or three of those are going to be Special Olympics kids."

Sokal is not a fancy gym with all the glitz and glimmer of LA Fitness.

Sokal, however, on Robinson Avenue in Pen Argyl is about as basic as a gym can be, yet they get the job done.

"It's the way we train here is very simple," said Person. "We focus on a small number of functional movements. Squat, bench press. dead lift and press."

This a process that doesn't produce results overnight.

"We work on form technique first and foremost, then as they perfect that, we start adding weight." Person says.

"They don't need fancy. They just need to come in and they know that everyone here is on their side," Person stressed.

"We don't want them competing against one another. We want them competing against themselves" he added. "You know every kid has to do better than they did the last time they were here. That's all we're looking for. It's old school. It's very old school."

Person is no stranger to athletic training he got off to a good start

playing football at Pen Argyl High

School for Coach Roy Cortez.

Since then he has become a Certified personal trainer through the CSM and a certified power-lifting coach through Special Olympics. When he is not at the gym he works for the FAA as an Electronics technician.
