St. Luke's Calls for Mandatory Masking at Area Schools

As the country sets daily records for positive Covid tests, masking can help slow the spread of the virus, including the highly contagious Omicron variant that now accounts for a majority of infections. "What we are experiencing now is our biggest Covid surge yet," said Jeffrey Jahre, MD, St.

Luke's Senior Vice President of Medical & Academic Affairs and Section Chief Emeritus of Infectious Diseases. "If there was ever a time for area school boards, administrators and parents to get behind masking, it's now."



New Year's Day


The new year has been celebrated for millennia. The earliest record of new year's celebrations occurred during Babylonian times. However, January 1st wasn't always the designated day. For example, the first new moon after the vernal equinox ushered in the new year at one time. These festivities occurred in Martius (March), the first month in the early Roman calendar, which only had ten months.

King Pompilius later added the months Januarius (named for Janus, the pagan god of gates, doors and beginnings) and Februarius bringing the calendar to 12 months. It was Julius Caesar who created the Julian calendar, which most closely resembles the Gregorian calendar a majority of the world follows today.



Celebrating the first day of the year in the appropriately named month of January, Romans made sacrifices to Janus, giving gifts and general revelry. With his two faces, the god Janus was able to look toward the past and forward to the future.

Lincoln Signs The Emancipation Proclamation



On January 1, 1863, Abraham Lincoln signs the Emancipation Proclamation. Attempting to stitch together a nation mired in a bloody civil war, Abraham Lincoln made a last-ditch, but carefully calculated, decision regarding the institution of slavery in America.

By the end of 1862, things were not looking good for the Union. The Confederate Army had overcome Union troops in significant battles and Britain and France were set to officially recognize the Confederacy as a separate nation. In an August 1862 letter to New York Tribune editor Horace Greeley, Lincoln confessed "my paramount object in this struggle is to save the Union, and it is not either to save or to destroy slavery." Lincoln hoped that declaring a national policy of emancipation would stimulate a rush of the

South's enslaved people into the ranks of the Union army, thus depleting the Confederacy's labor force, on which the southern states depended to wage war against the North.

Republican abolitionists in the North rejoiced that Lincoln had finally thrown his full weight behind the cause for which they had elected him.






