## **Older Cell Phones Will Soon Be Useless**

Residents with older cell phones are being urged by the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency and Pennsylvania State Police to prepare for the phase-out of 3G cellular networks and service, which could come as early as next month.

If your mobile phone is more than a few years old, you may need to upgrade your device before your provider shuts down its 3G network and you lose service – including the ability to call 911. You should contact your cellular service provider to determine if your devices are compliant to ensure you don't lose connectivity.

The nation's three major wireless carriers (AT&T, Verizon and T-Mobile) have announced plans to shut down their 3G networks to accommodate more advanced services, including 5G, as early as February. That will cause many older phones to be unable to make or receive calls and text messages or use data services. It could also affect other devices that rely on 3G connectivity, such as medical alert devices, tablets, smart watches, home security systems, and in-vehicle safety, security and roadside assistance systems.

Low-income individuals concerned their 911-only phones will no longer be supported can apply for service through the Federal Communications Commission's Lifeline program.


## **National Irish Coffee Day**

Sheridan responded that it was Irish coffee.

## **World's Largest Diamond Found**



On January 25, 1905, at the Premier Mine in Pretoria, South Africa, a 3,106-carat diamond is discovered during a routine inspection by the mine's superintendent. Weighing 1.33 pounds, and christened the "Cullinan," it was the largest diamond ever found.

Frederick Wells was 18 feet below the earth's surface when he spotted a flash of starlight embedded in the wall just above him. His discovery was presented that same afternoon to Sir Thomas Cullinan, who owned the mine. Cullinan then sold the diamond to the Transvaal provincial government, which presented the stone to Britain's King Edward VII as a birthday gift.

Worried that the diamond might be stolen in transit from Africa to London, Edward arranged to send a phony diamond aboard

a steamer ship loaded with detectives as a diversionary tactic. While the decoy slowly made its way from Africa on the ship, the Cullinan was sent to England in a plain box.

Edward entrusted the cutting of the Cullinan to Joseph Asscher, head of the Asscher Diamond Company of Amsterdam. Asscher, who had cut the famous Excelsior Diamond, a 971-carat diamond found in 1893.



On a traditional pair of dice, how many dots can be found?

#### And the answer: 42.

If you count up the dots on one die, you'll count 6+5+4+3+2+1, which equals 21. So if you have a pair of dice, you'll have twice that, totaling 42 dots.

Before there were dice made of plastic, there were astragals. These were, quite literally, the anklebones of sheep, buffalo, or other animals, and would have markings placed upon four sides. The Aztecs, Mayans, and other cultures made dice from pebbles, pottery, walnut shells, peach stones, and other similar objects. Such early dice were often used to divine what the future would hold, but not long passed before dice were discovered to make great game pieces.




