Plan on slippery road conditions. Patchy blowing snow could significantly reduce visibility.


Light to moderate snow will continue through mid morning before ending by midday. Strong winds may create areas of blowing and drifting snow.




National Seed Swap Day

Baseball Hall of Fame Inducts First Class



On January 29, 1936, the U.S. Baseball Hall of Fame elects its first members in Cooperstown, New York: Ty Cobb, Babe Ruth, Honus Wagner, Christy Matthewson and Walter Johnson.

The Hall of Fame actually had its beginnings in 1935, when plans were made to build a museum devoted to baseball and its 100-year history. A private organization based in Cooperstown called the Clark Foundation thought that establishing the Baseball Hall of Fame in their city would help to reinvigorate the area's Depression-ravaged economy by attracting tourists. To help sell the idea, the foundation advanced the idea that U.S. Civil War hero Abner Doubleday invented baseball in Cooperstown. The story proved to be phony.

The Baseball Writers' Association of America chose the five greatest superstars of the game as the first class to be inducted: Ty Cobb was the most productive hitter in history; Babe Ruth was both an ace pitcher and the greatest home-run hitter to play the game; Honus Wagner was a versatile star shortstop and batting champion; Christy Matthewson had more wins than any pitcher in National League history; and Walter Johnson was considered one of the most powerful pitchers to ever have taken the mound.



Sumerian is the oldest written language in existence. Dating back 5,000 years, it was the language of the people of Sumer in ancient Mesopotamia, which was located in what is now Iraq. At the time, people would write on wet clay tablets with a sharp object, and the tablets were then baked or left in the sun to harden.

Sumerian has been traced back to 3100 BCE in Mesopotamia, and was primarily used to conduct business. While it is recognized as the oldest written language today, Archaic Sumerian continues to be difficult to interpret and is poorly understood—since it was in use some 5,000 years ago, many resources have been lost to time.





Appointments Required for Vaccines at LVHN

Lehigh Valley, Pa. (Oct. 29, 2021) – Beginning Monday, Nov. 1, Lehigh Valley Health Network (LVHN) will offer COVID-19 vaccinations, including booster shots, through appointment only. Walk-in vaccinations are no longer available at this time

They have made this change in response to an increased demand for vaccines and booster shots, and in anticipation of the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine receiving emergency use authorization (EUA) for children ages 5-11.
