



Deadline Extended for 2021 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program


The deadline for senior citizens and Pennsylvanians with disabilities to apply for rebates on rent and property taxes paid in 2021 has been extended to Dec. 31.

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The income limit is \$35,000 annually for homeowners and \$15,000 annually for renters, and half of Social Security income is excluded.

The maximum standard rebate for homeowners is \$650, but supplemental rebates for certain qualifying homeowners can boost rebates to \$975. The Department of Revenue automatically calculates supplemental rebates for qualifying homeowners.

Claimants are encouraged to file their rebate applications online by visiting mypath.pa.gov. No account is required. Applicants who still wish to file a paper application form may obtain Property Tax/Rent Rebate claim forms (PA-1000) and related information on the Department of Revenue's website or by calling 1-888-222-9190.

Rebates will be distributed beginning July 1, as required by law. The easiest way to check the status of your rebate after July 1 is to use the Where's My Rebate? tool. To check on the status of your claim, you will need your Social Security number, claim year and date of birth

"I didn't get to see him much as we began to grow older, but we shared so many memories as children. Aonghus was the most kind-hearted person you would have ever met, doing anything to make someone's day. He always had a smile on his face and knew how to put a smile on someone else's face."

> "Aonghus didn't care what other people thought of him or how they looked at him," she continued. "He wasn't afraid to show up in a kilt to the grocery store or express himself."

"I started talking to Aonghus when we had a few classes together," Andrea Black, junior, said. "He always had a smile on his face and was

always making new friends. If someone needed help, he would try the best that he could to help. He would cheer people up and make them giggle when they were down. He was overall such a great person to be around."

On Thursday, October 14th, students at Pen Argyl Area High School wore Hawaiian and Marvel shirts to remember their friend in bright colors with a smile. While they miss having Aonghus here with them, he will always be remembered as one of their truest Green Knights and will forever live on in their hearts.

The Pennsylvania General Assembly has enacted a new law that will better ensure the rights of crime victims are protected.

Act 77 of 2022 will grant crime victims legal standing in court, clarify definitions of "crime" and "personal injury crime" in state law, update crime victims' compensation, provide notice of events in the judicial process, and enhance victims' confidentiality for domestic and sexual violence crimes.

By granting legal standing, people who have been victimized by crime are better able to assert and enforce the rights granted to them under state law

Protecting Senior Citizens A new state law will help protect senior citizens receiving care in nurs-

A new state law will help protect senior citizens receiving care in nursing homes or other health care settings.

Act 61 of 2022 extends the protections of the institutional sexual assault statute to cover elders and other care-dependent persons who are assaulted by those who have the responsibility of providing care.

Current law gives extra protections to students, inmates, dependent children and others who are most vulnerable because of the institutional setting in which they find themselves. This new offense would be triggered when a caretaker engages in sexual intercourse or indecent contact with a care-dependent person who receives care in or from a facility. It will not criminalize consensual sexual relations between spouses or other intimate partners.

A person convicted under this new subsection of institutional sexual assault would commit a third-degree felony, punishable by up to seven years imprisonment and/or a fine of up to \$15,000. Under this legislation, a facility is defined to include but is not limited to places such as nursing homes, assisted living facilities, private care residences and adult daily living centers.

The law will take effect by mid-September.

PennDOT Expands Online Services for People with Disabilities

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced

this week customers who have a Person with Disabilities Parking Placard can now renew it, receive a replacement or update their address on permanent placards online.

The initiative will help save time for customers by eliminating the mail-in process and subsequent processing of paperwork. Customers with Temporary Person with Disabilities Parking Placards will also be able to update their address and request replacement identification credentials through this online service.

To renew a placard online or to obtain additional information on services provided, including how to obtain a placard, please visit the Person with Disabilities Information page on the Driver and Vehicle Services website.

Placard holders will continue to receive a renewal form by mail approximately 60 days prior to their expiration.

Fraudsters Targeting Businesses The state Department of Revenue continues to warn Pennsylvanians of

The state Department of Revenue continues to warn Pennsylvanians of a new scam in which fraudsters are sending phony letters to Pennsylvania business owners aiming to trick them into turning over their accounting records.

The fraudulent letters include the Department of Revenue's name and logo, leading the recipients of the letter to believe they are under investigation for failing to pay Pennsylvania taxes. The goal of the scam is to obtain records containing sensitive information, such as bank account numbers and other financial data, which could be used to make unauthorized transactions, request fraudulent tax refunds, and even apply for loans under the name of the business.
