How This Couple Sailed Through The Tough First Weeks Of Parenthood

A new mom says she and her fiancé assigned rigid roles to get through the first weeks of parenthood, to stop them from breaking up.

Laura Denham, 36, gave birth to son Weston in February.

She and partner Carter Rudnick, 33, worried the new responsibilities could split them up - so they each picked jobs.

Laura handled breastfeeding, soothing and putting Weston to bed.

And Carter went to him when he cried in the night, changed his nappies and did household chores.

Lauren, a recruiter from Los Angeles, CA, said oth took one or two-hour breaks whenever things got too much.

And she said the only things she and Carter Rudnick, a real estate broker, would do differently are paying for cleaners and meal delivery.

Lauren said: "I enjoyed the newborn phase. I know a lot of moms won't say that but I did.

"Assigning duties at the beginning was really helpful.

"Newborns are up every two hours to feed and they are obviously going to the bathroom every two hours."We decided early on that my fiancé was going to change the diapers, bring him to me and then I would feed him and put him to sleep.

"It meant every two hours we weren't like, 'Can you get up with me?' 'I don't want to get up -just feed him,' 'Can you change the diapers?' And going back and forth.

"It eliminated all of that.

"As I was breastfeeding and kids are so dependent on their mom early on, Carter really helped with household tasks – cleaning, taking out the trash, doing the diapers. It made it very simple as we had this process.

No one got angry or frustrated. We just knew what our roles were and what we were supposed to do."

"When you have a newborn you will definitely have resentment and frustrations pop up with your partner.

"In the moment, it is sometimes just not the time to get into them.

"The weekly check-ins allowed us to save those frustrations and just bring them up at one time instead of having five fights throughout the week.

"We made it a little event. On Sunday mornings we would walk to get coffee. We'd both be in a really good mood and we'd bring the baby and sit there and talk.

"When did you feel the most frustrated with me this week?' When did you feel the most loved by me this week?' and 'What can I do to make you feel more supported and loved next week?"

Lauren and Carter would also take one or twohour time-out breaks when they felt overwhelmed.



Special Focus Award Hope Horn

The Special Focus Award goes to an individual who has shown exemplary actions in saving or conserving traditions or a body of knowledge and contributes to educational information. This award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Ms. Hope Horn. Ms. Horn was nominated back in February 2020 due to her continuous teachings of the 'Wool School' out of the former Oughoughton one-room schoolhouse in Richmond, PA.

Ms. Horn has spent countless hours in her school teaching classes on dying, spinning and weaving products from wool, while using her own sheep and goats, and doing all the sheering herself along with dying the wool with natural produces like goldenrod. She also sells products at the adjacent restored general store located next to the school. Ms. Horn has a passion for passing on educational information and conserving a traditional body of knowledge. For this, she has been nominated for the Special Focus Award for 20.

Architectural Award Raymond DiFebo

The Architectural Award goes to an individual who has shown an exemplary act in saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation. The award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Mr. Raymond DiFebo. Mr. DiFebo was also nominated back in February 2020 for his work taking the former pre-1900s Fosbinder Butcher Shop located in Martin's Creek and restoring it as a place of residence. The original store counter now rests in the kitchen. Additionally, the original posts and beams, block and tackle for moving carcasses, meat hooks, wainscoting and tin ceiling have also been retained, along with the storeroom for animal hides and the concrete smokehouse. Mr. DiFebo has preserved a historic building, as well as authentic and original artifacts. For this he has been nominated for the Architectural Award for 20.

Architectural Business Award Aline Haddad and Jesse Poliskiewicz

Additionally within the Architectural Award, SBHC also recognizes businesses who have shown an exemplary act in saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation. The award is to acknowledge businesses who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Johnsonville Farm & Garden. Owners, Aline Haddad and Jesse Poliskiewicz operate a community-based general store stocked with agricultural necessities and local products. In general, Ms. Haddad came up with the concept of restoring and reopening the former store when she returned home from college in 2012 after




