Single Mom Shares Inspiring Story Of Her Higher Education Journey

A single mom has won a special award for her university degree and volunteer work while raising two children.

Mature student Charlotte Harman, 39, was awarded an Outstanding PLUS Award for her achievements at the University of Bristol in England.

She hopes to prove to her sons Marcello, 7, and Emilio, 9, that they can always 'make a new path' in life.

The annual Outstanding PLUS Award is given to just eight high achievers at the university.

The single mom-of-two had previously been a singer and worked at a law firm before a divorce left her looking for a change.

During her Archaeology and Anthropology degree, she volunteered at Bristol Museum and helped a charity that uses archaeology to support injured veterans.

She also inspired children and young adults with archaeology outreach lessons and helped catalog the university's archaeological flora and fauna collection.

Charlotte said: "Getting the award was an amazing feeling - people having faith in me has really helped improve how I see myself.

"Coming to university was a massive change, but it's shown me that I'm a lot stronger than I thought.

"I didn't want to get up each day, there was nothing giving me that spark anymore.

"As a single parent, I want to show my children it's never too late to pursue your dreams and to succeed, and that it doesn't matter how old you are or what you've already done in life.

"There have been lots of times when I felt I couldn't do it, But the university has been really supportive."

"Things like their mental health support have helped me get sorted, move forward and be the person I think I can be. That's been invaluable.

"You can always change courses and make a new path for yourself."

To gain the qualifications needed for university, Charlotte studied for an Access to Higher Education Diploma at City of Bristol College.

Charlotte was supported by Bristol Scholars, a scheme that helps talented locals access the university and provides bursaries, mentoring and support with mental and physical health once there.

Charlotte now says she hopes to study for a doctorate before turning 45.

For her dissertation, Charlotte analyzed charred botanical remains, including wheat and oats, from The Anarchy period (1138AD to 1153) that revealed fascinating data on medieval diet and agricultural practices.

Amber Pinckney, Bristol PLUS Award Manager, said: "Charlotte's university journey is really inspiring.



Special Focus Award Hope Horn

The Special Focus Award goes to an individual who has shown exemplary actions in saving or conserving traditions or a body of knowledge and contributes to educational information. This award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Ms. Hope Horn. Ms. Horn was nominated back in February 2020 due to her continuous teachings of the 'Wool School' out of the former Oughoughton one-room schoolhouse in Richmond, PA.

Ms. Horn has spent countless hours in her school teaching classes on dying, spinning and weaving products from wool, while using her own sheep and goats, and doing all the sheering herself along with dying the wool with natural produces like goldenrod. She also sells products at the adjacent restored general store located next to the school. Ms. Horn has a passion for passing on educational information and conserving a traditional body of knowledge. For this, she has been nominated for the Special Focus Award for 20.

Architectural Award Raymond DiFebo

The Architectural Award goes to an individual who has shown an exemplary act in saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation. The award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Mr. Raymond DiFebo. Mr. DiFebo was also nominated back in February 2020 for his work taking the former pre-1900s Fosbinder Butcher Shop located in Martin's Creek and restoring it as a place of residence. The original store counter now rests in the kitchen. Additionally, the original posts and beams, block and tackle for moving carcasses, meat hooks, wainscoting and tin ceiling have also been retained, along with the storeroom for animal hides and the concrete smokehouse. Mr. DiFebo has preserved a historic building, as well as authentic and original artifacts. For this he has been nominated for the Architectural Award for 20.

Architectural Business Award Aline Haddad and Jesse Poliskiewicz

Additionally within the Architectural Award, SBHC also recognizes businesses who have shown an exemplary act in saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation. The award is to acknowledge businesses who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Johnsonville Farm & Garden. Owners, Aline Haddad and Jesse Poliskiewicz operate a community-based general store stocked with agricultural necessities and local products. In general, Ms. Haddad came up with the concept of restoring and reopening the former store when she returned home from college in 2012 after






