One Out Of 10 People Never Drink Water

"Hydration Is So Important, But It's Very Easy To Let It Slide."

illions of adults are consuming less water than the recommended daily allowance - with one in 10 admitting they never drink it.

UK research into the drinking habits of the nation found the average adult drinks around one liter of water each day.

But guidelines from health experts say the optimal amount is closer to two or three liters daily.

The study of 2,000 Brits found exactly half have no idea how much water they should be taking on.

And of those who understand how much they need, 39 percent confess they only have the recommended daily allowance of water 'once in a blue moon.'

A spokesperson from Zip Water, which commissioned the study, said: "Hydration is so important, but it's very easy to let it slide.

"The goal is to never feel thirsty - if you feel like you really need some water, you've probably already left it slightly too late.

"A great way to help is to have a water bottle on you at all times, it's very easy to regularly have a sip if it's always nearby."

Of those who don't drink enough H2O, 10 percent feel anxious when they haven't got enough, and 14 percent are easily irritated.

More than one in three feel sluggish and tired (both 34 percent), while 18 percent find it difficult to focus and a further 15 percent get a bit weak.

And 11 percent admitted to feeling distracted when not getting enough fluid on board.

The main reasons for avoiding drinking water are not liking it from the tap (27 percent), disliking the taste in general (24 percent), and finding it boring (25 percent).

As many as four in 10, however, simply prefer drinking other things, with 35 percent of all adults saying they drink tea and coffee more than anything else.

As a result, 46 percent get nagged by others for not taking on enough water, according to the One-Poll.com figures.

To try and up their intake, 30 percent do keep a water bottle handy to sip from throughout the day, and 29 percent glug some first thing in the morning.

Nearly three in 10 (28 percent) will keep a glass near their bed so it's handy to have after a night out, to attempt some last-minute rehydration.

More than half of water drinkers (57 percent) buy bottled drinking water, spending an average of £5.70 (\$7.25) a month on the luxury.





The Perils of Vaping Continue To Grow

Vaping, or the use of electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes), has been a topic of concern and research in recent years.

While it is often promoted as a safer alternative to

traditional tobacco smoking, there is growing evidence to suggest that vaping is not without its risks. Here are some reasons why vaping can be considered bad for your health:

Nicotine addiction: Most e-cigarettes contain nicotine, which is a highly addictive substance. Nicotine addiction can lead to dependence and make it difficult for individuals to quit vaping. Respiratory issues: Vaping has been associated with various respiratory problems. E-cigarette aerosols can contain harmful chemicals such as volatile organic compounds, heavy metals, and ultrafine particles, which can irritate and damage the lungs. This can lead to symptoms like coughing, wheezing, and shortness of breath.

Lung damage: A condition called e-cigarette or vaping-

associated lung injury (EVALI) has emerged, primarily affecting individuals who use e-cigarettes containing tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) or other substances. EVALI can cause severe lung damage, leading

symptoms such as chest pain, cough, fever, and difficulty breathing. In some cases, it has even been fatal.

Cardiovascular risks: Vaping has been shown to have negative effects on the cardiovascular system. The inhalation of e-cigarette aerosols can increase heart rate, blood pressure, and the risk of blood clots. These

factors can contribute to an increased risk of heart attacks, strokes, and other cardiovascular problems.

Chemical exposure: E-cigarette liquids and aerosols can contain a wide range of chemicals, including flavorings and additives. While some of these chemicals are generally recognized as safe for consumption, their safety when inhaled into the lungs is not well understood. Some flavorings used in e-cigarettes have been linked to lung toxicity and other health issues. Effect on youth: Vaping has become popular among young people,

During 2020 – 2022, sales of disposable e-cigarette devices and flavors popular among youth increased.

Recreational Vehicle Laws Enacted in Pen Argyl

Please note: Chapter 103. Vehicles and Traffic, Article VI. Parking of Recreational Vehicles,

§ 103-26. Time limit for parking on public property. States: The parking of a recreational vehicle upon any public property, including public streets, for any period of time in excess of 72 consecutive hours is prohibited. The consecutive hours shall not be considered broken or terminated unless the recreational vehicle shall have been removed from public property, including public streets, for a period of 48 consecutive hours.

Recreational Vehicle is defined as:

The single-axle or multiple-axle structure mounted on wheels or otherwise capable of being made mobile for the purpose of travel or recreation and shall include, but not be limited to, travel trailers, mobile homes, tent trailers, boat trailers, home trailers and any trailers used to transport snowmobiles.

Please note that due to increased violations, public concern and parking congestion the Slate Belt Regional Police Department will begin to cite these types of vehicles beginning 6/26/2023


Recognizing the Legacy of Juneteenth Monday

Official Holiday

Juneteenth (officially Juneteenth National Independence Day) is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the emancipation of enslaved African Americans.

Deriving its name from combining June and nineteenth, it is celebrated on the anniversary of the order, issued by Major General Gordon Granger on June 19, 1865, proclaiming freedom for slaves in Texas.

Originating in Galveston, Juneteenth has since been observed annually in various parts of the United States, often broadly celebrating African-American culture. The day was first recognized as a federal holiday in 2021, when President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law after the efforts of Lula Briggs Galloway, Opal Lee, and others

Juneteenth Lehigh Valley will present the first Juneteenth Parade in the Lehigh Valley that brings together agencies from Allentown, Bethlehem, and Easton on Northampton St. in Easton, PA on Monday, June 19th from 12:00-3:00 p.m.

Delaware Water Gap Area Evidence of Slavery in PA As Juneteenth is inaugurated as a federal holiday, it is important to note

that slavery was not exclusively a southern regional issue. Slavery existed within the park.

The Callahan House is believed to have been a stop on the underground railroad for freedom seekers. The Van Campen Inn, located on Old Mine Road, was the site of a working farm that enslaved people.


In New Jersey, it wasn't until 1846 that the state banned slavery and even then made exemptions for enslaved people to become "apprentices" and "to continue until such person is discharged." An 1850 Federal Census counted 236 enslaved people in the state including Caesar Soults, who was the last enslaved person to be counted in Sussex County. He was freed prior to his death on March 11, 1860. His age was unknown but "in the neighborhood of one hundred." The 1860 Federal Census lists it at 107.

As we observe Juneteenth, we acknowledge our past as we continue to work towards a more inclusive future.



The Callahan House, also known as the Jacob Helm House, is a historic home located in the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area south of Milford, in Dingman Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania. It was built in two sections, with the older dated to about 1800 and the later to about 1820. It is a long, 1+1/2-story, clapboard-clad frame dwelling with a steep gable roof. It features exposed chimney backs at the first floor exterior in the Dutch style, and a porch along the newer wing.

It served as an inn, and is believed to have been a station on the Underground Railroad.



A slave register of 1780 for Northampton County includes the names of slave and slaveowners, including two from Mt Bethel .Professor Scott Gordon found the document while combing through records of the Historical Society of Pennsylvania.





Special Focus Award Hope Horn

The Special Focus Award goes to an individual who has shown exemplary actions in saving or conserving traditions or a body of knowledge and contributes to educational information. This award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Ms. Hope Horn. Ms. Horn was nominated back in February 2020 due to her continuous teachings of the 'Wool School' out of the former Oughoughton one-room schoolhouse in Richmond, PA.

Ms. Horn has spent countless hours in her school teaching classes on dying, spinning and weaving products from wool, while using her own sheep and goats, and doing all the sheering herself along with dying the wool with natural produces like goldenrod. She also sells products at the adjacent restored general store located next to the school. Ms. Horn has a passion for passing on educational information and conserving a traditional body of knowledge. For this, she has been nominated for the Special Focus Award for 20.

Architectural Award Raymond DiFebo

The Architectural Award goes to an individual who has shown an exemplary act in saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation. The award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Mr. Raymond DiFebo. Mr. DiFebo was also nominated back in February 2020 for his work taking the former pre-1900s Fosbinder Butcher Shop located in Martin's Creek and restoring it as a place of residence. The original store counter now rests in the kitchen. Additionally, the original posts and beams, block and tackle for moving carcasses, meat hooks, wainscoting and tin ceiling have also been retained, along with the storeroom for animal hides and the concrete smokehouse. Mr. DiFebo has preserved a historic building, as well as authentic and original artifacts. For this he has been nominated for the Architectural Award for 20.

Architectural Business Award Aline Haddad and Jesse Poliskiewicz

Additionally within the Architectural Award, SBHC also recognizes businesses who have shown an exemplary act in saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation. The award is to acknowledge businesses who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Johnsonville Farm & Garden. Owners, Aline Haddad and Jesse Poliskiewicz operate a community-based general store stocked with agricultural necessities and local products. In general, Ms. Haddad came up with the concept of restoring and reopening the former store when she returned home from college in 2012 after


