PAHS Students Win Medals in Business Leaders Program

Every year, the Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA) hosts competitions to prepare emerging leaders in the areas of marketing, finance, hospitality, and management in high schools and colleges around the world. Students who are enrolled in the Career Institute of Technology (CIT) are automatically enrolled in this program, and this year, Pen Argyl seniors Dominic Baio and Emberlynn Allen won medals in their respective categories.

“In a DECA conference, the judge hands you a fake scenario related to your field, and you have 10 minutes to read the scenario and decide on how you personally would handle the situation,” Baio said. “My competition was Automotive Services and Marketing, where I won two medals for Best Role Play A + B and Highest Test Score.”

“I competed in Marketing Management team decision making with my friend Trinity,” Allen said. “We only get designated one role play, while individual events have two.”

These recent wins have come after years of learning and preparation, but it shows more than just the ability to win a medal.

“I have participated in DECA since my sophomore year and have been competing since,” Baio said. “I prepared for this competition with my CIT Marketing teacher Ms. Allen. She gave me practice scenarios that were similar to the event I was competing in.

“It feels awesome to win and gives me more confidence in the business field especially,” Baio continued. “I think competition has given me more real-life scenarios and examples of how to handle them.”

“I prepared for the competition by practicing role play scenarios that were given in my category,” Allen said. “We study and prepare for our role plays weeks before the event.

“I feel very accomplished and proud to be able to get a reward for the hard work my friend and I put in,” Allen continued. “I believe this competition will help with my future career goals: teaching me how to speak, preparing solutions in a short amount of time, and learning different scenarios of my field.”

All in all, the results of the competition seem to be a strong indication of the bright futures these students have ahead of them.

“My plans after high school are to attend Penn State for Business & Management for two years and then attend Northwood University for Automotive Marketing and Management to give me more of an education about the car business,” Baio said. “My long-term career goal is to become a General Manager of a new car dealership or become a part-owner of a new car franchise with my dad.”

“I’m going to attend Shippensburg University for Business Management,” Allen said. “I’m not certain what field of business I want to do, but I know I want to open my own establishments one day, and being an entrepreneur has been a dream of mine.”

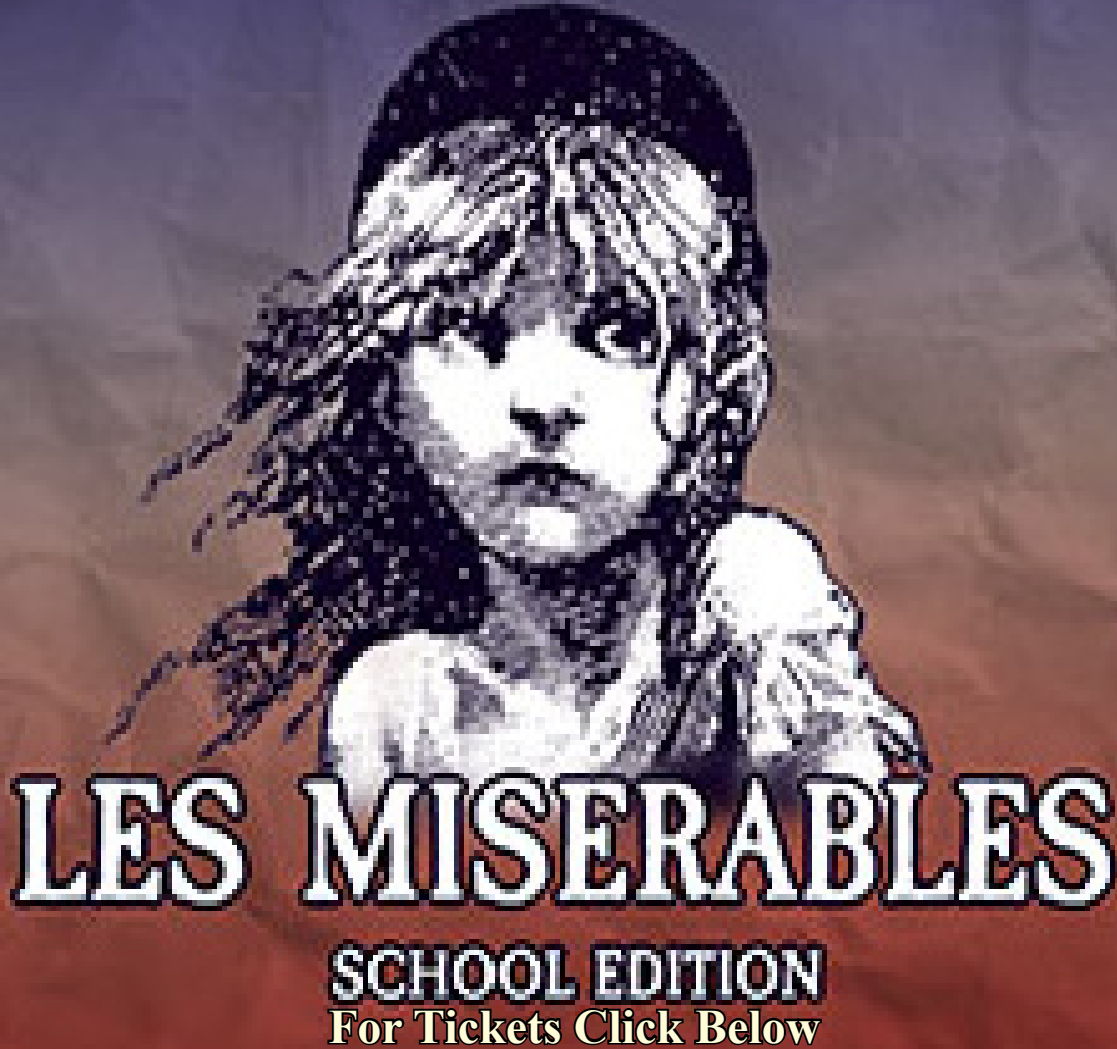

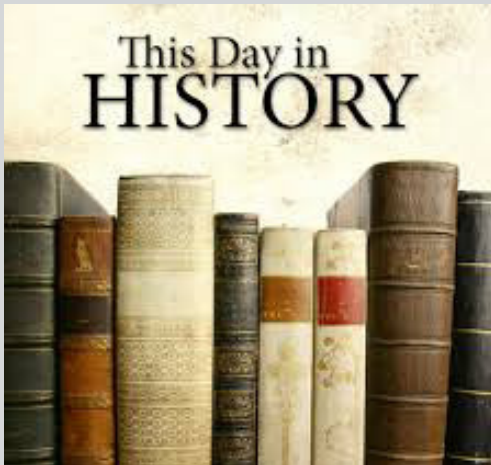

War In Iraq Begins



On March 19, 2003, the United States, along with coalition forces primarily from the United Kingdom, initiates war on Iraq. Just after explosions began to rock Baghdad, Iraq's capital, U.S. President George W. Bush announced in a televised address, "At this hour, American and coalition forces are in the early stages of military operations to disarm Iraq, to free its people and to defend the world from grave danger." President Bush and his advisors built much of their case for war on the specious claim that Iraq, under dictator Saddam Hussein, possessed or was in the process of building weapons of mass destruction.

Hostilities began about 90 minutes after the U.S.-imposed deadline for Saddam Hussein to leave Iraq or face war passed.

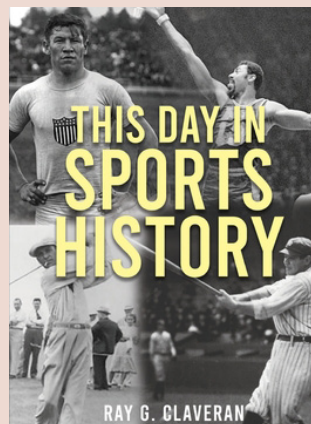
The first targets, which Bush said were "of military importance," were hit with Tomahawk cruise missiles from U.S. fighter-bombers and warships stationed in the Persian Gulf. In response to the attacks, Republic of Iraq radio in Baghdad announced, "the evil ones, the enemies of God, the homeland and humanity, have committed the stupidity of aggression against our homeland and people."

Before refrigeration, ice harvesting from frozen lakes and ponds was a very large industry and an important part of rural life. Iceboxes, the precursor to the refrigerator, were common in many households and ice harvested during the winter were used to keep the icebox cold.

The commercial ice industry utilized huge icehouses to store the harvested ice for distribution by the iceman to customers. In addition, many farmers constructed small icehouses that were filled with ice for their own use to preserve food. Guest speaker Bill Leonard, Jr. will cover the history of ice harvesting, the tools used, how ice was harvested, and a local ice harvest that continues today.
