Heritage Center Service Clubs Exhibit Opens to Public April 22

“Centuries of Service: A Salute to Slate Belt Service Clubs” opens to the public Saturday, April 22, from 12:00 – 3:00 pm at the Slate Belt Heritage Center.

Service is people helping people without any expectation of reward. The new show follows the growth of service clubs, from the mutual benefit societies that only aided members, to the 20th century clubs that gave men, women, boys, and girls a voice and promoted good citizenship, to today’s national organizations that are open to all.

You’ll discover why people formed these clubs, get a glimpse into some of the “secret” early rituals, and connect their causes and mission to the community. From the Knights of the Golden Eagle to the Weona Park Pals, all worked (and played) to serve the Slate Belt.

You can also enjoy refreshed exhibits that feature early Slate Belt History, from the Lenape to the European settlers like the Beck family, to the waves of European immigrants that found employment in the slate, textile and garment industries. The fire-fighting exhibit features antique apparatus from the Slate Belt’s golden industrial age.

This year they collaborate with the Quarry Hoist Group and Totts Gap Art Institute, which will dedicate the new pavilion for the S. Flory Manufacturing Company Hoist in Bethel Park next door the heritage Center on North First St..

The dedication ceremony starts at 11 am and demonstrations will continue through the afternoon. The Heritage Center (adjacent to Bethel Park) will open from 12 - 3, serve light snacks, and have special displays of Flory Manufacturing material. You’ll be able to view a continuous slide show that highlights the life of the hoist from the quarry to its new home.

The Heritage Center will also unveil the new outdoor signage sponsored by a Northampton County Department of Community and Economic Development Hotel Tax Grant. The NPS standard display signs bring Slate Belt history out of the museum and into downtown Bangor.

The Slate Belt Heritage Center is located in the 1907 Town Hall building at 30 North First Street, Bangor, PA. Founded in 1999, the Center is a not-for-profit- 501 (c) 3 that collects, preserves, interprets and makes public the history, ethnic traditions and industrial heritage of the area. SBHC is open Saturdays and Sundays, noon to 3 PM from mid-April through October and Sundays, November through March, noon - 3PM. Tours and research time can be scheduled by appointment.

\$2.8 Million Improvements planned for Route 191 in the Slate Belt

Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) District 5 executives recently highlighted highway and bridge construction projects that will start or continue this year in Berks, Carbon, Lehigh, Monroe, Northampton, and Schuylkill counties. Fixing and maintaining Pennsylvania’s roads, highways, and bridges is a top priority of the Shapiro administration.

These latest announcements builds on Pennsylvania Governor Shapiro’s commitment to ensuring Pennsylvanians can travel across the Commonwealth safely.

PennDOT anticipates more than \$700 million worth of road and bridge projects will be under construction this year in its Engineering District 5, the six-county east central region.

“Investing in our transportation system is essential for this region’s economy,” said District 5 Executive Mike Rebert. “These projects are vital investments in east central Pennsylvania.”

Locally, \$2.8 million will be used for the Milling and paving of State Route 191 in Bangor Borough, Plainfield and Washington townships, Northampton County.

Fruity Fermented Coffee Could Soon Be Mainstream

Speciality Coffees Are Gaining Traction And Now Fermented Coffee Could Bring A Fruity Taste To Your Cup

A new discovery could help fruity fermented coffee join the mainstream.

Speciality coffees are gaining traction in coffeehouses around the world - and now fermented coffee could bring a fruity taste to your morning cup.

This new drink gives off a raspberry-like taste and aroma which makes it stand out from the crowd.

But up until now what causes these sensations has been a mystery.

Now a team of scientists has found that six compounds contribute to the fermented coffee experience.

The new discovery could help increase the production of the drink and make it more readily available for everyone to enjoy.

Dr. Chahan Yeretiaz, the project's principal investigator, said: "There are now flavors that people are creating that no one would have ever associated with coffee in the past.

"The flavors in fermented coffee, for example, are often more akin to fruit juices."

As well as being tasty, the high demand for this unique coffee means fermented beans can fetch a high price, potentially benefiting farmers.

Preparing the beans also requires much less water than traditional methods, meaning it is better for the environment than your standard cup of coffee.

To find out what compounds make up the unique drink, scientists took arabica beans and divided them into three groups.

They prepared two of the groups using common processes used to make your average cup of joe.

However, for the third group the team fermented the beans.

To do this they took whole coffee fruits and fermented them in stainless steel tanks and infused them with carbon dioxide to lower the pH of the fermentation.

Unlike the other brews, the coffee made with fermented beans had an intense scent, smelling like raspberries with a hint of rose.

To find out what compounds made up these beans, they brewed coffee using each type of bean and analyzed the samples with gas chromatography (GC) sniffing.

The GC instrument separated individual components so each one could be identified.

Identifying the

As the compounds left the instrument, they went to a mass spectrometer for identification and someone smelt each one and described its scent.

The human nose can sometimes detect scents from compounds that are at such a low concentration, they're unable to be picked up by mass spectrometry.

Yeretian said: "Because the chemical signature doesn't tell us how a compound smells, we have to rely on the human nose to detect the scent as each compound comes out of the chromatography instrument individually."

This method can prove to be tricky as there is a subjective element to it.

Dr. Samo Smrke, a research associate in the lab, said: "We're using people to detect scents, and everybody perceives flavors a little differently.

"But in this case, the panel was very consistent in the smells they described. So, what is traditionally considered a challenge was actually not an issue because the aromas were so clear."

Although six compounds appeared to contribute to the intense fruity flavor, the team was only able to identify three of them.

The researchers from the Coffee Excellence Center at Zurich University of Applied Sciences now hope to identify the remaining compounds and judge the intensity of different flavors and scents.

They also aim to find out more about how these unique compounds form.

Potential factors could be farming practices, the variety of coffee beans, the microclimate of specific farms and the microbes present during fermentation.

Fermented coffee has become popular in competitive events due to its unique flavor.

The method was first introduced to the specialty coffee world in 2015, when the winning contestant in the World Barista Championship used it to prepare their entry.

However, with little knowledge available, some people have been concerned that it is difficult to distinguish between the genuine product and a regular cup of coffee that has been adapted to taste the same.

With more knowledge of these compounds, this issue can be resolved and make fermented coffee easier than ever to make.

With large-scale production, more people will be able to enjoy this distinctive flavor.



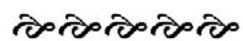

Membership is not needed to purchase items in the Book Nook, but is free to all residents of the Pen Argyl Area School District. Nonresidents may join for a small yearly fee.

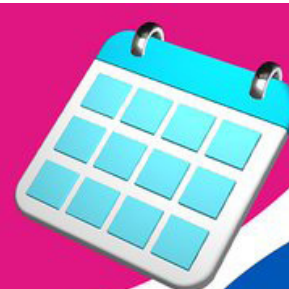
