It's Time to Remove Cost Barriers to Early Breast Cancer Detection

By: Senators Tracy Pennycuick (R-24) & Lisa Boscola (D-18)

Three of the scariest words in the English language are spoken thousands of times a day in doctor's offices across the country: "You have cancer." This year, more than 12,000 Pennsylvania women will hear those words as they are diagnosed with breast cancer. These women are our friends, family members, neighbors and coworkers – perhaps even ourselves.

"You have cancer." This diagnosis was delivered to both of Senator Pennycuick's grandmothers, her mother, her aunt and cousins. Senator Boscola has had friends and family devastated by a cancer diagnosis.

Sometimes, but not often enough, they are followed by four more words: "We caught it early." When breast cancer and/or the gene mutations associated with it are detected early, patients have far more options and outcomes and odds of remission are drastically improved, nearly 90% for some cancers. There are no substitutes for regular screenings and genetic testing, especially for those with risk factors or a family history. Pure and simple, early detection saves lives.

But for many women, these life-saving genetic tests and enhanced screenings are unavailable due to cost. This is unacceptable. Cost should never be a barrier to early cancer detection.

The Pennsylvania Senate has come together in a bipartisan effort to help strengthen the health and safety of our communities across the Commonwealth by breaking down these financial barriers to early detection. Senate President Pro Tempore Kim Ward, a breast cancer survivor thanks to early detection, sponsored Senate Bill 8, and we are proud to fully support our colleague and this legislation as cosponsors. This legislation is the first of its kind in the nation and will remove all out-of-pocket costs and mandate 100% coverage for preventative breast cancer screenings for high-risk patients. This includes coverage of all costs associated with supplemental screenings by MRI or Ultrasound, which are especially important for women with dense breast tissue.

No deductibles, no co-pays, no co-insurance.

The bill also covers genetic testing for the BRCA1 and BRCA2 gene mutation, an invaluable life-saving tool that often leads to earlier cancer detection or even prevention. Genetic testing not only informs the tested individual, but also enables their family members to understand their own risks and manage their own care.

We are proud to report that this bill was unanimously passed by the Senate Banking and Insurance Committee on February 28, and, with 47 cosponsors, we expect its passage by the full Senate shortly, sending a loud and clear message that it is time to remove the financial barriers associated with preventive breast cancer screenings and genetic testing that prevent women from obtaining affordable access to preventive screenings that detects breast cancer early and saves lives

Pen Argyl Parade Leader Jerry DeLong Celebrating His 80th Birthday

If you have lived in Pen Argyl during the past 50 years or so, it's very likely that you have met, or at the very least, have learned about Jerry DeLong's contribution to the Pen Argyl Labor Day parade sponsored by Lookout Fire Co. #1 of Pen Argyl. where Jerry is also an honorary member.

Saturday 2-4pm, the fire company will honor Jerry on his 80th birthday at the Fire Company's Banquet Hall adjacent to Weona Park on Route 512.

According to a news release from Lookout, "Jerry is a simple man who has two prized possessions: his bicycle, which he rides to his borough hangouts and to lead the parade, and his tobacco pipe, which he is rarely without."

When this writer had an office in the early 2000s on West Pennsylvania Avenue (Rt. 512) the week wouldn't be complete without a visit from Jerry. When I picked up our daily mail at the Pen Argyl Post Office, Jerry could often be seen hanging out at Black's across the street.

Jerry's parade experience goes back 57 years to 1966 when he was,

according to a story in the Morning Call, voted the "Best Clown" in the Bangor Halloween Parade.

A few years later, he was given a special award for riding a "Decorated Bike" in the Pen Argyl Labor Day parade. He received subsequent awards in 1982, 1983, 1987, and 1992.

Another story in the Morning Call from September 1992 confirmed that Jerry would continue his role of leading the parade. Some area residents say that his leadership goes back even further, perhaps as long as 50 years.

The affection the Fire Co. shares with Jerry is reflected in the following Fire Co. statement from July 2016: "We are asking that everyone keep our very own Honorary Member Jerry DeLong in their thoughts. The other night while on his way home on his bike, Jerry fell and was injured. The injuries he suffered did require surgery. We are happy to report he is doing well and is in good spirits. Now please help us and show your support for this Pen Argyl Icon, and most importantly, the official starter of our Labor Day Parade."


Regardless of the outcome, Pen Argyl will advance to the state tourney.



ASH WEDNESDAY

In 2023, like in every year, Ash Wednesday is the first day of the liturgical season of Lent. It always falls six and half weeks before Easter, beginning the Lenten season of preparation for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Origin

Ash Wednesday dates back to the 11th century. Yet, the tradition of receiving ashes has even earlier roots — to the ancient Hebrew custom of clothing oneself in sackcloth and dusting oneself with ashes as a sign of penance

How Is The Date For Easter Determined Every Year?

The simple standard definition of Easter is that it is the first Sunday after the full Moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox. If the full Moon falls on a Sunday then Easter is the next Sunday.

Easter, also called Pascha or Resurrection Sunday, is a Christian festival and cultural holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day of his burial following his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary

It marks the first day of Lent in Western churches. The ashes symbolize penance and the dust from which God made people. When priests mark Christian's forehead with the ashes they often say, "Repent and believe in the Gospel," or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return
