Winter precipitation returns today for parts of the region. Mainly rain from south of the Slate Belt and south/east of Philadelphia, then snow farther northwest with some accumulation. The heaviest snow will be in the higher elevations. Impacts to travel should be minimal.

Friday's storm may also change to snow, but according to the NWS, it should be mostly rain. Next week temperatures are expected be in the 50s and may approach 60.







The Barbie Doll Makes Its Debut



On March 9, 1959, the first Barbie doll goes on display at the American Toy Fair in New York City.

Eleven inches tall, with a waterfall of blond hair, Barbie was the first mass-produced toy doll in the United States with adult features. The woman behind Barbie was Ruth Handler, who co-founded Mattel, Inc. with her husband in 1945. After seeing her young daughter ignore her baby dolls to play make-believe with paper dolls of adult women, Handler realized there was an important niche in the market for a toy that allowed little girls to imagine the future.

Barbie's appearance was modeled on a doll named Lilli, based on a German comic strip character. Originally marketed as a racy

gag gift to adult men in tobacco shops, the Lilli doll later became extremely popular with children. Mattel bought the rights to Lilli and made its own version, which Handler named after her daughter, Barbara. With its sponsorship of the "Mickey Mouse Club" TV program in 1955, Mattel became one of the first toy companies to broadcast commercials to children.



Originally known as the pianoforte, which means soft (piano) and loud (forte), the first pianos were so expensive that, for nearly a century, only aristocrats and royalty owned pianos. Today, nearly 20% of Americans have a piano on their home.

Think Spring! Trout Stocking Schedules Available

The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) announced this week its 2022 trout stocking schedules are now available online (https://www.fishandboat.com/Fish/Stocking/Pages/default.aspx) and on the FishBoatPA mobile app.

The PFBC will stock approximately 3.2 million adult trout in 696 streams and 128 lakes open to public angling. This includes approximately 2.2 million Rainbow Trout, 686,000 Brown Trout and 293,000 Brook Trout. As with past practice, the average size of the trout produced for stocking is 11 inches in length with an average weight of 0.58 pounds.

Volunteers will once again be welcome to participate in stocking activities. Stocking is set to begin the week of Feb. 21 in advance of the statewide Mentored Youth Trout Day on Saturday, March 26, and the statewide opening day of trout season on Saturday, April 2.

The 2022 adult trout stocking schedule is searchable by county, lists the waterways in alphabetical order, and indicates stocking dates and the species of trout that will be stocked.
