Remdesivir Available at St. Luke's and LVHN

Harrisburg, PA – The Department of Health today distributed the investigational antiviral medication, remdesivir, to treat patients in the hospital with COVID-19. The federal government distributed the first shipment of 1,200 doses to the department on Tuesday, May 12, and this entire allotment has been shipped to Pennsylvania hospitals.

The hospitals that will receive the first shipments were determined based on the number of COVID-19 patients at the hospital over a recent seven-day period, and the severity of the illness of those patients, based on whether they are on a ventilator. The

“The department is working to give our hospitals every opportunity to treat patients with COVID-19,” Secretary of Health Dr. Rachel Levine said. “It is important to note that there is limited information on the safety and effectiveness of using remdesivir to treat people in the hospital with COVID-19. However, it was shown in a clinical trial to shorten the recovery time in some people, which is why the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has authorized the emergency use of the medication for treatment.”

department will continue to work with our federal partners to acquire more doses of this medication to serve more patients across Pennsylvania.

Remdesivir is given to a patient through an IV once per day for up to 10 days, depending on how critically ill the patient is. According to the FDA, remdesivir may help decrease the amount of coronavirus in your body, which may help you get better faster.

EMS Grants Available

Lamont McClure and the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) announce that the County of Northampton will begin accepting applications on May 18th for the 2020 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) grants. EMS grants are available to Northampton County volunteer fire departments non-profit emergency medical service organizations and can be used for capital improvements, vehicle purchase, equipment purchase and training. Eligible organizations can apply for \$10,000 per application or project.

The application process opens on Monday, May 18th, and closes on Friday, June 26th. Approvals are

Test Site Open Until May 22

The Northampton County sponsored Covid-19 drive-thru testing site at Easton Hospital will remain open until May 22nd.

Hours of operation are Monday through Friday, from 10:00AM – 4:00PM. The Coronavirus testing site is located in the main parking lot at Easton Hospital, 250 S 21st Street, Easton, PA 18042. The risk of viral transmission at a drive-thru site is much lower than at a walk-in clinic.

“As of Monday, 280 Northampton County residents have been tested for Covid-19 at our drive-thru site,” says Lamont McClure. “We can’t reopen our county until we know how prevalent the virus is in our community.”

Only residents from Northampton County will be accepted and they must show at least one of the following CDC recognized symptoms of Covid-19: fever, dry cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat or loss of taste and/or smell.

State PUA in full Operation

The PA Department of Labor & Industry today announced that the state's Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) system is now fully operational.

Claimants who previously filed their applications for benefits can now visit the site to complete their weekly certification and receive benefits. Over 162,000 claimants with completed applications on file were notified via email that they could now file for benefit payments.

County Government Center

Citizens with Election-related business may enter the Northampton County Government Center, 669 Washington Street Easton, beginning May 11, 2020 through June 2 for election-related business includes registering to vote and applying for or dropping off Absentee/Mail-in ballots. The Government Center has been closed to the public since March 19th. Anyone entering the Center is required to wear a mask and must submit to a temperature check at the door.

The public may enter the Northampton County Government Center for the following actions:

The courthouse will also be open for:

- Anyone who needs to post bail. This includes a bondsman or a third party surety.
- Any person and their legal representative(s) having business before the Court of Common Pleas of Northampton County. (For questions as to whether you are required to appear, call Court Administration at 610-829-6700).
- Any person needing to make an application for a 'Protection from Abuse' order will continue to be admitted.
- Any person and/or their legal representative who believes, in good faith, that a statute of limitations pertaining to them may expire before the courthouse reopens to the public.
