Slate Belt Heritage Center Announces Winners For 2023 Annual Preservation Awards

Special Focus Award Hope Horn

The Special Focus Award goes to an individual who has shown exemplary actions in saving or conserving traditions or a body of knowledge and contributes to educational information. This award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Ms. Hope Horn. Ms. Horn was nominated back in February 2020 due to her continuous teachings of the 'Wool School' out of the former Oughoughton one-room schoolhouse in Richmond, PA.

Ms. Horn has spent countless hours in her school teaching classes on dying, spinning and weaving products from wool, while using her own sheep and goats, and doing all the sheering herself along with dying the wool with natural produces like goldenrod. She also sells products at the adjacent restored general store located next to the school. Ms. Horn has a passion for passing on educational information and conserving a traditional body of knowledge. For this, she has been nominated for the Special Focus Award for 2023.

Architectural Award Raymond DiFebo

The Architectural Award goes to an individual who has shown an exemplary act in saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation. The award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Mr. Raymond DiFebo. Mr. DiFebo was also nominated back in February 2020 for his work taking the former pre-1900s Fosbinder Butcher Shop located in Martin's Creek and restoring it as a place of residence. The original store counter now rests in the kitchen. Additionally, the original posts and beams, block and tackle for moving carcasses, meat hooks, wainscoting and tin ceiling have also been retained, along with the storeroom for animal hides and the concrete smokehouse. Mr. DiFebo has preserved a historic building, as well as authentic and original artifacts. For this he has been nominated for the Architectural Award for 2023.

Architectural Business Award Aline Haddad and Jesse Poliskiewicz

Additionally within the Architectural Award, SBHC also recognizes businesses who have shown an exemplary act in saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation. The award is to acknowledge businesses who have performed acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. This year's winner is Johnsonville Farm & Garden. Owners, Aline Haddad and Jesse Poliskiewicz operate a community-based general store stocked with agricultural necessities and local products. In general, Ms. Haddad came up with the concept of restoring and reopening the former store when she returned home from college in 2012 after

acquiring knowledge in agriculture, animal husbandry and organic farming. Overall, she believed that Upper Mount Bethel, the Bangor Area, and the Slate Belt needed such a vital resource to nurture and compliment the rural nature of the surrounding region by fostering farm and garden practices and supplying the basic resources needed to promote such a lifestyle in the community. For this, her business has been nominated for the Architectural Award/Business Category for 2023

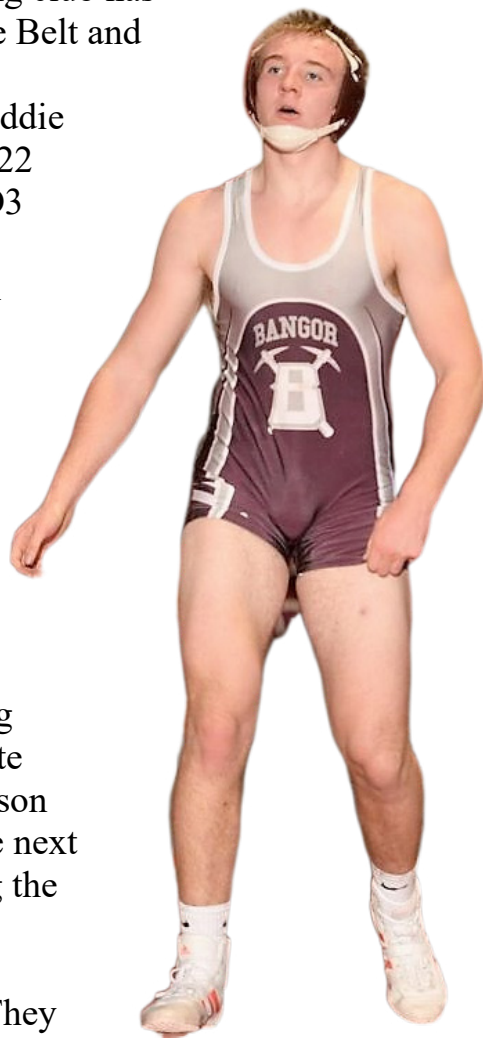

Boscola Announces Grants For Slate Belt Organizations

Senator Lisa Boscola Announces \$2.64 Million in State Grants for Projects in the 18th Senatorial District

Bethlehem, May 16, 2023 - - State Senator Lisa Boscola today announced state funding totaling \$2,643,353 for projects in the 18th Senatorial District through the Local Share Account – Northampton and Lehigh Counties and the Local Share Account-Monroe County.

“Communities throughout the 18th District are deserving of state grants for these important community development projects that will improve the quality of life of throughout Northampton County,” Boscola stated. “I am pleased to have worked together with the Lehigh Valley Delegation in a bi-partisan, bi-cameral manner to see over \$2.64 million come to communities throughout Northampton County for twenty-six priority projects. In particular, it is critical that we provide our local police and fire with the tools they need to protect our communities and this funding aids in that goal,” Boscola continued.

“Through the approval of these state funds, Northampton County communities will be able to expedite important projects that will improve the quality of life and increase community safety,” Boscola added. “The local share account funds coming to important community projects throughout the Lehigh Valley demonstrate the positive impact we have seen through the state gaming act,” Boscola added.

Northampton County projects in the 18th District approved today by the Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA) for investment are as follows:

- **Bangor Borough Salt Shed** (\$89,609) applied for by the Borough of Bangor;
- **Regional Police Vehicles** (\$57,021) applied for the Borough of Pen Argyl on behalf of the Slate Belt Regional Police Department;
- **Spray Playground and Ice Rink Combination – Phase 1** (\$64,629) applied for by **Pen Argyl Borough**;
- **Self Contained Breathing Apparatus Project** (\$60,000) applied for by **Roseto Borough** on behalf of Columbia Fire Company No. 1.

The Local Share Accounts (LSA) were established by the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act. The funds are generated by the state's gaming facilities and may be used for economic development, community development and public interest projects in Northampton, Lehigh and Monroe County and its contiguous counties.

The grants were approved today by the state Commonwealth Financing Authority Board in Harrisburg.

SBRPD K-9 Zorro Debut

Slate Belt Regional Debut of K-9 Zorro On Thursday, May 18th at approx. 5:00pm., a new addition to the Slate Belt Regional Police Department will be debuted to the public. K-9 Zorro and his handler, Officer Joshua

Lowe, will be present at the Wind Gap Borough Municipal Building (545 East West Street, Wind Gap, PA) to be recognized as the Department's first Canine Unit. Also, as a K-9 fund raiser, SBRPD had a community logo contest to design the Department's K-9 t-shirt. Two designs, which were picked by the officers of the SBRPD, will be unveiled by the individuals who designed them.

The SBRPD K-9 began in May of 2022 when representatives Of Waste Management donated approx. \$61,000.00 to fund the beginning of the canine program. Through this donation, the Department was able to send Officer Lowe to a premier Canine Academy, identified as High Drive K-9, Inc., located at Belton, South Carolina, for a six (6) week training.

Officer Lowe was introduced, and trained extensively, with K-9 Zorro for the entire training period.

K-9 Zorro is a German Shephard/Malinois mix breed and is approx. 18 months old. He is trained, and certified, in obedience, article search, area search, tracking, building search, aggression control, narcotics detection: to include methamphetamine, heroin, cocaine and MDMA. Upon his both K-9 Zorro, and Officer Lowe, are mandated to continue with additional training weekly.

As previously mentioned, Waste Management provided a generous donation to "kick-off" the K-9 Program. However, additional donations from businesses and members of the community have helped tremendously with funding this initiative. At the May 18th Commission Meeting, Waste Management will be presenting the Commission/Department with an additional donation to complete the purchase of Officer Lowe's K-9 patrol car. This furthers the Department's commitment to fund the K-9 Program without placing a burden On the residents of the municipalities that we serve.

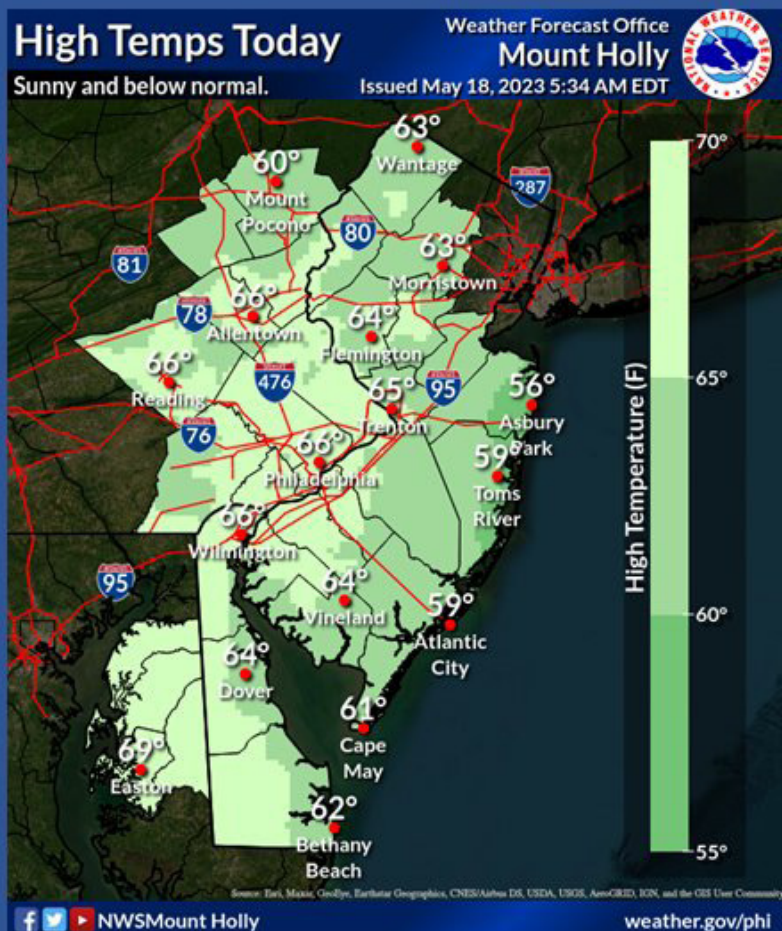

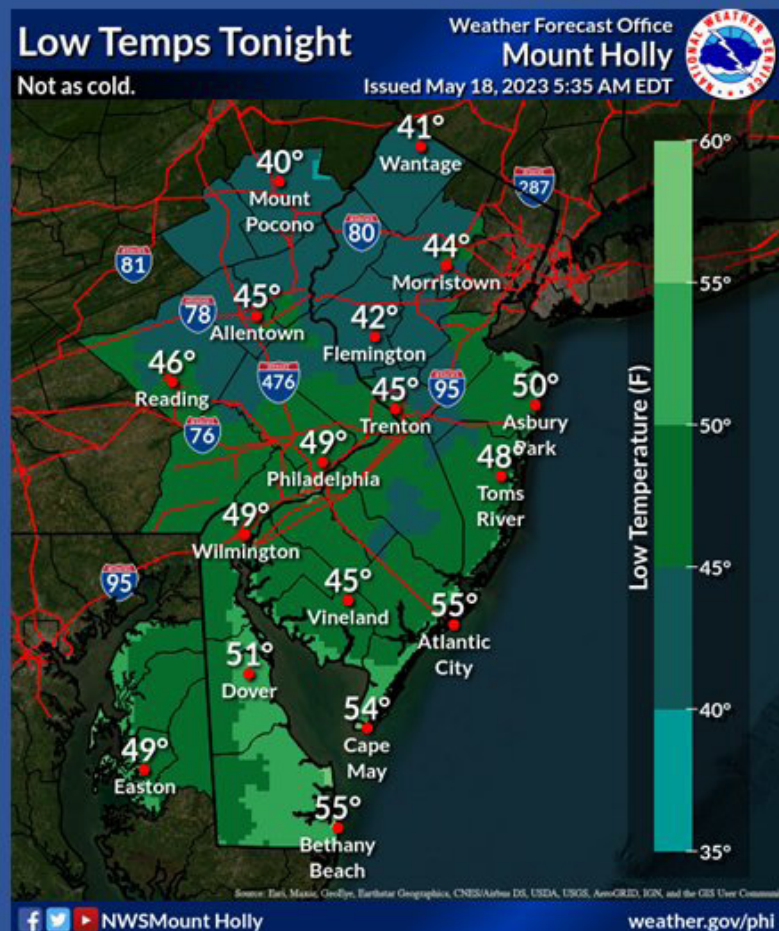

We were also able to purchase customized cards that we write messages on for any student in Pen Argyl Area High School that accomplishes something or does a great thing. 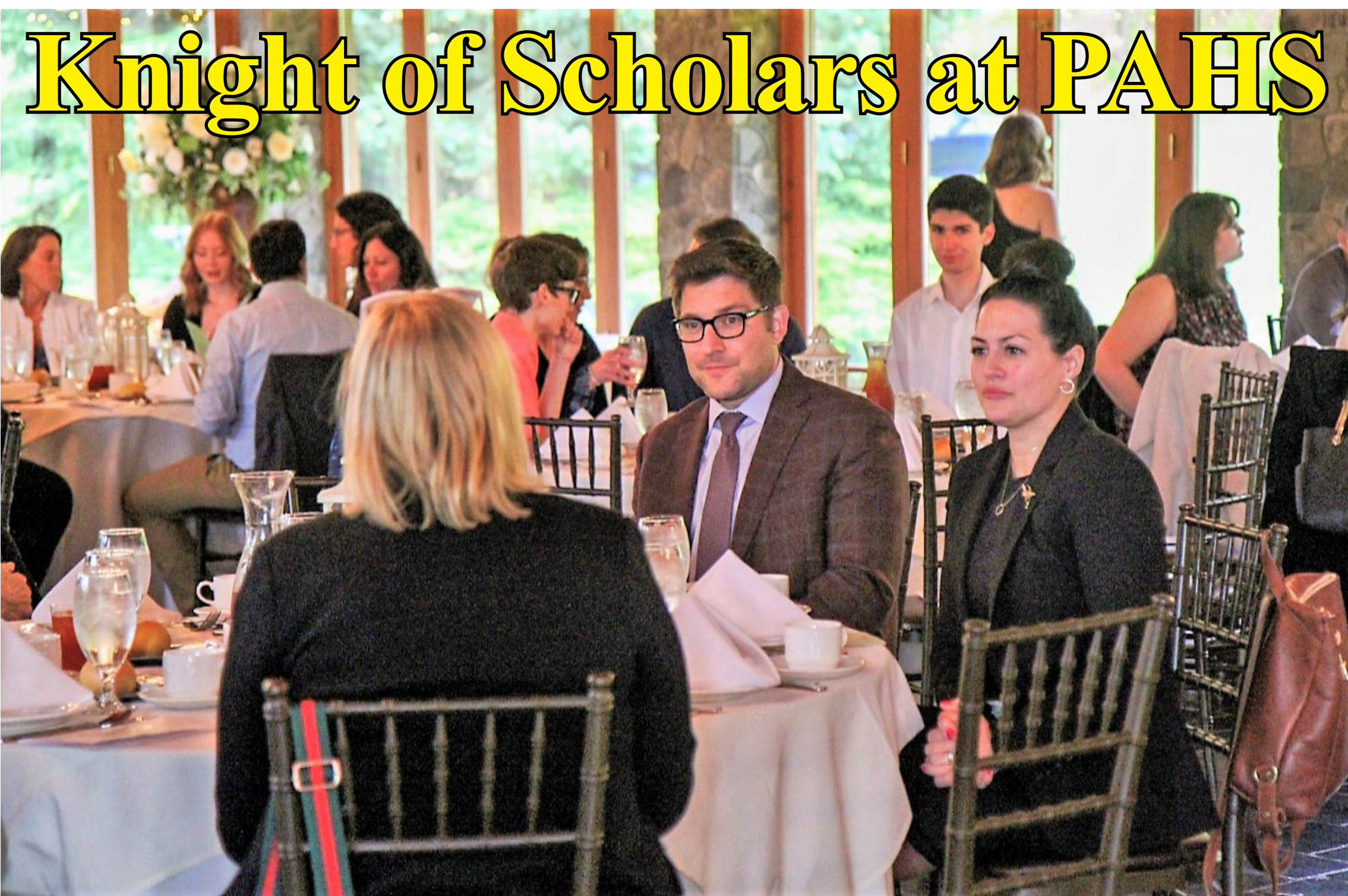
