Lower Mt. Bethel Township Fire Company Awarded EMS Grant Funds

Congratulations to the Lower Mt. Bethel Township Fire Company on receiving \$42,900 in emergency service funding to complete various facility upgrades. The funding will go toward the following projects: Replacing flat roof on the original section of the building that was built in 1960. Since the original roof has only seen repairs, it is in desperate need of replacement.

Replacing the exterior metal siding on the original building and on the larger apparatus bay. This is a crucial necessity due to the rusted metal as well as broken fasteners.

Replacing the concrete aprons around the front of their building, which transitions the building floor and the blacktop driveway. These are cracked and worn from age and larger fire equipment use.

Plainfield Township Seeks Public Input on Regulations Regarding the Quality of Fill

Plainfield Township officials are discussing a draft zoning amendment that would assist in carrying out State environmental regulations to prevent the use of contaminated fill. Plainfield Township would not set its own environmental standards for fill, but would require additional local oversight of large fill operations. The draft ordinance would also require professional independent testing of a sampling of large fill operations, if the State did not require testing.

The draft amendment will be discussed at a meeting of the Plainfield Township Environmental Advisory Council on Monday, November 1, 2021 (7:00 PM), at the Plainfield Township Municipal Building, which is located at 6292 Sullivan Trail, Nazareth, PA 18064. The public is invited to attend. There also will be a later public hearing by the Board of Supervisors, before the amendment would be considered for adoption.

Plainfield Township includes dozens of inactive quarries, which are mostly former slate quarries. A goal of this project is to promote returning former quarries to a productive use, but in a way that makes sure that the activity occurs in an environmentally safe manner that will protect groundwater, creeks and public health.

The contamination risks are particularly high in quarries that have water or that are close to the water table or where contaminants could reach groundwater or surface waters. It is much more difficult to address contamination after it occurs, and much more difficult to remove contaminated materials than to dump them.
