



Vegan Diet Can Help Postmenopausal Women With Hot Flashes: Study

Participants Also Lost Around 6.4 Pounds In A 12-Week Study

vegan diet can nearly eradicate hot flashes in postmenopausal women, new research reveals.

Overall, hot flashes were reduced

Overall, hot flashes were reduced by 95 percent, with moderate to severe flashes reducing by 96 percent and severe hot flashes being completely eliminated.

Participants who started the vegan diet also lost around 6.4 pounds in a 12-week study.

These results, from the Physicians Committee for Responsible Medicine in Washington DC, were caused by changes in gut microbiome that come with a low-fat vegan diet.

This lifestyle change can also decrease the risk of developing health problems such as heart disease and type 2 diabetes, as the bacteria that can lead to these issues are less abundant.

Co-author Dr. Hana Kahleova said: "Women who want to fight hot flashes should feed the bacteria in their gut a vegan diet rich in fruits, vegetables, grains, and beans, which also leads to weight loss and protects against heart disease and type 2 diabetes."

This new research, published in the journal Complementary Therapies in Medicine, comes from a secondary analysis of the WAVS trial.

In the study, 84 postmenopausal women reporting two or more moderate-to-severe hot flashes daily were assigned 12 weeks on either a vegan diet or sticking to their usual eating habits.

For the secondary analysis, stool samples from 11 of the participants were used to study changes in gut microbiome.

The study is the first to find reductions in microbes Porphyromonas and Prevotella corporis are associated with a decrease in severe daytime hot flashes.

Prevotella corporis has also been found in the gut of people with rheumatoid arthritis and seems to have pro-inflammatory properties.

Changes in the abundance of other bacteria looked at in the study may play a role in alleviating hot flashes by stabilizing estrogen levels, reducing inflammation, and increasing satiety, among other benefits.





Scientists Solve The Mystery of Red Wine Headaches

Headache Can Occur Within 30 Minutes to 3 Hours After Drinking Small Glass Of Wine.

he reason why drinking red wine can leave you with a sore head has been discovered Researchers have found that a natural compound or flavonol in red wines can interfere with the metabolism of alcohol which leads to a headache.

The team from the University of California, Davis found the flavonol quercetin which is naturally present in all kinds of fruits and vegetables, including grapes.

It's considered a healthy antioxidant and is even available in supplement form. But when mixed with alcohol, it can be problematic.

Professor Andrew Waterhouse said: "When it gets in your bloodstream, your body converts it to a different form called quercetin glucuronide.

"In that form, it blocks the metabolism of alcohol."

They also found that different wines had different amounts of the pain-inducing flavanol depending on how much sunlight the grapes had.

Professor Waterhouse continued: "Quercetin is produced by the grapes in response to sunlight. If you grow grapes with the clusters exposed, such as they do in the Napa Valley for their cabernets, you get much higher levels of quercetin.

"In some cases, it can be four to five times higher."

As a result of consuming this flavanol-filled wine people can accumulate a toxin called acetaldehyde which causes the painful symptom.

Dr. Apramita Devi said: "Acetaldehyde is a well-known toxin, irritant and inflammatory substance.

"Researchers know high levels of acetaldehyde can cause facial flushing, headache and nausea."

Typically, a red wine headache can occur within 30 minutes to three hours after drinking small glass of wine.

Professor Morris Levin said: "We postulate that when susceptible people consume wine with even modest amounts of quercetin, they develop headaches, particularly if they have a preexisting migraine or another primary headache condition.

"We think we are finally on the right track toward explaining this millennia-old mystery.











Most Parents Get Their Parenting Advice From Social Media

Research Shows Social Media Is A Useful Tool For Many Parents

Four out of five parents get their parenting advice from social media, a new shas revealed. In addition, half of the parents studied rated social media as very useful for getting new ideas to try.

University of Michigan Health C.S. Mott Children's Hospital National Poll on Children's Health Codirector Sarah Clark said: "Many parents turn to online communities to exchange advice or discuss parenting challenges because it may seem faster and easier than asking a health professional.

"Finding parent camaraderie in this space can have benefits but parents should keep in mind that every family's experience is different and not everything they hear online may be accurate or the right thing for their child.


The team found that most mothers and more than two-thirds of fathers of children these ages look to social media for parenting advice or to share their experiences, which is a significant increase from their poll in 2015.

The most common discussions included toilet training, kids' sleep, nutrition and breast feeding, discipline, behavior problems, vaccination, day care and preschool, and getting along with other kids.

A few parents said they use these platforms because they don't have family or friends nearby, don't have enough opportunities to ask their child's health care provider or are too embarrassed to ask in person.

More than a third of parents also rate social media as very useful for making them feel like they're not alone.

However, not all parents enjoy this online takeover with almost 80 percent of parents feeling like people overshare on social media by bragging about their child or sharing too often or too much.

Julia Pinter Signs With Wake Forest

Bangor High School's Julia Pinter signed a Letter of Intent Wednesday
afternoon to compete in the Javelin with the Wake Forest Track and
Field team next year in Winston Salem, North Carolina where
she plans to major in Exercise Science.

Her athletic career path, however, wasn't always headed in that direction.

"I played softball up until my 8th grade year and my dad suggested that I should try (javelin)," Pinter said. "So, I came out freshman year, kind of dealt with COVID not having practice, and started throwing. I just stuck with it and I ended up loving it and started doing it more competitively."

Pinter, who also plays soccer and basketball, still finds time to perfect her javelin throw.

"It's kind of just time management and things like that," she said. "I love playing sports, kind of being all around. I love my teammates being out with my friends at the sport. "

When she finds time to work on throwing the javelin, she says that "technique," is the most difficult part of the sport.

That technique, however, has led her to consecutive Colonial League



Merlin Repsher A Fire Fighter For Life

It's safe to say that Merlin Repsher has been a fire fighter in the making most of his life, and therefore not surprising that he is celebrating 60 years of service with the Bangor Fire Department.

Much of his career path has been filled with many memorable experiences that have led him to a satisfying, lifelong experience as a fire fighter. As a child, he lived on Miller Street just a short distance from the Second Ward Fire company in South Bangor. One night, while he and his family were visiting friends on Messinger Street in Bangor, a few blocks from home, they received a call that the A & P (now the Bangor General Store on Broadway) was on fire. He was asked if he wanted to walk "uptown" to see the fire, which was an experience that he would never forget.

His uncle was the fire chief in Cornwall Heights, Bucks County where Repsher recalls him responding to fire calls. "One time he took me to the station and showed me how to operate the siren on one of the fire engines," Repsher said. "He had to lift me up so I could stand on the running board and depress the siren switch with my hands. I kept at it until he lifted me off the running board."



At play in his youth, he fondly

remembers spending time playing with toy fire trucks, and when the fire whistle sounded, he knew that the real fire trucks would be rolling ASAP.

"I guess the bottom line is, from early childhood with my uncle's influence, I (always) wanted to be a fire fighter," he said.

After serving his country with the Air Force, he returned

home and submitted an application

to Rescue Fire Company to

He was accepted into active membership on October 6,1963 to serve a one-year probationary period. Sixty years later, he continues his service to the community as an active fire fighter. During his career he has

served as Chief Engineer of the Pumper for 35 years and was

Assistant Fire Chief for five years. He also served in every position from Fire Recorder to President, except for Trustee.

In 2013 he was given a citation by Matt Cartwright honoring him for 50 years of service, and just a short time ago, he received a similar citation from Ann Flood for 60 years of service.

In 1964, he began attending Northampton County Fire School classes and their monthly business meetings. In 1972, he was elected Treasurer, a position he still holds 51 years later.

Repsher was a PA State Fire Academy Certified Non-Suppression Instructor and Northampton Community College Adjunct Professor, teaching 30-hour classes in Pump Operations as well as a VFIS Certified Emergency Vehicle Driver Training Instructor.

One of the accomplishments which Merlin is most proud of is when he and Anthony Curcio in 1972 introduced the idea of using a new alerting system, where each member had an alerting unit which was activated by Blue Mountain Control Center. This took the place of the pull stations throughout the town which had activated the siren.

He also is well known for his rendition of taps on Veterans Day and Memorial Day.
