

This Day In History

Howard Hughes's "Spruce Goose" flies



The Hughes Flying Boat—at one time the largest aircraft ever built—is piloted by designer Howard Hughes on its first and only flight. Built with laminated birch and spruce (hence the nickname the Spruce Goose) the massive wooden aircraft had a wingspan longer than a football field and was designed to carry more than 700 men to battle.

Howard Hughes was a successful Hollywood movie producer when he founded the Hughes Aircraft Company in 1932. He personally tested cutting-edge aircraft of his own design and in 1937 broke the transcontinental flight-time record. In 1938, he flew around the world in a record three days, 19 hours, and 14 minutes.

Following the U.S. entrance into World War II in 1941, the U.S. government commissioned the Hughes Aircraft Company to build a

large flying boat capable of carrying men and materials over long distances. The concept for what would become the "Spruce Goose" was originally conceived by the industrialist Henry Kaiser, but Kaiser dropped out of the project early, leaving Hughes and his small team to make the H-4 a reality.



Brady Ferguson's Cancer Benefit



Brady Ferguson's Cancer Benefit will be held at Chelsea Sun Inn, 487 Stone Church Road, Mt Bethel, Wednesday, November 9, 2022 At 5 pm – 10 pm

On October 19, 2021, we noticed a lump on Brady's neck, almost the size of a tennis ball. I took him to the Monroe ER, where they did a CT Scan. The results were that there was a mass pressing against his trachea and causing his windpipe to almost close. Nothing prepares you for the moment when a doctor comes up to you to say that your kid, will be transported by helicopter(by himself -without anyone he knows) to Children's Hospital of Philadelphiatwo hours away from you!!! We were all terrified. My husband and I drove to Philly and met Brady in a room in the ER. We stayed at CHOP for 21 days. The biopsy results were that was diagnosed with a rare form of cancer called NTRK Spindle Cell Neoplasm. Brady is on a pill form of chemo that he takes at home twice a day. It gives him chemo withdrawal- his whole body aches, sometimes to the point where he can't move, and also has gained weight from it. The chemo doesn't make him get sick or lose his hair.

They have to go to CHOP at least once a month for his bloodwork and chemo refill. Sometimes we have to go twice a month for scans, and sometimes three times a month for new doctors that come with childhood cancer.

They are having this benefit to raise money to help with medical expenses.



Hearts From Donors Who Died With Covid-19 Can Be Used In Transplants

Hearts from donors who died with COVID-19 can still be safely used in transplants, according to new research.

A study of dozens of recipients found they are as safe as ones from people without the virus.

Lead author Samuel Kim said: "These findings suggest we may be able to be more aggressive about accepting donors when patients are in dire need of an organ for heart transplantation."

They are based on the first 84 people to be given hearts from COVID-19-positive donors.

There was no increase in mortality or complications.

What is more, none died from respiratory causes or infections. The researchers were surprised by the results.

Kim, a medical student at the University of California, Los Angeles, said: "Specifically, we thought death from respiratory or lung-related causes would be a problem among recipients receiving donor hearts with COVID-19.

"Yet, we found no such differences, and in fact, this study offers early evidence COVID-19-positive donor hearts may be as safe as hearts without COVID-19 for heart transplantation."

The NHS says there are no confirmed cases of transmission through organ donation.

But if someone has the coronavirus they will not be able to donate. Demand for heart transplants has doubled in the past 30 years. In the UK, hundreds are on the waiting list.

Organ donations plunged by almost a third during the pandemic owing to many potential candidates dying in the community rather than in the hospital.Kim said: "Despite the increased need for this operation, there is a continued shortage of available donor organs for people in need of transplantation.

"The pandemic made things worse with an increased rate of donors testing positive for COVID-19, which generally renders the donors unsuitable for transplantation.

"However, several academic centers have started to use COVID-19-positive donor hearts for transplantation in recent months and have reported good results."

Kim's team analyzed data from the United Network for Organ Sharing, looking at all 3,289 adult heart transplants in the US from February 2021 to March 2022.

Death rates in the hospital and within 30 days of the procedure were similar for both groups.

There was also no significant difference in problems such as graft failure, where the body rejects the new organ, and lung conditions.

The average hospital stay for those receiving a COVID-19-positive donor heart was 15 days - against 17 days for patients whose donor did not have the virus.

More than 96 percent of the former survived the first 30 days - almost exactly the same as the latter.

None of the four deaths were linked to COVID-19. Organ rejection occurred in less than two and a half percent, and one percent, respectively.

Professor Eldrin Lewis, a heart transplant specialist at Stanford University, California, who was not involved in the study, said: "These findings provide evidence outcomes were similar at 30 days post-transplant among patients who received COVID-19-positive donor hearts, so the potential risks appear to be lower than expected."





Vaughn Telepo Earns Scouting's Highest Rank During A Moving Ceremony

Vaughn Telepo of Bangor became an Eagle Scout recently during a ceremony held at the Dyle E. Bray Home Association. If you ever have the opportunity to watch an Eagle Scout induction ceremony, officially known as an Eagle Scout Court of Honor, don't pass up the chance.

It's a moving experience that incorporates all that is good and honorable and something all of us should aspire to be.

Eagle Scout is the highest achievement or rank attainable in the Scouts BSA program of the Boy Scouts of America. Since its inception in 1911, only four percent of scouts have earned this rank after a lengthy review process. The Eagle Scout rank has been earned by over 2.5 million youth

Becoming an Eagle is not automatic, nor does one become an Eagle with a snap of the fingers or the wink of an eye. It takes time, hard work, perseverance, and dedication to get there.

Scouts are required to earn all the ranks in order, starting with Scout. The following is a list of the activities the Scout will complete on their journey to Eagle Scout:

- Be active in the troop for at least six months as a Life Scout
- Show dedication to Scout Oath and Scout Law3
- Provide references from family, work, church, and other community groups
- Earn 21 merit badges
- Serve a minimum of six months in a leadership position



• Propose, plan, and carry out an Eagle service project

• Attend a Scoutmaster conference

• Pass a board of review

Earning the rank of Life Scout is an important milestone. The scout is encouraged to think about the symbol of the heart. Historically in scouting, it was a fitting symbol of health and





BANGOR STURS NORTHWESTERN 27-21

It's that time of the year when football teams need crucial wins to stay in the playoff hunt. To do that they need big plays at the right time.

While the Slaters' vaunted rushing attack (37-236) was in good form Friday in New Tripoli versus powerful Northwestern, it was Bangor's defense that made the difference cashing in on a pair of crucial turnovers, one for a touchdown and the other to seal a hard-fought win.

The Slaters which hadn't beaten the Tigers since a 22-20 win in 2017, scored first and never trailed improving their record to 6-2.

Bangor scored first after stopping Northwestern at the their own 25. From here, Bangor drove 75 yards in 14 plays, scoring on Eric Striba's 2-yard run. M.J. Siu's PAT gave the Slaters a 7-0 lead. It was reported that Bangor converted two third downs and a fourth down in the series consuming more than seven minutes.

The Tigers came back with a nine-play, 64-yard drive finished by Dalton Clymer with a 6-yard scoring run to tie the score at 7-7.

Moments later, the Slaters' speedy Noah Hillis put Bangor back on top with a 61-yard run. Siu's PAT gave the Slaters a 14-7 lead. Clymer then evened the score after a ten-play drive to make the score 14-14 at half.

That score held through the third quarter as a game filled with offense became a defensive tug of war.

The Slaters' Alex Farensbach, however, broke the deadlock when he picked up a Tiger fumble and raced 64 yards giving Bangor a 21-14 lead

after Siu's third consecutive PAT with 11:48 left in the game.

After the Tigers evened the score at 21-21, Striba's 3-yard touchdown run with 3 minutes, 20 seconds left gave the Slaters the lead. Striba then sealed the deal when he hit Tigers' QB Cade Christopher forcing a fumble that Riley Stapp pounced on with 44 seconds left to preserve a 27-21 win.

Bangor (6-2) will host Blue Mountain (5-3) next week and will then close out the regular season in the 103rd renewal of the Slate Belt Rivalry at Pen Argyl. Depending on circumstances the Slaters may then qualify for the District 4A playoffs.
