

Will Your Smartphone Survive a 6-Foot Drop?

(StatePoint) Despite space age materials Pixel Fold survived two main screen-down and hefty price tags, today's top-of-the-line smartphones are still prone to damage, and consumers without protection plans are facing sticker shock at repair shops.

In fact, all three of the biggest U.S. smartphone brands, Apple, Samsung and Google, have introduced devices with price tags well north of \$1,000. But enjoying the advanced capabilities these devices bring could come with financial risk: According to the Allstate Protection Plans 2023

Mobile Damage Survey, 93 million Americans have damaged a smartphone in the past 12 months, collectively spending \$17.4 billion on repairs and replacements. Meanwhile, 47% of Americans think that smartphone repairs cost \$150 or less, yet the average cost for repairs and replacements was \$209. For premium phones, those costs are much higher.

To test the durability of today's premium devices, Allstate Protection Plans put four smartphones through its Drop and Dunk Tests at the same time: Apple iPhone 15 Pro Max (starts at \$1,199), Samsung Galaxy S23 Ultra (starts at \$1,199), Samsung Galaxy Z Fold5 (starts at \$1,799), and Google Pixel Fold (starts at \$1,799).

While all of the devices survived the Dunk Test (30 mins under six feet of water), all were damaged after a single 6-foot drop onto a sidewalk. The video of the tests, found on Allstate Protection Plan's YouTube channel, reveals:

- Front Screen-Down Drop Tests: Both the Apple iPhone 15 Pro Max and Samsung Galaxy S23 Ultra shattered on their first facedown drop from six feet onto a sidewalk and were unusable, suffering raised and loose functional. glass.

drops from six feet onto a sidewalk with only minor frame damage, corner scuffing and small screen dents. Both were fully

test from six feet. The S23 Ultra was still fully functional but was only safe to handle when in a case covering its back panel. The iPhone 15 Pro Max was fully functional except for its main camera and ultra-wide angle camera, which were shattered, and was only safe to handle when in a case that covered its back panel.


• Outer Screen-Down Drop Tests: Both the Samsung Galaxy Z Fold5 and the Google Pixel Fold shattered on their first outer screen-down drop from six feet onto a sidewalk. Both outer screens were unusable. Both Fold phones main screens were still fully functional but were only safe to handle when the outer screen panel was not in contact with skin.

"Unfortunately, there is no premium device on the market that is tough enough to survive a drop totally unscathed. That's especially troubling considering that nearly half of Americans vastly underestimate repair costs," says Jason Siciliano, vice president of marketing and global creative director at Allstate Protection Plans. "That said, it looks like we may be retiring our Dunk Test. Liquid damage was once a leading cause of smartphone repairs and replacements. Today, it doesn't rank in the top five."

Despite the costs involved, 27% of Americans who crack a screen have it replaced in one day or less. Given that 45% of Americans use their phones for five or more hours daily, Allstate Protection Plans advises fortifying these devices, so central to our lives, with a protective case and screen protector. 

New Hope For Migraine Sufferers

Migraine sufferers have been offered fresh hope after research discovered potential new ways of treating the debilitating headaches.

Around one in five women, one in 16 men, and one in 11 children have regular migraines - with attacks three times more prevalent in women.

Now, an international study of the genetics of migraine has provided new insights into the biology behind the attacks.

Scientists say it will enable detection of rare variants protecting against migraine, opening an avenue for new drugs to treat the problem.

An international team of researchers, led by deCODE Genetics in Iceland, analyzed genetic data from more than 1.3 million participants of which 80,000 had migraine.

The scientists focused on detecting sequence variants associated with the two main subtypes of migraine: migraine with aura - often referred to as "classical migraine" - and migraine without aura.

The results highlight several genes that affect one of the migraine subtypes over the other, and point to new biological pathways that could be targeted for therapeutic developments

Although recent advances have been made in studies of the genetics and underlying biology of migraine and new treatments recently developed that are effective for many migraine sufferers, they do not work for all types of migraine.

Professor Kari Stefansson said: "Four novel migraines with aura associations were revealed and 13 variants associated primarily with migraine without aura.

"Of particular interest were three rare variants with large effects pointing to distinct pathologies underlying different types of migraine.

Is Taking Care Of Your Pet More Stressful Than Being A Parent? Two In Three Pet Owners Think About Their Pet Aging As Much As Themselves

Taking care of your pet is more stressful than managing a romantic relationship or being a parent, new research suggests.

That's according to a survey of 2,000 pet owners, which found people are more stressed about their ability to care for their fur pal (42%) than their relationship with a partner (37%) or their kids (30%).

That may be because over half (51%) think their fur pals are also experiencing stress.

When asked what would help their pet feel calmer, their human companions noted spending more time outside (47%), connecting with other pets (46%), spending more time with them (44%) and a pet therapist (43%) as potential solutions.

Conducted by OnePoll on behalf of ElleVet Sciences for Pet Wellness Month, the survey also found people think about their pet aging as much as they think about getting older themselves (65% each).

Pet parents think they can identify the signs their pet is slowing down, such as if their pet lacks energy (56%), no longer enjoys their favorite activities (54%) and has difficulty scaling stairs (51%).

Similarly, people pointed to lack of energy (60%), joint soreness (48%) and not enjoying the things they usually do (48%) as signs they, too, are getting older.

People's top three worries about their pet's health are digestion (37%), the inability to play and enjoy life (37%) and their pet's heart health (33%).

When it comes to their own health, people's concerns include not being able to enjoy sports or activities without fear of injury (39%), their heart health (38%) and digestion (37%).

Over two-thirds (68%) of pet parents said watching their pet age and suffer would be very hurtful for them, more so than losing an expensive item (62%), losing their job (61%) and divorcing or breaking up with a partner (61%).

Many grew up with a pet and still cherish those memories, thinking about their childhood fur pal more than three times a week, or about 180 times a year.

Many of the paintings on display during Sunday's open house were done by John T. Koshinski, landscape painter and sculptor.


According to his autobiography he says, "I've lived my entire life in the Mud Run Valley where from the earliest years, the diverse flora, fauna and landforms of the eastern forests, streams and meadows were my constant companions and the subjects of study on many levels. To a large extent this has been the inspirational source of my artwork. I began as a sculptor working in stone, wood and cast materials. I spent ten years making my living doing architectural carvings in wood. Eventually I devoted myself more and more to my greatest love which was depicting the landscape in oils and acrylics."

In 1864 a cornerstone was laid for a small rural church outside the village of Martins Creek, Pennsylvania, known today as Three Church Hill.

Over the next 150 years America would experience cataclysmic changes both in industry and lifestyle. Through drought, depression and two World Wars the Trinity Lutheran church stood as a steady sheltering place for both worship and community. Beneath the church's simple wooden rafters, weddings took place, births were celebrated, and funerals were held.

In 1958 the combined congregations of Trinity and Mt. Zion adopted the name of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church.

The church is located at 2804 Church Road, Martins Creek.

Homeowners Find Bugs & Pests Every Week

When bugs or pests cross their path, one in 10 Americans enter "exterminator mode" faster than you can say "buzz off."

More specifically, according to a new survey of 2,000 homeowners or renters with a yard or lawn, 15% of respondents will squish a bug regardless of where they see it — inside or outside.

That number is higher when looking at indoor squishers — 43% said if bugs or pests are found inside their home, only then would they kill it. A third (32%) will do the same solely to bugs they see outside.

The average homeowner encounters a bug or pest about five times per week, both inside and outside their home.

Conducted by OnePoll on behalf of TruGreen, results revealed that more than half (56%) feel frustrated when they find a bug or pest in their home. Others feel scared (39%), disgusted (39%) or anxious (39%).

Still, 22% would rather call in a professional or get someone else to squish it for them. Only 17% would swat it, and 12% feel it is their duty to release them back to nature.

But when they step outside, many others said they'd either ignore it (19%) or do some research on what type of bug or pest it is (18%).

Results revealed that more than half (56%) base their decision on whether or not to squish on what the bug or pest looks like. Just as many (56%) will contemplate the harm creepy crawlers could cause their kids and pets or worry about damage they could cause to their home (50%).

But everyone has their limits. Offenses from beetles (43%), centipedes (42%), cockroaches (42%), mosquitoes (21%) and spiders (16%) force respondents to take action when inside the home.

Outside, many respondents will squish or remove centipedes (39%), beetles (38%), bees (36%), and cockroaches (34%).

As unveiled by respondents, the worst-case scenarios for encountering a bug or pest in your home include cooking in the kitchen (24%), getting ready to go to sleep (23%), relaxing in the living room (16%) and even while taking a shower (12%).

Almost half (49%) of respondents have had a memorable, or unpleasant, bug/pest experience. Those include "being bitten by fire ants outside my home," "ate my garden," and even "(an) ant bit me when I was taking my shower."

When asked about common bug or pest misconceptions, it's clear that misinformation is still circulating. Almost half (48%) of respondents think it's true that bugs or pests won't come inside a clean home.

Four in 10 even believe the age-old myth that the average person swallows eight spiders in their sleep over their lifetime to be true.

More than two-thirds of respondents (68%) said they would hire a professional for bug or pest issues and concerns.
