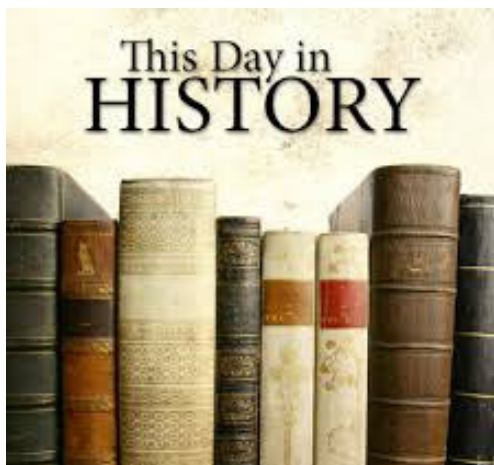

This Day In History

Entrance To King Tut's Tomb Discovered



British archaeologist Howard Carter and his workmen discover a step leading to the tomb of King Tutankhamen in the Valley of the Kings in Egypt on November 4, 1922.

When Carter first arrived in Egypt in 1891, most of the ancient Egyptian tombs had been discovered, though the little-known King Tutankhamen, who had died when he was 18, was still unaccounted for. After World War I, Carter began an intensive search for "King Tut's Tomb," finally finding steps to the burial room hidden in the debris near the entrance of the nearby tomb of King Ramses VI in the Valley of the Kings. On November 26, 1922, Carter and fellow archaeologist Lord Carnarvon entered the interior chambers of the tomb, finding them miraculously intact.

Thus began a monumental excavation process in which Carter carefully explored the four-room tomb over several years, uncovering an incredible collection of several thousand objects. The most splendid architectural find was a stone sarcophagus containing three coffins nested within each other.

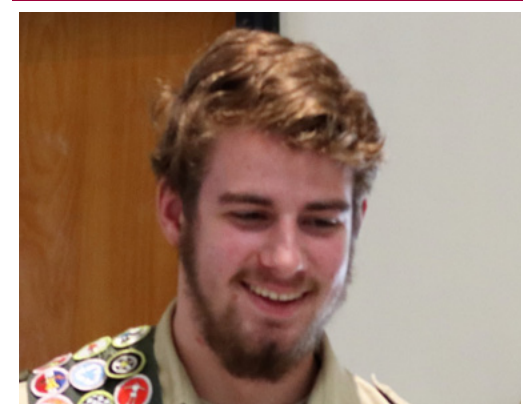

Brady Ferguson's Cancer Benefit



Brady Ferguson's Cancer Benefit will be held at Chelsea Sun Inn, 487 Stone Church Road, Mt Bethel, Wednesday, November 9, 2022 At 5 pm – 10 pm

On October 19, 2021, they noticed a lump on Brady's neck, almost the size of a tennis ball. I took him to the Monroe ER, where they did a CT Scan. The results were that there was a mass pressing against his trachea and causing his windpipe to almost close. Nothing prepares you for the moment when a doctor comes up to you to say that your kid, will be transported by helicopter (by himself -without anyone he knows) to Children's Hospital of Philadelphia- two hours away from you!!! We were all terrified. My husband and I drove to Philly and met Brady in a room in the ER. We stayed at CHOP for 21 days. The biopsy results were that was diagnosed with a rare form of cancer called NTRK Spindle Cell Neoplasm. Brady is on a pill form of chemo that he takes at home twice a day. It gives him chemo withdrawal- his whole body aches, sometimes to the point where he can't move, and also has gained weight from it. The chemo doesn't make him get sick or lose his hair.

They have to go to CHOP at least once a month for his bloodwork and chemo refill. Sometimes we have to go twice a month for scans, and sometimes three times a month for new doctors that come with childhood cancer.

They are having this benefit to raise money to help with medical expenses.

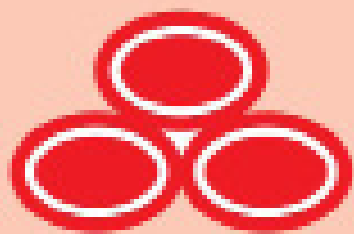

Wife Rents Out Her Husband To Do Odd Jobs And Business Is Booming

A mom who decided to rent out her husband to other women to do odd jobs for £40 a time said business is booming - and he's fully booked for weeks.

Mom-of-three Laura Young, 38, got the idea from a podcast describing how a man was making a living putting together flatpack furniture for other people.

She advertised on Facebook and the Nextdoor app, boasting of her husband James' general DIY, painting, decorating, tiling and carpet laying skills, in June.

Expecting she might get a few giggles, the 42-year-old had his first client in a day and was soon working SIX days a week from 9 am to 8 pm.

He's been forced to turn down jobs and "Rent My Handy Husband" is now fully booked until mid-November.

Jobs include helping with putting up a TV or curtains to rebuilding a wall, and he is available to hire anyone who needs help - men and women.

While James handles the labor side of things, Laura works on running the social accounts and website.

The business has been more successful than the couple could've imagined. The savvy couple has added a new service for the Holiday season, offering installations of festive lights, both inside and outside.

Laura said: "I never expected it to take off as much as it has.

"We've only been going four months and it got to a point where there was so

much work coming in that James was working six days a week.

"We've had to start turning jobs down and reduce our hours, so now we do Monday to Friday 9 am-5 pm.

"James had to give up his job working in a warehouse to be a full-time care-giver alongside Laura, looking after their three children, two of which have autism.

James was also diagnosed as autistic himself four years ago and has always been able to focus on things like building and construction.

Laura said: "He's really good at building things and doesn't bother with the instructions.

"So I thought this would be something he could do.

"James doesn't come from a trade background but his grandad was a nuclear engineer, and they think he was also on the spectrum.

"He's got a very methodical mind and can think outside the box. He sees things differently."

Within days, Laura's

Facebook messages were full of people enquiring about her husband's handiwork.

The couple from Milton Keynes, Bucks, even had requests for over 150 miles away.

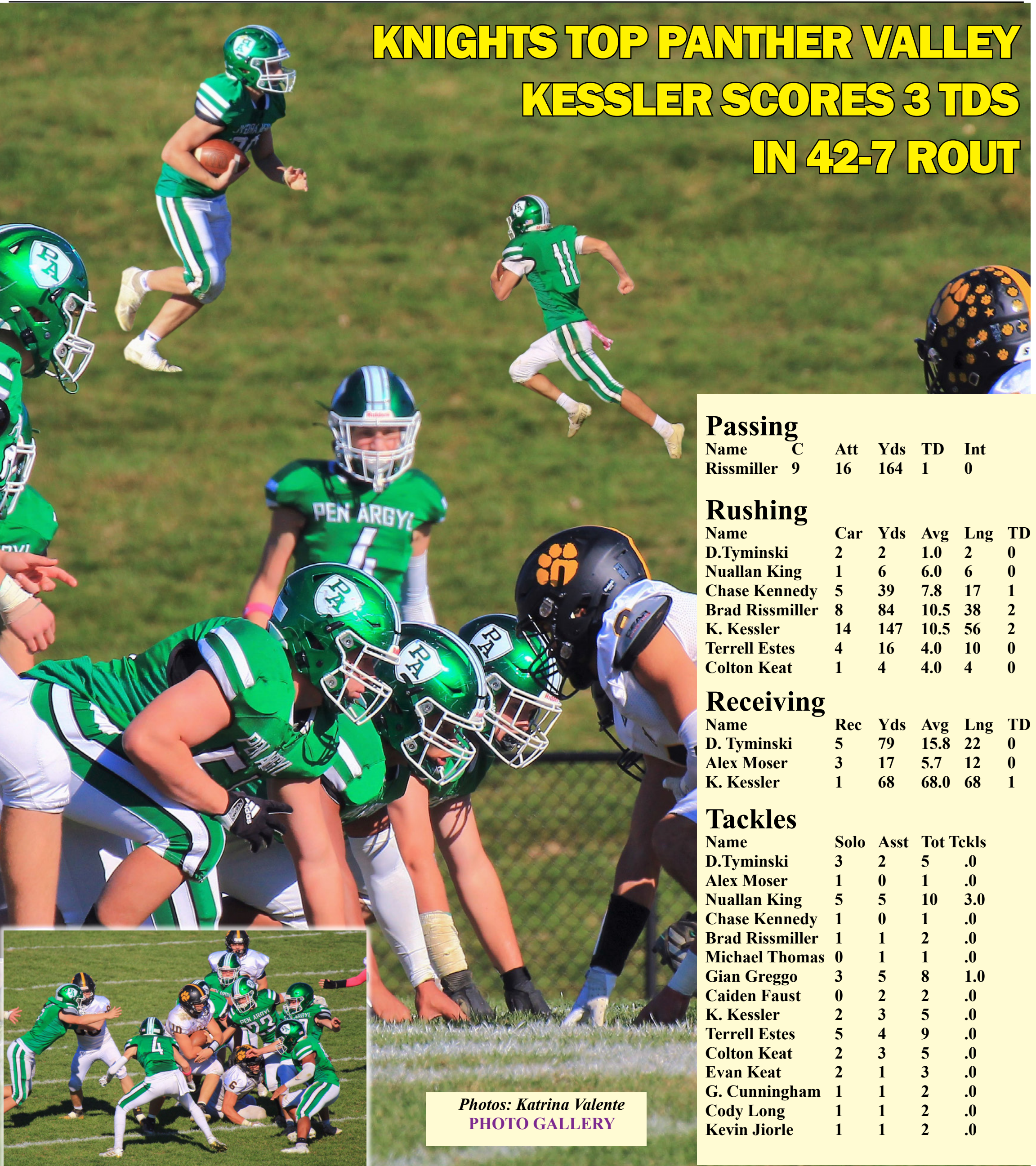

Eagle Scout is the highest achievement or rank attainable in the Scouts BSA program of the Boy Scouts of America. Since its inception in 1911, only four percent of scouts have earned this rank after a lengthy review process. The Eagle Scout rank has been earned by over 2.5 million youth

Becoming an Eagle is not automatic, nor does one become an Eagle with a snap of the fingers or the wink of an eye. It takes time, hard work, perseverance, and dedication to get there.

Scouts are required to earn all the ranks in order, starting with Scout. The following is a list of the activities the Scout will complete on their journey to Eagle Scout:

- **Be active in the troop for at least six months as a Life Scout**
- **Show dedication to Scout Oath and Scout Law**
- **Provide references from family, work, church, and other community groups**
- **Earn 21 merit badges**
- **Serve a minimum of six months in a leadership position**

- **Propose, plan, and carry out an Eagle service project**
- **Attend a Scoutmaster conference**
- **Pass a board of review**

Earning the rank of Life Scout is an important milestone. The scout is encouraged to think about the symbol of the heart. Historically in scouting, it was a fitting symbol of health and fitness, but it also represents the spirit of caring and giving that is behind the Eagle Scout service project.

Service to other people is what scouting is all about. In many ways, the service project reflects who the scout is as a youth leader. The result should be of significant impact in the community to be special, and should represent the scout's very best effort.

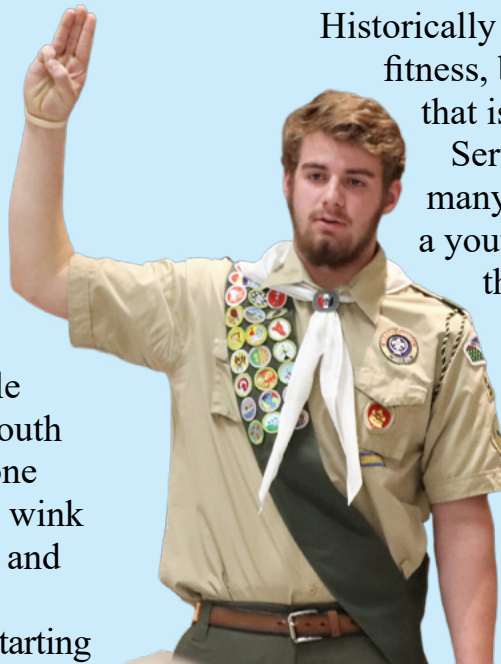
Telepo's service project was the recent refurbishing of the front entrance of the Dyle E. Bray Post Home Association formerly known as the Bangor VFW.

Now in its fourth year, the program directed by Emily Keggan, Amy Jo Tocket, Jen Giera and a staff of 16 field hockey moms, the popularity of the program has grown.

“Our Current Goals of UMBT Field Hockey are to create a fun environment for the female youth in the Slate Belt Region,” said Emily Keggan, they (also) can learn the sport of field hockey, make friendships while working as a team, gain good sportsmanship through the ups and downs, treat others with kindness and encouragement, as well as build self-confidence as they fall in love with field hockey.”

“The long-term goal is to provide a feeder program for local middle and high school programs and build a collaborative program with local schools and colleges.”

Many of the children are in their early years of competitive athletics, and while the goal of a game is to score more goals than your opponent, there’s more than wins and losses

“We help guide the girls in practicing good sportsmanship regardless if we’ve won or lost the game. Everyone can learn something to improve themselves as an athlete and human being,” Keggan said. “Our Field Players run to their Goalies to bring them in from the cage after a game has wrapped up. Despite the score, each team celebrates with a little snack, provided by our players’ families. At the beginning of our Monday night practice, we gather all of the players to recognize the players who had the opportunity to score a goal during ‘Sunday’s games.

“And at the end of the season, we’ll hold our ‘Glow in the Dark’ End of the Season Celebration & Award Ceremony, where our athletes will decorate their sticks, clothes and themselves with neon and glow-in-the-dark embellishments & we recognize each player & coach for their contribution during the season.”

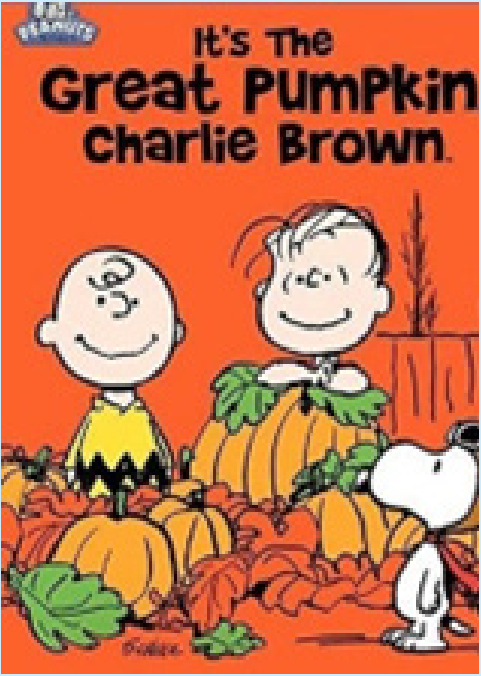
