"Aonghus was an amazing student who embodied our Code of the Green Knights perfectly," PAHS Principal David Domchek said. "He was the quintessential example of what we've tried to teach our students. He would go out of his way to be kind in the world, and he impacted many people because of it."

Aonghus was a kind and dedicated student, spending a lot of his free time to develop his hobbies. He taught himself computer aided design to further his interests with 3D printing, and also loved making improvements to his truck. He was an avid lover of all things Marvel, Star Wars, and country music, and was often seen wearing a kilt in public. Most importantly, he was a huge family guy, taking pride in being an uncle and generally spending quality time with his family. Aonghus left a positive impact on Pen Argyl High School and was often a source of positivity in everyone's day.

"I remember going to school with him," Vincent Reto, sophomore, said. "He was a grade above me, but we were still friends. He was such a nice kid, always smiling, and everyone loved him. He loved building stuff, and I remember just listening to him talk about his truck and getting really excited."

"I met Aonghus as a freshman," Emily Cooper, sophomore, said. "I was alone because most of my friends were virtual due to COVID, and it was one of my first days in school. He stopped me and showed me where to go. We were late, but he took the time to show me where every single one of my classes were."

"Even though we weren't super close, he would talk to me a lot," Cooper continued. "I know he was involved in the school a lot and was a part of a lot of clubs. Everyone was always laughing with him, and he was just a super sweet person."

"Our dads were very close friends growing up, so I have known him since we were very young,"



Mia Einfalt, junior, said. "I didn't get to see him much as we began to grow older, but we shared so many memories as children. Aonghus was the most kind-hearted person you would have ever met, doing anything to make someone's day. He always had a smile on his face and knew how to put a smile on someone else's face."

"Aonghus didn't care what other people thought of him or how they looked at him," she continued. "He wasn't afraid to show up in a kilt to the grocery store or express himself."

"I started talking to Aonghus when we had a few classes together," Andrea Black, junior, said. "He always had a smile on his face and was always making new friends. If someone needed help, he would try the best that he could to help. He would cheer people up and make them giggle when they were down. He was overall such a great person to be around."

On Thursday, October 14th, students at Pen Argyl Area High School wore Hawaiian and Marvel shirts to remember their friend in bright colors with a smile. While they miss having Aonghus here with them, he will always be remembered as one of their truest Green Knights and will forever live on in their hearts.

Pen Argyl star runner Sarah Pezzino has done it again at the latest Colonial League Cross Country Meet. For the first time in 30 years, Pen Argyl crowned a Colonial League Champion after Pezzino ran a time of 19:54. Now, Pezzino will be competing in the upcoming District meet.

"Winning the Colonial League Championship was very exciting!" Pezzino said. "I was beyond thrilled with my placement because it was a goal I set for myself at the start. It was a lot of training with my coaches and dedication to the sport to get it done."

Pezzino, of course, never settles for good enough. She has already started her training for Districts and has an even bigger goal set for the next meet.

Preparation so far is me staying focused on my training, getting proper fuel, and sleep," Pezzino said. "I am looking to improve my time from both last year's meet and/or beating my Colonial League Meets time."

"The next biggest step in my running career is to stay focused on my training, keep running, and compete at the collegiate level," Pezzino continued. "My final goal for this season is to be in the top 10 for Districts."

# **Slaters - Pottsville Game Tonight Could Affect Post Season Play**

Bangor's game with Pottsville tonight at Paul Farnan Field could have a significant impact on the Slaters' hopes for post season play. Bangor, according to the Eastern Conference Football website, has already qualified for a berth in the Eastern Conference championship game.

The Slaters are also ranked fifth just behind Wilson in PIAA District XI 4A. Pottsville is third, non-border school Allentown Central Catholic is second, and undefeated Northwestern is first.

Pottsville has a 6-2 record coming into the game with their only losses coming at the hands of Northwestern and Wyomissing. In addition to Bangor, Pottsville also needs to play undefeated North Schuylkill to finish regular season play.

Bangor junior quarterback Eric Striba became only the 11th player in Bangor football history to rush for more than a 1,000 yards in a season when he reached that mark during a 37-6 win over Wilson last Saturday. The last player to reach that mark was Garrett DeBoer who rushed for 1293 yards in 2018. Striba has 1016 with at least two, and possibly three games remaining. Kael Godshalk has rushed for 777 yards this year in 140 carries and has a career total of 1,377 yards.

As a team, Bangor has scored 284 points in eight games for a 35.5ppg average. The 1997 team holds the all-time record with 372 points in 12 games for a 31.0 ppg average.

Defensively, Greg Campbell leads the team in tackles with 54 and Jacob Weaver leads in sacks with nine, recording four sacks last Saturday during Bangor's 37-6 win over Wilson.

#### **Extra Points:**

- Bangor has only played Pottsville twice before, losing 54-14 in the PIAA District AAA playoff in 2018 and losing 35-13 in the Eastern Conference first round in 2013.
- Bangor's game with Wilson was the 99th in the series which is the second most in Bangor Football History. Bangor and Pen Argyl will play next Friday in the series' 102nd game.
- The Eastern Conference championship games will be either Nov. 4, Nov. 5 or Nov. 6.
