
First Cupcake Made in 1776

Cupcakes can be traced back to 1796 when a recipe notation of "a cake to be baked in small cups" was written in American Cookery, by Amelia Simmons. The earliest known documentation of the term cupcake was in 1828 in Seventy-five Receipts for Pastry, Cakes, and Sweetmeats in Eliza Leslie's Receipts cookbook.

New Research Reveals Our Pets' Top Love Languages

An Astounding 95% Of Pet Owners Believe Pets Know How Much They Love Them

by Talker Research

The way to your pet's heart is not only through toys and treats — half of pet parents say physical touch is their furry friend's love language.

A survey of 2,000 cat and dog owners found that between petting them (83%), giving them hugs (62%) and kisses (55%), respondents are speaking their pet's love language.

The next most popular pet love language is quality time (27%), which includes letting their four-legged friend sleep in their bed (62%) and bringing their pet along when they can (40%).

Conducted by OnePoll on behalf of Nulo pet food, the survey also discovered that food still speaks to pets, and that their parents aim to provide them with high-quality meals (53%), prioritize their health and nutrition (47%) and add variety to their diet (32%).

Pet parents take showing affection seriously — an astounding 95% of pet owners believe that their pet knows how much they love them.

Almost two-thirds (62%) of pet owners believe that they share the same love language with their pet.

In return, pet parent respondents are on the receiving end of affection in the form of their pet following them around all day (65%), sleeping next to them in bed (58%), giving kisses (48%) and playing with either them or their toys (47%).

Almost half (47%) of pet owners believe that their pet views them as a best friend and 42% agree that they see their pet in the same way.


Others love their pet as if they were their own and see them as a child (38%), while 37% of respondents believe that their pet sees them as a parent.

In fact, this love runs so deep that seven in 10 (69%) of respondents would sacrifice their own diet to provide better quality food for their pet.

Currently, 87% believe that their pet is enthusiastic about their diet, and they've been feeding it to them for an average of three years.

But if respondents were in their pet's shoes, about half (48%) believe they'd only be able to survive eating the same meal every day, multiple times a day for a maximum of three months.

"With 69% of respondents willing to put their pet's dietary needs before their own, the data clearly shows just how important a role pets play in their people's lives," said Heather Acuff, Ph.D., Nulo's Director of Research & Development. "Not only are pet parents speaking their pet's love language, they're going above and beyond to provide optimum care and nutrition to ensure the healthiest and happiest lives for their pets."



Climate Change Helps Make Better Wine

Warm Summers And Wet Winters Perfect Combo For Growing Good Grapes: New Study.

Climate change could make better wine, suggests new research.

Warm summers and wet winters are the perfect combo for growing good grapes, according to the study.

And climate change could make the perfect conditions more frequent, likely improving the quality of wine in Bordeaux.

University of Oxford researchers compared 50 years of wine critic scores for Bordeaux bottles with the weather in the region that year.

Wines from the area in southwest France appear to have improved in quality between 1950 and 2020.

The team found high-quality wine was grown in cooler, wetter winters and warmer, wetter springs. As well as hot, dry summers and cool, dry autumns.

Andrew Wood, University of Oxford, said: "Weather drives wine quality and wine taste.

"We found evidence that temperature and precipitation effects occur throughout the year—from bud break, while the grapes are growing and maturing, during harvesting, and even overwinter when the plant is dormant.

"Perennial crops like grapes are there all the time, and so things that happen outside of the growing season can also impact the wine.

"The trend, whether that's driven by the preferences of wine critics or the general population, is that people generally prefer stronger wines which age for longer and give you richer, more intense flavors, higher sweetness, and lower acidity.

"And with climate change—generally, we are seeing a trend across the world that with greater warming, wines are getting stronger.

"With the predicted climates of the future, given that we are more likely to see these patterns of warmer weather and less rainfall during the summer and more rainfall during the winter, the wines are likely to continue to get better into the future.

"The problem in scenarios where it gets really hot is water. If plants don't have enough, they eventually fail, and when they fail, you lose everything.

Study Confirms That Childhood Is The Happiest Time Of Our Lives

Positive Emotional States Declined From Age Nine To 94.

Childhood really is the happiest time of our lives with satisfaction levels declining after the age of nine, a new study reveals.

Psychologists looked at three markers, life satisfaction, positive emotional states and negative emotional states.

Positive emotional states declined from age nine to 94. Negative emotional states fluctuated slightly between ages nine and 22, then declined until age 60 and then increased once again.

However, life satisfaction decreased between the ages of nine and 16, then increased slightly until the age of 70, and then decreased once again until the age of 96.

The team from the Ruhr-University Bochum in Germany examined trends in subjective well-being over the lifespan based on 443 samples from longitudinal studies with a total of 460,902 participants.

Professor Susanne Bücker said: "We focused on changes in three central components of subjective well-being, life satisfaction, positive emotional states and negative emotional states."

The researchers identified greater average changes in positive and negative emotional states than in life satisfaction.

Bücker added: "Overall, the study indicated a positive trend over a wide period of life, if we look at life satisfaction and negative emotional states."

The researchers attribute the slight decline in life satisfaction between the ages of nine and 16 to, for example, changes to the body and to the social life that take place during puberty.

Satisfaction rises again from young adulthood onwards. Positive feelings tend to decrease from childhood to late adulthood.

In very late adulthood, all components of subjective well-being tended to worsen rather than improve.

She added: "This could be related to the fact that in very old people, physical performance decreases, health often deteriorates, and social contacts diminish; not least because their peers pass away."

The study highlights the need to consider and promote subjective well-being with its various components across the lifespan.

The findings, published in the journal Psychological Bulletin, could provide significant guidance for the development of intervention programs, especially those aimed at maintaining or improving subjective well-being late in life.
