

Pen Argyl - Albright Connection

when he was just 17.

After graduation from the Pen Argvl High School. Eldred Miller spent many months in France as a U. S. Marine, before enrolling at Albright. Once there, he became the captain of the football team and (in 1924) was "conceded to be the best all-around athlete at Albright."

He also was ".... a flashy guard in basketball, and far outscored opposing forwards." He was described as a "dependable" outfielder, with the baseball team, and like Hoffman a few years earlier, lettered in three sports.

Miller scored five touchdowns in a game versus Schuylkill Seminary in 1922. He also returned a kick-off for a touchdown, one of only 14 players in the country to accomplish the fete that year. "Deddy" as he was known, also dropkicked several extra points, which were called goals in the old days. (A dropkick is dropping the ball point down and kicking it when it touched the ground.)

"According to the Allentown Democrat, "....(with) Miller's triple threat he should have gone to a bigger school (and) he can pass with either hand." Off the field his "pleasing tenor voice" was an asset to the school's Boys Glee Club. During and after college he was an outfielder for the Pen Argyl A.A. and Pen Argyl YMCA baseball teams for several years.

After graduation he took a job in Altoona and then moved several times finally landing in Norristown where he eventually married circa 1940.

Miller's co-captain at Albright was Harry "Gook" Saltern a 6-foot 200 pound fullback from Pen Argyl. Saltern, like Miller, didn't go to college until he was older at age 25. An Albright newsletter read, "When the line opened up at all, "Gook" went thru for substantial gains. When not carrying the ball, he was a whole team of interference," the newsletter read. Saltern was playing football for Pen Argyl YMCA team as early as 1913

Saltern was vital to the Albright team on offense and defense, which was noteworthy to the media. One headline read, "Albright Wins Minus Captain Saltern." Another read, "Saltern Stars in PMC Victory." Saltern scored both touchdowns in a 13-6 win over PMC (Widener U.) and made several runs gaining substantial yardage.

In Saltern's rookie season of 1920, playing in only his third game, Saltern scored on a pass reception and later scored another receiving touchdown after a 50-yard run that put Albright in scoring position.

Saltern once scored three touchdowns during a 77-0 rout of Juniata and scored twice on several other occasions.

"Around this gridiron warrior, Coach Benfer expects to build a strong team next year," a statement read in the newsletter.

Dr. Herbert Jago, a prominent Pen Argyl dentist and Donald McFall of Bangor were two of the four players on the 1922 Albright team with connections to the Slate Belt.

Jago stood six-feet tall, and although he only weighed 158 pounds at the time, played left tackle. In the 1923 season he played every quarter of the season except one.

According to an Albright newsletter published in 1923, "..... he (Jago) is aggressive to the extent of mercilessness. In clean, hard, consistent fighting Jago ranks among the highest in the squad," according to the newsletter. McFall was an end and running back during he his freshman year in

1922. In 1923, he took a leave of absence to care for his ailing father. After graduation he played in community football with the West Ends and Hogan A.C. of Allentown.

In 1928, McFall took a job in Bangor High School, teaching Social Studies and as an assistant football coach to Head Coach Douglas Brown. In addition to his work at Bangor High School, McFall became pastor of the United Evangelical Church in Freemansburg, Pa.

In 1929, McFall's career path took him to Pen Argyl High School where he became head football coach replacing Coach Blaine McCarty. In his first year, Pen Argyl began with wins over Northampton and Emmaus. After that, injuries hurt the team's progress, losing their final six games including a 6-0 loss to arch-rival Bangor. McFall was replaced one-year later by the legendary LeVan Smith (who coached Albright in 1947-48) however, McFall remained as a teacher in Pen Argyl.

In 1930, he was appointed pastor of a new United Evangelical Church in Allentown at Tilghman and 22nd Street. In 1934, he became president of the Brotherhood of the Presbyterian Church. Eventually, he became pastor of Bethel Evangelical United Brethren Church in Quakertown.

Shortly before McFall became head football coach at Pen Argyl in 1929, Ray Hoffman (Carl and Mabel's brother) became head football coach at Bangor in 1927. When Ray was a freshman at Albright and Carl a senior, the pair started games with Carl at Quarterback and Ray at halfback. In a 1916 game with Dickinson, Ray was slated to take Carl's spot at quarterback since Carl was injured.

Another connection to Albright came from Andy Leh who was a promising freshman at Albright, but transferred to Muhlenberg in 1924. Leh is known as one of the Lehigh Valley's greatest football coaches when he was at Nazareth from 1927-1956. Bangor and Pen Argyl were regular opponents of Nazareth every year until 1995.

Costumes should be short enough to prevent kids from tripping and falling. Children should wear well-fitting, sturdy shoes. High heels are not a good idea for safe walking.

At home

Leave your front lights on so trick-or-treaters have a well-lit path to your door.

There's no need to rake up all the leaves in your yard! Leaving some on the ground is not only good for wildlife, but your yard and garden as well.

Check out these fall yard conservation tips: Leave the leaves -- leaves provide food, shelter, and nesting materials to a

variety of wildlife and insects, such as moth and butterfly pupae.

Build a brush shelter -- branches, sticks, and leaves can be used to make

Build a brush shelter -- branches, sticks, and leaves can be used to make brush piles that shelter native wildlife.

Leave the seeds -- plants and grasses should be left standing over winter (seed-bearing perennials such as coneflower, Joe Pye weed, and sunflower provide food for songbirds).

Avoid chemical fertilizers -- grass clippings and mulched leaf litter can provide plant nutrition; chemical fertilizers can reduce beneficial insects.

Kichline Family Affair

Ronald Kichline's playing career at Ursinus was preceded by brothers Roy and Ellwood.

Roy graduated from Bangor High School in 1907 and began his began his career in football and baseball at Ursinus in 1908, graduating in 1912. Only an inch shorter and a few pounds lighter than Ron, Roy at 5-9,170 was also a stellar running back for the Bears.

In 1910, Kichline, running back George Gay and tackles Rob and Kerr Thompson were key players in the Bears 24-0 shutout of Haverford. They also defeated the Penn Quakers and bolstered the team's success over the next two seasons.

A quote from the Philadelphia Inquirer read, "Time and again Gay and Kichline were only stopped by the secondary."

Kichline who was a starting halfback since 1909 was also the team's punter.

In 1910, the Bears' only loss came at the hands of Lafayette in a 10-0 final. Among their wins was 53-0 shellacking of Temple helping them to a 6-1 season.

Roy and Elwood were teammates on the baseball team along with, Gay and the Thompsons. Roy played an outfield position or shortstop while Ellwood played third base.

In 1912, Roy batted .302 and hit five home runs during a 14-game schedule.

In September 1912, Roy was hired as head football coach and a teacher at Bridgeton High in New Jersey which was among the best high schools in the garden state. His teams in 1912 and 1913 played well and had a long winning streak.

In the fall of 1914, however, Kichline became ill and returned to his parents home in Bangor where he died at the age of 24 in late January of 1915 from complications related to pneumonia.

Tragically, Roy Kichline was the third member of the

famous quartette that led Ursinus to several winning seasons through 1912. Robert Thompson, brother of Kerr, choked to death on a piece of meat in 1912. George Gay died of a broken neck he sustained in

The Kichline family also suffered through the death of their only daughter, Marion Evelyn Kichline, who died at her home, 18 South Second street, Bangor, from unspecified complications at age 23 in 1925. She was Bangor High School graduate, class of 1922 and later took two terms at the East Stroudsburg Normal School. She had taught two years in Washington Township prior to her death.

community league football game in 1913.

Ellwood, who graduated from Ursinus in 1914 was Roy's team with the Ursinus baseball team from 1910 - 1912. Ellwood also played with the Bangor A.A. baseball team and a had a tryout with Columbus Ohio

International League. He also spent 22 years in the military as a Master Sergeant with the distinction of serving in World I and World War II.

Prior to the Kichlines' achievements at Ursinus, two other Slate Belt residents were valedictorian and salutatorian at Ursinus in 1885.

On June 25 of that year, Samuel H. Phillips of Johnsonville was the valedictorian and delivered a speech entitled, "The Moral in the Beautiful." The salutary was presented by Silas Lockard Messinger of Flicksville. His address was entitled, "Adherence to Principle is the condition of the Success in Life."






Great Coach and Player

Ronald Kichline of Bangor was head football coach at Juniata when his team suffered a 41-0 loss to Benfer's Albright team in 1921 making still another connection in the Bangor-Albright web.

The Kichline family lived just two blocks from the Hoffman Family in Bangor. In addition to Ronald, the family had two other sons, Roy and Ellwood who also had distinguished athletic careers.

Ronald was a highly regarded fullback at Ursinus College in Collegeville, Pa. and was the team captain during his senior year. He played four years including a few starts in his freshman year of 1912, just three months after graduating from Bangor High School.

In 1915, Ursinus upset Navy 10-0 with Kichline playing a major role on both sides of the ball, including the Bears' only touchdown...

A story in the Baltimore Sun read," In Kichline, the captain and fullback, Ursinus delivered a player who showed greater ability of a line plunger than any other player who has come to Annapolis this season."

Later, Kichline scored a pair of touchdowns in a win over PMC.

In a 7-0 loss versus Villanova that same season, Kichline, despite injuries to both knees, carried the ball every time during a drive after the opening kickoff, reaching Villanova's 20-yard line before Ursinus was stopped.

In the fall of 1916, he embarked on a coaching starting at

Mansfield where he was head coach of football for five years and basketball

improved to 13-5 in 1922.

four years.

Neither team had a losing season under Kichline. His 5-year mark in football was 21-12-2 and his four-year record in basketball was 28-6. His next stop, while only brief, was at Juniata in 1921 which was only the second year of football for the Eagles. The team finished 0-8. In 1922, he was succeeded by his childhood buddy from Bangor, Carl Hoffman. Kichline's basketball team completed a 8-7 season while his baseball team chalked up a 4-5 mark, but

In the fall of 1922, Kichline left Juniata to coach sports and teach math at Vermont Academy in Saxons River, Vermont. The academy was a prep school that had just resumed their sports program and chose Kichline as their coach. The academy played other prep schools and freshman teams from

nearby small colleges such Middlebury and Norwich. There is very little information about his coaching at the academy other than a 7-0 win over Middlebury in football and the recruitment of a player from Bangor with

the surname of Evans.

In 1925, he returned to his alma mater at Ursinus as the school's coach and math instructor. Like most coaches of that era, he coached all sports as he did at Mansfield.

Kichline's goal for the Bears was to upgrade their schedule to play teams of better quality.

In the college's 1926 "Ruby" yearbook Kichline wrote, "....at Ursinus during the past ten years (we) have been far beneath that which all supporters of Ursinus would have them be. With the new athletic system, it is expected that Ursinus can lift herself to a position which she at one time held among the colleges. The college itself is expanding and

with this growth it is only natural that the athletic prowess proceed simultaneously and in proportion. Our schedules show that we have stepped considerably higher in the athletic realm.....-

His first game in the 1925 football season was at Franklin Field in Philadelphia where Ursinus played the Penn Quakers before a crowd of 45,000 fans. Unfortunately, the Bears came out on the short end of a 32-0 game. They ended their season with a 44-0 loss to Army at West Point. Still the team won two games and tied one for 2-6-1 mark.

In 1926 with games versus Temple, Rutgers, Delaware and Army, Kichline's team finished a at 1-7 with their sole win over Franklin & Marshall.

The 1927 season featured wins over Delaware, and Swarthmore. They also lost some close games to Lehigh 6-0, George Washington 7-0 and Army 13-0. They also defeated

Muhlenberg 15-0, atoning for a 41-0 loss to a Benfer-coached team at Albright team in 1921, for a final record of 5-4. The Mules were coached by "Haps" Benfer who was married to Mabel Hoffman, former Bangor resident who lived just two blocks away from Kichline when they were students at Bangor High School.

In 1928, Kichline's team again defeated Benfer's Muhlenberg team 6-0. In 1929 Kichline made the Muhlenberg rivalry versus Benfer a three-peat with a 9-7 win.

Kichline's final season in 1930 at Ursinus was his best, ending with a

His combined overall college mark over 15 years in all sports was 157-143-8.

After leaving Ursinus he went to work in the insurance industry and was a college and high school sports official. He also was highly sought, after-dinner speaker and was known for his interesting and hilarious presentations.

In December 1941, he returned to Bangor to give a talk to the 1941 Bangor High School football team at Ross Common Manor Barn.

In 1943, he became the interim head football coach at Reading High school when regular coach Andy Stopper was inducted into the Navy in World War II.

Kichline stayed at Reading for three uneventful years before returning to the insurance business.

Rivalry Game 104 Set For Friday at Bangor

The Bangor -Pen Argyl football rivalry, which officially began in 1922, can actually be traced to a first-known encounter in 1910 won by Bangor, 12-0. It's also likely that other games were played before and after 1910, however, there is no known documentation to support that conclusion.

Very little is known about the 1910 game since newspaper stories of that era contain very little information about local high school games.

For now, the details of that game are unknown and will likely remain so for a long time.

We do, however, know the names of some players that <u>could</u> have participated in the that first game. It's also fair to say, based on some anecdotal accounts, that not all players were students. "Ringers" as they were known, most likely worked in the quarries and also played for the community and high school football teams.


Carl Hoffman and Ronald Kichline most likely played for Bangor and Harry 'Gook" Saltern for Pen Argyl.

No information is available about their exploits in high school, but their accomplishments in college suggests these men would have excelled in high School.

We will present stories about these men this week in the lead-up to the 104th rivalry game.

Hoffman was a star quarterback for three years at Albright and one year at Juniata. He also was a college coach and played minor league baseball.

Kichline excelled as a running back for Ursinus and also coached college football for 15 years. Read more this week.
