

There's no need to rake up all the leaves in your yard! Leaving some on the ground is not only good for wildlife, but your yard and garden as well. Check out these fall yard conservation tips:

Leave the leaves -- leaves provide food, shelter, and nesting materials to a variety of wildlife and insects, such as moth and butterfly pupae.

Build a brush shelter -- branches, sticks, and leaves can be used to make brush piles that shelter native wildlife.

Leave the seeds -- plants and grasses should be left standing over winter (seed-bearing perennials such as coneflower, Joe Pye weed, and sunflower provide food for songbirds).

Avoid chemical fertilizers -- grass clippings and mulched leaf litter can provide plant nutrition; chemical fertilizers can reduce beneficial insects.

Have a Hazard-Free Halloween



Tips on keeping your ghosts and goblins safe during trick-or-treat festivities from Lehigh Valley Reilly Children's Hospital.

When we think of Halloween, we picture laughing children in colorful costumes, their buckets and pillowcases brimming with candy and treats. However, experts warn that this fun-filled night can pose safety hazards. Below are tips compiled by the team at Lehigh Valley Reilly Children's Hospital and the Children's ER to help everyone have a safe and enjoyable Halloween.

Costumes

Purchase or make costumes that are light and bright enough to be clearly visible to motorists.

Tip: Add reflective tape so a costume will glow in the beam of a car's headlights. You can find reflective tape at hardware and sporting goods stores.

Costumes should be short enough to prevent kids from tripping and falling. Children should wear well-fitting, sturdy shoes. High heels are not a good idea for safe walking.

At home

Leave your front lights on so trick-or-treaters have a well-lit path to your door.

Make sure your kids eat a healthy meal before trick-or-treating, so they'll be less likely to overindulge on candy.

On the streets

Young children should trick-or-treat with an adult or a responsible older child. Instruct children to stay on the sidewalk and out of the roadway. Remind them to walk, not run, and to go to houses only where they know the people inside.

To easily see and be seen, children should carry flashlights.

While driving on Halloween, keep an eye out for youngsters walking between driveways and cars, or crossing in the middle of the block rather than at corners.

to play for the Pen Argyl A.A on Labor Day where he pitched a shutout in the first game of a doubleheader with Mauch Chunk and homered in both games.

Masters also had an impressive resume. From 1931 – 1939 he pitched in Major League baseball for the Washington Senators, Philadelphia, Phillies and the Philadelphia A's.

Philadelphia Eagles. Later he played for the Chicago Cardinals where he was also a punter.

During his NFL career he completed 19 of 58 passes for 273 yards and two touchdowns. His career punting average

was 38 yards per punt.

This leads to an interesting piece of trivia: Name two former Pen Argyl athletes who became punters for Chicago in the NFL. The answer - Walter Masters, Chicago Cardinals and Bob Parsons, Chicago Bears.

Masters went directly from college to the majors in 1931 but barely pitched in his first season with the Washington Senators. He went to the Youngstown Buckeyes the next year and went 11–14 for the Central League team but his 3.12 ERA was second-best among pitchers with 10 or more decisions. He was 3–3 with a 5.49 ERA for the International League's Albany Senators in 1933. After two years out of organized baseball (during which time he coached the Canadian football team Ottawa Rough Riders and played in the semipro St. Lawrence League) Masters was president, manager and business manager of the Ottawa Senators in the Can–Am League in 1936. He went 11–8 with a 4.40 ERA and played the outfield at times, hitting .270 with 4 homers and 40 RBI. Masters (a Knute Rockne All-American in college) played in the NFL that year as well, appearing for the Philadelphia Eagles as a quarterback.

in a total of 6 games[1]) then went 8-10 in 1940 for the Wilmington Blue football player, playing for the Chicago Cardinals in the 1943 and 1944 Rocks and Portland Beavers. Masters then returned to the NFL and played in seasons and finishing the 1944 season 1942 for the Chicago Cardinals as a punter-quarterback and in 1943 with the Card-Pitt. Overall, he did not excel in the NFL, averaging a loss of .6 yards per Steelers). carry, completing under a third of his passes and throwing five times as many interceptions as touchdowns.

After six years out of organized baseball, Masters pitched for the Ottawa Trojans of the Ontario Rugby Ottawa Nationals and went 11-4 with a 3.22 ERA and won both ends of a Football Union and as a pitcher for doubleheader. Masters finished his baseball career at the age of 40 in that the Ottawa Nationals of the Border 1947 campaign.

Masters was born in Pen Argyl, Pennsylvania, on March 28, 1907. After inducted into the Greater Ottawa attending Pen Argyl High School, West Philadelphia High School 1924, and the Haverford School 1925-26, Masters enrolled in the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School 1927-1930.

Masters, an All-American pitcher, played three years of varsity baseball as well company specializing in the cleaning as for his class's freshman baseball team. He also played halfback on Penn's of buildings. He died in that city on varsity football team. He was also a member of the Sphinx Senior Society and July 10, 1992.

In 1930, former Penn athlete Walter Masters returned to his Pen Argyl roots Delta Sigma Phi and Phi Kappa Beta fraternities. Although he attended the University for four years, he did not receive a degree before becoming a professional athlete.

Masters' athletic career is most remarkable because he played professionally in two sports, baseball and football. He made his major league debut as a pitcher for the Washington Senators on July 9, 1931, and played a total of When wasn't playing baseball, he was a quarterback in the NFL for the three seasons in the majors, not just for the Senators in 1931, but also for the Philadelphia Phillies in 1937, and for Connie Mack and the Philadelphia Athletics in 1939.

> During the 1930s Masters was also playing football, amateur and professional, in the United States and in Canada. He began with the All-

Philadelphia football team in 1931, the same year he played baseball with the Washington Senators. The following year, because of a U.S. baseball regulation prohibiting players from playing other sports, he moved to Canada to play amateur football with the Ottawa Rough Riders. Unfortunately, after one season, he was disqualified from playing further amateur football because of his 1931 season as a professional baseball player with the Washington Senators. Since he was not able to play for the

> Ottawa Rough Riders football team, during 1933 and 1934 he coached the team. He also kept playing baseball, pitching for the Ottawa Crains of the St. Lawrence League in 1935 and in the Can-Am League in 1936.


In 1936 he returned to the United States where for the next decade he played both professional league baseball (in both the major and the minor leagues) and professional football. He played professional football for the Philadelphia Eagles in 1936. After this season, he returned to professional baseball, playing for the Philadelphia Phillies in 1937, for Connie Mack and the Philadelphia Athletics in 1939, and also for such minor league teams leagues as Youngstown

Masters returned to the majors for limited duty in 1937 and 1939 (appearing in the Central League. During World War II he was again a professional

Is Taking Care Of Your Pet More Stressful Than Being A Parent? Two In Three Pet Owners Think About Their Pet Aging As Much As Themselves

Taking care of your pet is more stressful than managing a romantic relationship or being a parent, new research suggests.

That's according to a survey of 2,000 pet owners, which found people are more stressed about their ability to care for their fur pal (42%) than their relationship with a partner (37%) or their kids (30%).

That may be because over half (51%) think their fur pals are also experiencing stress.

When asked what would help their pet feel calmer, their human companions noted spending more time outside (47%), connecting with other pets (46%), spending more time with them (44%) and a pet therapist (43%) as potential solutions.

Conducted by OnePoll on behalf of ElleVet Sciences for Pet Wellness Month, the survey also found people think about their pet aging as much as they think about getting older themselves (65% each).

Pet parents think they can identify the signs their pet is slowing down, such as if their pet lacks energy (56%), no longer enjoys their favorite activities (54%) and has difficulty scaling stairs (51%).

Similarly, people pointed to lack of energy (60%), joint soreness (48%) and not enjoying the things they usually do (48%) as signs they, too, are getting older.

People's top three worries about their pet's health are digestion (37%), the inability to play and enjoy life (37%) and their pet's heart health (33%).

When it comes to their own health, people's concerns include not being able to enjoy sports or activities without fear of injury (39%), their heart health (38%) and digestion (37%).

Over two-thirds (68%) of pet parents said watching their pet age and suffer would be very hurtful for them, more so than losing an expensive item (62%), losing their job (61%) and divorcing or breaking up with a partner (61%).

Many grew up with a pet and still cherish those memories, thinking about their childhood fur pal more than three times a week, or about 180 times a year.

Many of the paintings on display during Sunday's open house were done by John T. Koshinski, landscape painter and sculptor.


According to his autobiography he says, "I've lived my entire life in the Mud Run Valley where from the earliest years, the diverse flora, fauna and landforms of the eastern forests, streams and meadows were my constant companions and the subjects of study on many levels. To a large extent this has been the inspirational source of my artwork. I began as a sculptor working in stone, wood and cast materials. I spent ten years making my living doing architectural carvings in wood. Eventually I devoted myself more and more to my greatest love which was depicting the landscape in oils and acrylics."

In 1864 a cornerstone was laid for a small rural church outside the village of Martins Creek, Pennsylvania, known today as Three Church Hill.

Over the next 150 years America would experience cataclysmic changes both in industry and lifestyle. Through drought, depression and two World Wars the Trinity Lutheran church stood as a steady sheltering place for both worship and community. Beneath the church's simple wooden rafters, weddings took place, births were celebrated, and funerals were held.

In 1958 the combined congregations of Trinity and Mt. Zion adopted the name of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church.

The church is located at 2804 Church Road, Martins Creek.

Homeowners Find Bugs & Pests Every Week

When bugs or pests cross their path, one in 10 Americans enter "exterminator mode" faster than you can say "buzz off."

More specifically, according to a new survey of 2,000 homeowners or renters with a yard or lawn, 15% of respondents will squish a bug regardless of where they see it — inside or outside.

That number is higher when looking at indoor squishers — 43% said if bugs or pests are found inside their home, only then would they kill it. A third (32%) will do the same solely to bugs they see outside.

The average homeowner encounters a bug or pest about five times per week, both inside and outside their home.

Conducted by OnePoll on behalf of TruGreen, results revealed that more than half (56%) feel frustrated when they find a bug or pest in their home. Others feel scared (39%), disgusted (39%) or anxious (39%).

Still, 22% would rather call in a professional or get someone else to squish it for them. Only 17% would swat it, and 12% feel it is their duty to release them back to nature.

But when they step outside, many others said they'd either ignore it (19%) or do some research on what type of bug or pest it is (18%).

Results revealed that more than half (56%) base their decision on whether or not to squish on what the bug or pest looks like. Just as many (56%) will contemplate the harm creepy crawlers could cause their kids and pets or worry about damage they could cause to their home (50%).

But everyone has their limits. Offenses from beetles (43%), centipedes (42%), cockroaches (42%), mosquitoes (21%) and spiders (16%) force respondents to take action when inside the home.

Outside, many respondents will squish or remove centipedes (39%), beetles (38%), bees (36%), and cockroaches (34%).

As unveiled by respondents, the worst-case scenarios for encountering a bug or pest in your home include cooking in the kitchen (24%), getting ready to go to sleep (23%), relaxing in the living room (16%) and even while taking a shower (12%).

Almost half (49%) of respondents have had a memorable, or unpleasant, bug/pest experience. Those include "being bitten by fire ants outside my home," "ate my garden," and even "(an) ant bit me when I was taking my shower."

When asked about common bug or pest misconceptions, it's clear that misinformation is still circulating. Almost half (48%) of respondents think it's true that bugs or pests won't come inside a clean home.

Four in 10 even believe the age-old myth that the average person swallows eight spiders in their sleep over their lifetime to be true.

More than two-thirds of respondents (68%) said they would hire a professional for bug or pest issues and concerns.

Slaters Mix Runs & Passes to Trample Lehighton 49-20

Bangor 5-2 With 3 Games Left

Bangor started a bit slow Friday night at Lehighton, but shifted gears late in the first period when quarterback Greg Campbell connected with wide receiver Alex Farensbach on a 50-yard pass play to take a 7-0 lead with 4:20 to play in the quarter.

In the second quarter, Campbell threw his second of three touchdown passes when he completed a 25-yard strike to MJ Siu, giving the Slaters a 14-0 lead.

Any thoughts of a rout were temporarily put to rest later in the period when the Indians scored a pair of touchdowns, changing the course of a shutout to a 14-14 tie.

Campbell and Farensbach, however, gave the Slaters momentum going into the second half, when they combined on a two-yard pass play for a 21-14 advantage at halftime.

Running back Noah Hillis ignited the Bangor ground game in the third quarter when he ran for a 64-yard touchdown making the score 28-14.

Hillis later lit up the scoreboard when he broke through the line on a five-yard run for his second of three touchdowns putting the Slaters up three scores with a 35-14 lead.

Lehighton, however, was not yet ready to throw in the sponge when they connected on a long pass play cutting the Slater lead to 35-20.

Hillis, however, rambled 38 yards a shortly thereafter giving the Slaters a commanding 42-20 lead.

Campbell later put the proverbial icing on the cake when he ran around the right side for a 49-20 lead.

Homecoming is scheduled for next Friday when the Slaters will host undefeated Northwestern (7-0) which crushed Pottsville 56-14 last night.




