Gooooaaaal(s)! For Pen Argyl's Senior Goalie

With students back in the swing of things this year, this year's Pen Argyl senior class is soaking up all of the opportunities they've missed since their sophomore year. There's a full menu of concerts, clubs, ceremonies, and sports available to take in, and senior varsity soccer goalie Graham Rose is staying ahead of the game for all of it.

While this is Rose's last year playing soccer, he certainly has a full career behind him. He's been playing for 13 years on various teams, and has played the goalie position for seven years.

"I started playing soccer with various in-home teams in Slate Belt and Wind Gap at a young age," Rose said. "I also played recreationally for Wind Gap Thunder and a club team called Keystone. Now I only play for our high school team. I was originally a defender, but I've spent time in almost all positions on the field."

"I really enjoy soccer because it's very unique and is a popular sport globally," he continued. "Even in Pen Argyl there is a strong soccer community."

With his final year looming over him, this goalie has set some big goals that he would like to achieve before he leaves.

"My goal for soccer this year is to get a varsity goal since I rarely get field time," Rose said. "As a team, I'd like to get district gold and the colonial playoffs, both of which would be a first for the Pen

Argyl team."

Rose's love for soccer doesn't end on the field. He also spends time coaching young soccer players, hoping to share his passion with the next set of players.

"I enjoy helping to teach and coach soccer," Rose said. "I spent much of my time training as a goalkeeper outside of my teams because good goal keeping trainers are few and far between. I want to be able to help other young kids get a proper introduction to goal keeping that I didn't have myself."



Rose's hardworking dedication is visible in more than just his performance as a goalie. Besides his work on the field and coaching, Rose is a motivated student and leader.

"Aside from soccer, which I train for all year, I also swim and run track," Rose said. "This year, I'm taking Honors English 12, AP European History, AP Calculus, AP Biology, and Honors Lab Physics. Outside of school, I am a Boy Scout and a Sea Cadet."

As for the future? Rose looks to continue to serve

others, particularly our nation.

"My future plans involve a lot of military service," Rose said. "My top priority is the Naval Academy, but I'm also looking into the Coast Guard and Airforce academies along with NROTC programs."

Oldest Living Identical Twins 107

TOKYO (AP) — Guinness World Records has certified two Japanese sisters as the world's oldest living identical twins at 107, in an announcement Monday coinciding with Respect for the Aged Day, a national holiday in Japan.

Umeno Sumiyama and Koume Kodama were born the third and fourth of 11 siblings on Shodoshima island in western Japan on Nov. 5, 1913.

They were separated after elementary school, when Kodama was sent to work as a maid in Oita on Japan's southern main island of Kyushu. She later married there, while Sumiyama remained on the island where they grew up and had her own family.

The sisters later recalled their difficult younger days. Growing up, they said they were bullied because of prejudice against children of multiple births in Japan.

Busy with their own lives for decades, the sisters rarely met until they turned 70, when they started making pilgrimages together to some of the 88 Shikoku temples and enjoyed being reconnected.

Sumiyama and Kodama were 107 years and 300 days old as of Sept 1, breaking the previous record set by famous Japanese sisters Kin Narita and Gin Kanie at 107 years and 175 days, Guinness World Records Ltd. said in a statement.
