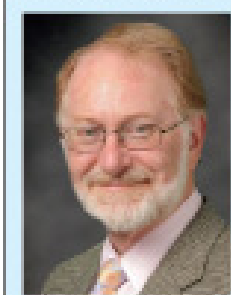

## September 8 Mystery of Stone Landscapes

The Slate Belt Heritage Center will hold their monthly historic program on Thursday, September 8th @ 7:00 PM. Speaker for the evening will be Mr. Jim Wilson of Northampton County Parks and Recreation and the New England Antiquities Research Association. Mr. Wilson will present: "Mysteries of Constructed Stone Landscapes in our Woodlands and Wetlands". Ceremonial Stone Landscapes is the term used by the United South and Easter Tribes (USET), a nonprofit intertribal organization of American Indians, for stonework sites in eastern North America. USET states that, for thousands of years, before the immigration of Europeans, the medicine people of the USET Tribal ancestors used these sacred landscapes to sustain the people's reliance on Mother Earth and the spirit energies of balance and harmony.

Whether these stone structures are massive or small, stacked, stone rows or effigies, these prayers in stone are often mistake by archeologists and State Historic Preservation Offices as the effort of farmers clearing stone for agricultural or wall building purposes. That long held view in now shifting and is being reevaluated in Pennsylvania, which is rich in stone landscape structures, including here in the Lehigh Valley. In the presentation you'll see scores of photographs of local "Prayer in Stone", learn how the dates of these structures can now be determined and how the PA State Historic Preservation Office is working with citizen volunteers to document ceremonial stone landscapes across the Commonwealth. Learn what history, science and Native Americans have to say about these ambiguous stone works found throughout the Northeast Woodlands- including" here in the Slate Belt".

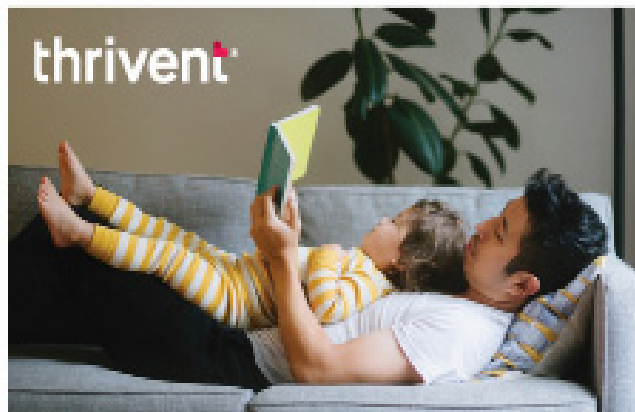

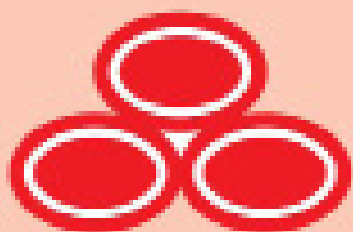

# Deadline Extended for 2021 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program

The deadline for senior citizens and Pennsylvanians with disabilities to apply for rebates on rent and property taxes paid in 2021 has been extended to Dec. 31.

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The income limit is \$35,000 annually for homeowners and \$15,000 annually for renters, and half of Social Security income is excluded.

The maximum standard rebate for homeowners is \$650, but supplemental rebates for certain qualifying homeowners can boost rebates to \$975. The Department of Revenue automatically calculates supplemental rebates for qualifying homeowners.

Claimants are encouraged to file their rebate applications online by visiting [mypath.pa.gov](http://mypath.pa.gov). No account is required. Applicants who still wish to file a paper application form may obtain Property Tax/Rent Rebate claim forms (PA-1000) and related information on the Department of Revenue's website or by calling 1-888-222-9190.

Rebates will be distributed beginning July 1, as required by law. The easiest way to check the status of your rebate after July 1 is to use the Where's My Rebate? tool. To check on the status of your claim, you will need your Social Security number, claim year and date of birth

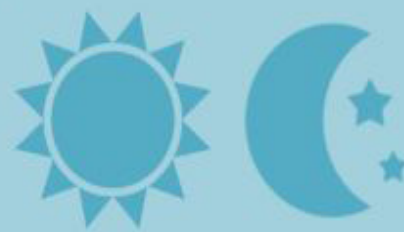

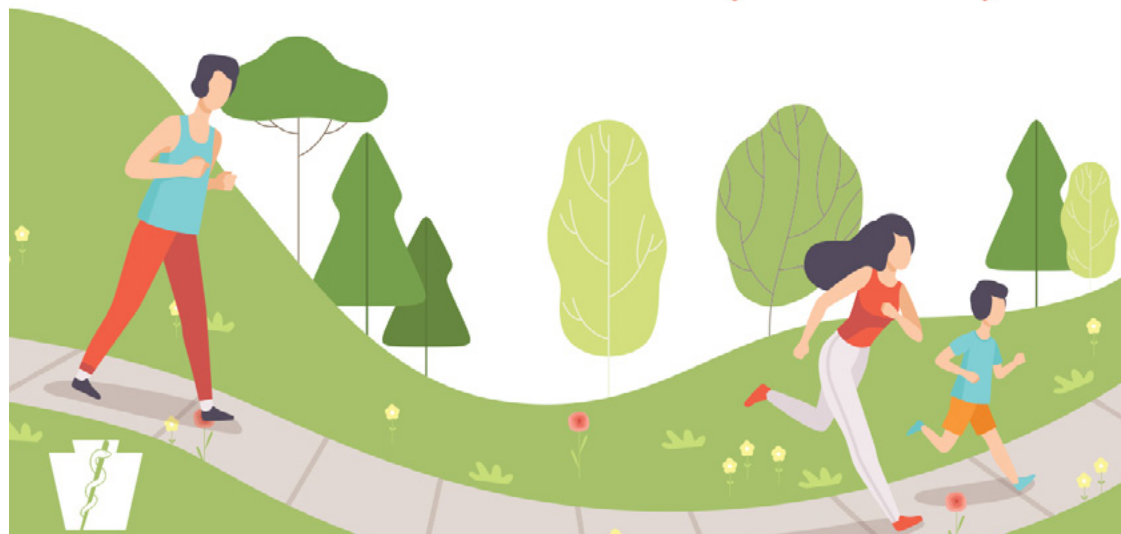

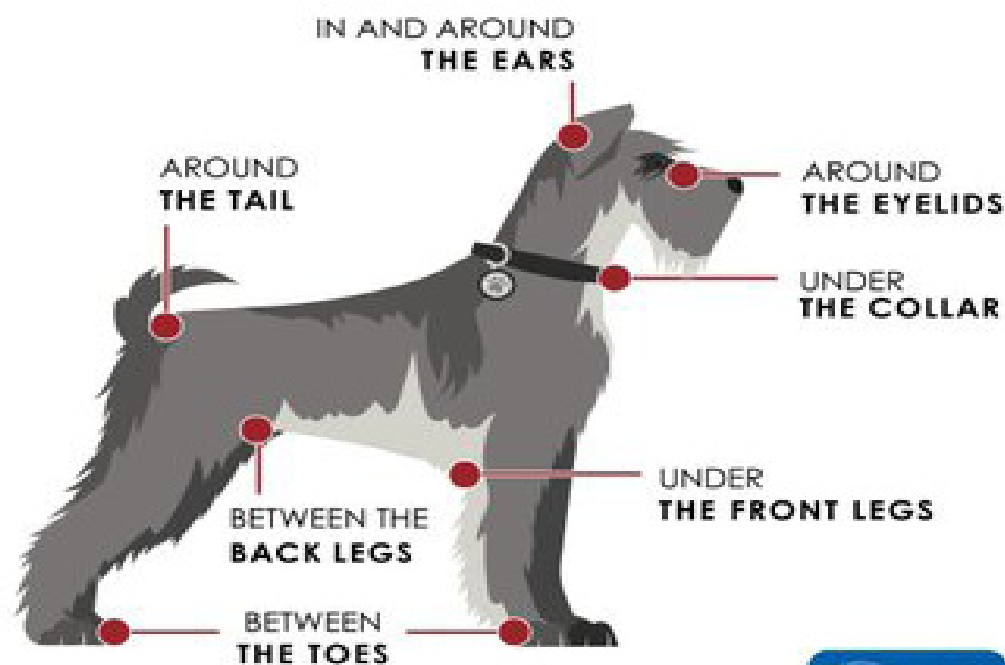

## Ways to Help NATIVE BEES



- Plant native trees. Trees provide a large nectar source from their blossoms and habitat for some bees.
- Plant native plants that bloom during the spring, summer, and fall to provide a continuous food source.
- Avoid using herbicides, pesticides, and insecticides. Find organic ways to garden and remove pests.
- Provide water and habitat such as bare soil in your garden for ground-nesting bees, leave plant stems standing in winter, dead trees or fallen logs, or bee nesting houses.
- Participate in citizen science opportunities to help count bees like the Bumble Bee Watch, Great Sunflower Project, and more.
- Spread the word! Let others know how they can help.



## Tips for planting a POLLINATOR GARDEN

- Choose native plants which provide nutritional value for pollinators and require less maintenance
- Choose native plants that bloom at different times (early spring – late fall), providing food all season
- Choose plants with flowers of different sizes, shapes, and colors for the diversity of pollinators
- Plant at least 3 or more of one kind of plant together to provide larger drifts of color to attract pollinators
- Form a weed barrier by planting natives closer together instead of using mulch or landscape fabric
- Save garden clean up until spring! Pollinators overwinter in different life stages

## Pennsylvania State Flower Facts



Chosen as state flower in 1933 by Governor Gifford Pinchot



Shrub that grows 4 to 10 feet high and blooms late May through June



Not an easy to grow landscaping plant, has particular soil needs



All parts of shrub are toxic to people and animals

Host plant for the Laurel Sphinx Moth



Attracts butterflies, hummingbirds, and other pollinators



Considered one of the most beautiful native flowering shrubs



Provides shelter for birds and small mammals in winter



## Ways to Help Eastern MONARCHS



- Plant native nectar plants that bloom in the spring, summer, and fall in a sunny area.
- Plant the caterpillar host plant milkweed (butterfly weed *Asclepias tuberosa*, common milkweed *Asclepias syriaca*, swamp milkweed *Asclepias incarnata*).
- Avoid using herbicides and pesticides. Find organic ways to garden.
- Enhance monarch habitat by providing water and a place to shelter with dense patches of wildflowers and shrubs.
- Participate in citizen science opportunities where you can help track monarch sightings in spring and fall.
- Spread the word! Let others know how they can help.

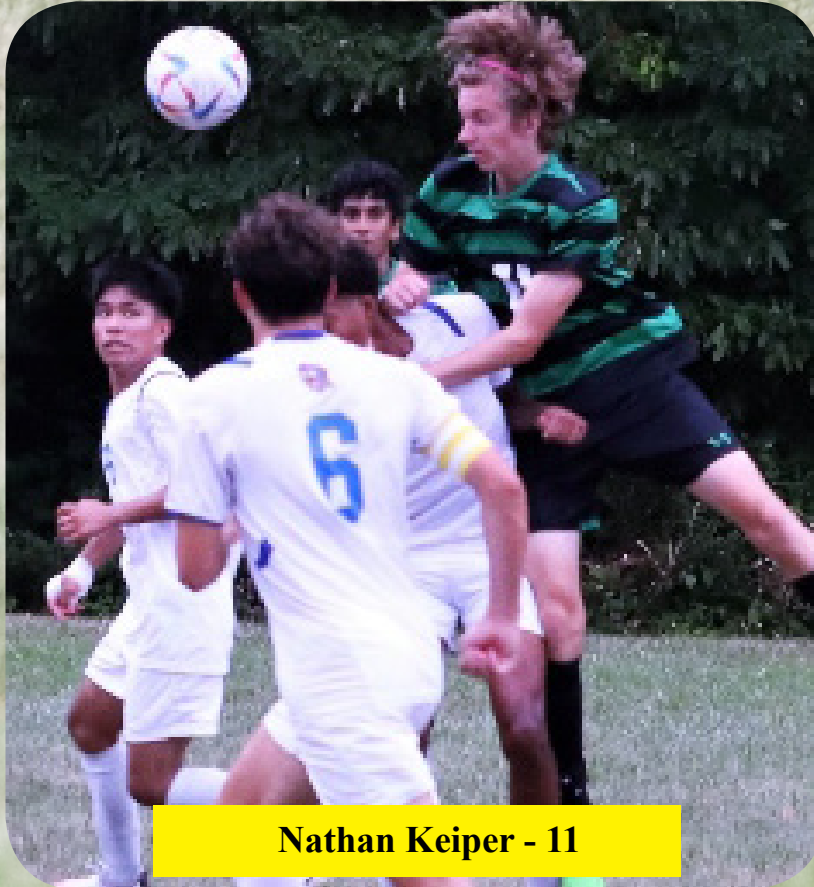
