

The visit included a detailed discussion about Waste Management's Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fleet and how to handle any potential emergencies. Brian Stahl, a Grand Central Hauling truck driver, Maintenance Manager Matthew Gibas and Maintenance Supervisor Bruce Archer provided the instruction and demonstration for the emergency features on the CNG fleet.

Stahl is no amateur when it comes to Waste Management's trucks. He has spent 27 years with Grand Central Hauling and equally the same amount of time as a fireman. He serves as the Fire Chief for Bushkill Township Fire Company – one of the emergency crews that would service Grand Central Landfill.

Grand Central's Landfill Manager, Joe Statile and Sr. Community Relations Specialist, Adrienne Fors provided a detailed explanation of the facility in the parking lot at the office. Due to COVID, the team couldn't tour the facility on the bus like previous years.

The discussion included the facility's' landfill gasto-energy project and the Grand Central Wastewater Treatment Plant. Having knowledge of how to access these buildings will help crews at a time of emergency.
