Volunteers Turn Bungalow Into a Dream Home for 10-year Old Quadruple Amputee

A ten-year-old boy who lost both arms and legs to illness has thanked a group of kind-hearted volunteers who turned his bungalow into a "dream home."

Luke Mortimer said he was thrilled with the adaptations undertaken by charity Band of Builders, comparing the stunning makeover to something "you only see on TV."

The grateful lad was just seven years old when he lost his arms and legs after getting the severe bacterial infections meningococcal meningitis and septicemia.

He later moved to the ground-floor home, in Embsay, UK, which his dad Adam Mortimer had begun to adapt before reaching out to Band of Builders for help.

The 12-strong team, who worked for free, finished most of the work on the property - including a new kitchen, heating system, shower room and wooden flooring - in June.

And after they completed the final touches, they gave delighted Luke the first tour of his new home on Sunday (Sept 3).

Luke said: "I would like to thank the Band of Builders team for making my life so much easier around my home.

"I can remember that when they first came the house looked like a wreck, but then within a few weeks, it looked like a dream home that you only see on TV and I still can't thank them enough."

The refurbished house now has easy-to-use fittings in the shower room and a smooth floor in the kitchen, where Luke spends a lot of time with his brother, Harry.

The young lad's carpeted bedroom has also been fitted with cupboards, and he even has places on his wall for his framed rugby shirts, signed by his favorite players.

Dad Adam, 49, a builder by trade, said he was overwhelmed with the work of the charity, which regularly helps out the families of those with life-changing injuries.

He said: "We are massively grateful to Band Of Builders for coming into our house and helping to make the house accessible for Luke.

"The work would have taken me years to complete, but the Band Of Builders got us to a decorated finish in 8 weeks.

"There isn't enough praise, and thank yous that we can give to Band Of Builders! What an amazing charity and bunch of people."

Luke, previously a keen rugby player for Skipton RFC in North Yorkshire, was first struck down with meningococcal meningitis on December 13, 2019.

He was transferred to Sheffield Children's Hospital, where doctors found life-threatening septicemia, also known as blood poisoning, had developed in his body.

Patriot Day on September 11th honors the memory of the nearly 3,000 innocent victims who died in the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks. Each year Americans dedicate this day to remembering those who died and the first responders who risked their own lives to save others.

For many, September 11, 2001, began like any other weekday. We made our way to work. Children attended school. We shopped, had coffee, waited in line at a drivethru. Those of us who weren't in New York City heard the first reports on the radio or television. A friend or neighbor alerted us to a plane flying into one of the Twin Towers. We felt disbelief. An accident, perhaps, a miscalculation. Then, a second plane flew into the second tower. Our disbelief turned into uncertainty and concern.

Those on the ground faced terror and obstacles they had never known. But, then, as a set of coordinated suicide attacks organized by the militant group Al Qaeda targeted the World Trade Center, the rest of the nation witnessed the unbelievable. And then a third plane crashed into The Pentagon. And yet another crashed into a field in Shanksville, PA.

Every year since that fateful day, the United States comes together to remember the fallen. We remember the first responders and those who made difficult decisions. Since that day, memorials have risen from the ashes.

September 4, 2002 – President Bush proclaimed September 11, 2002, as the first Patriot Day.

September 9, 2016 – President Barack Obama proclaimed September 11th as Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance,

Moravian Museum Music &

Lecture Series

Nazareth, PA—The Moravian Historical Society is pleased to announce that its fall Museum Music and Lecture series will kick off on Sunday, September 17 at 2:00 p.m.

Dr. Andrea Lynn Smith, Professor of Anthropology at Lafayette College, will discuss her recent publication, Memory Wars: Settlers and Natives Remember Washington's Sullivan Expedition of 1779. Smith's research explores the public memory of the Sullivan Expedition (1779) of the Revolutionary War. This expedition, the brainchild of George Washington, led to the destruction of some forty Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) villages. Today it is the subject of over 60 historical markers in Pennsylvania and well over 200 in New York. In Memory Wars, Smith contrasts settler accounts with how the Sullivan story is expressed at Haudenosaunee cultural centers.

Smith's previous books include the awardwinning Colonial Memory and Postcolonial Europe: Maltese Settlers in Algeria and France (2006, Indiana); and Rebuilding Shattered Worlds:

Creating Community by Voicing the Past (Nebraska, 2016). She is currently working on a book on the public memory of the 1737 Walking Purchase Lenape land treaty in Pennsylvania.

The talk will be followed by a book signing with the author and a reception.


















Moravian Museum Music & Lecture Series

Dr. Andrea Lynn Smith, Professor of Anthropology at Lafayette College, will discuss her recent publication, Memory Wars: Settlers and Natives Remember Washington's Sullivan Expedition of 1779. Smith's research explores the public memory of the Sullivan Expedition (1779) of the Revolutionary War. This expedition, the brainchild of George Washington, led to the destruction of some forty Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) villages. Today it is the subject of over 60 historical markers in Pennsylvania and well over 200 in New York. In Memory Wars, Smith contrasts settler accounts with how the Sullivan story is expressed at Haudenosaunee cultural centers.

Smith's previous books include the award-winning Colonial Memory and Postcolonial Europe: Maltese Settlers in Algeria and France (2006, Indiana); and Rebuilding Shattered Worlds:

Creating Community by Voicing the Past (Nebraska, 2016). She is currently working on a book on the public memory of the 1737 Walking Purchase Lenape land treaty in Pennsylvania.



In fact, more than three-quarters (78%) of respondents feel weddings are more memorable when they reflect the couple's lives.


Conducted by OnePoll on behalf of Minted Weddings, the survey revealed that regardless of how the couple chooses to customize their day, some traditions are best left in the past.

Early Slate Belt Labor Day Celebrations Began in 1908

SEPTEMBER 5, 1882

Bangor

The first recorded evidence of a Labor Day Celebration in the Slate Belt occurred in 1908 in Bangor, featuring many union men at the head of a Labor Day Parade.

The art on Main Street in Bangor decorated the street for the occasion, and Fitzgeral-Speer Company of Pen Argyl entered a float in the parade.

Two baseball games were scheduled for the day featuring Pen Argyl and the "All-Bangor Team" to be played at Flory's Field on North Main Street.

There were plenty of speeches, and a picnic was held in the Lutheran Grove on Broadway.

In 1912, the main speaker was James Maurer, president of the State Federation of Labor and others "well known to the public were also on hand."

It was decided that "no band would be employed for the parade unless its members belonged to the musicians' Union."

Pen Argyl

Labor Day celebrations in the Slate Belt reached a new peak in 1921 in Pen Argyl where Northampton County held its second celebration which would "far exceed any of its kind that was ever held in the county."


Speeches by P.F. Duffy from the American Federation of Labor and others highlighted the day. Baseball games were played at Pen Argyl's new "athletic diamond" at the recently constructed Weona Park.

The East Bangor Band held a concert throughout the afternoon, but the main event, however, was a "mammoth parade" with YMCA bands from Nazareth, Quakertown and Roseto. Nearly every labor organization in the county participated with over 2,000 union men.

Observed the first Monday in September, Labor Day is an annual celebration of the social and economic achievements of American workers. The holiday is rooted in the late nineteenth century, when labor activists pushed for a federal holiday to recognize the many contributions workers have made to America's strength, prosperity, and well-being.

Before it was a federal holiday, Labor Day was recognized by labor activists and individual states. After municipal ordinances were passed in 1885 and 1886, a movement developed to secure state legislation. New York was the first state to introduce a bill, but Oregon was the first to pass a law recognizing Labor Day, on February 21, 1887. During 1887, four more states – Colorado, Massachusetts, New Jersey and New York – passed laws creating a Labor Day.

THE FIRST LABOR DAY PARADE

Average American Employee Hasn't Had A Raise In 3 Years

Almost Six In 10 Men Believe Salary Is Influenced By Their Gender Compared To 54% Of Females

Talker Research

The average American employee hasn't received a raise at their current job in the last three years.

That's according to a recent OnePoll survey of 2,000 American adults ahead of Labor Day.

Although Labor Day's core mission is to celebrate workers' contributions to America, 46% out of the 1,859 employees polled said they feel "somewhat recognized" at work, while 8% said they don't feel recognized at all.

Respondents also laid out their top concerns about the current workforce, with Gen Z saying they're more concerned about the nationwide worker strikes than the lack of job security (69% vs. 49%).

Meanwhile, half of millennials surveyed were more worried about salary cuts (53%) than wage gaps (49%) and worker strikes (45%).

The Gen X and boomer generations, however, had similar worries when it came to lack of job security (45% and 49%) and wage gaps (44% and 46%).

Regarding pay disparities, 73% of all adults agree the gender wage gap is still very real.

In fact, almost six in 10 working men believe their current salary is influenced by their gender (58%), compared to 54% of female employees.

When it comes to making a difference in the workplace, half believe speaking directly to management is the most effective way to pressure companies and bosses to improve work conditions and pay (51%).

Many also think labor/union strikes (49%), filing an HR complaint (40%) or posting on social media (36%) could positively change workplace conditions.

As worker strikes continue to dominate headlines, 41% of respondents said they previously participated in a labor strike, while 47% had never done so.

Of those who have participated in a strike, most protested for better work schedules (68%), higher pay (58%), better health insurance (56%) and to negotiate for better benefits (48%).

When asked if they currently belong to a union, 43% of workers said yes, while 43% said no.

Most union members said joining one was the best work-related decision they've ever made (93%).

Playing Newborn Babies Mozart Relieved Their Pain Researchers Measured The Pain Levels Of 100 Newborns Blood Test

laying newborn babies a Mozart lullaby relieved their pain during a blood test, suggests a new study. American researchers measured the pain levels of 100 newborns undergoing a heel prick blood test in New York as part of routine screening for conditions such as jaundice.

Half the babies listened to an instrumental Mozart lullaby for 20 minutes before and during the heel prick and for five minutes afterward, while the other half did not listen to any music.

Regarded as one of the greatest composers in history, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart composed more than 800 works before his death at the age of 35 in 1791.

The babies were, on average, two days old and born at 39 weeks, while just over half were boys.

As part of standard care, all the babies were given 0.5 milliliters of sugar solution two minutes before the heel prick was performed.

A researcher wearing noise-canceling headphones assessed the babies' pain levels before, during, and after the heel prick.

Pain levels were determined according to the babies' facial expressions, degree of crying, breathing patterns, limb movements, and levels of alertness.

The researchers accounted for the potential influence of other sensory inputs on pain levels by consistently performing the procedure in a quiet, dimly lit room at an ambient temperature and by not providing the babies with pacifiers or physical comfort.

The team observed similar pain levels in both groups of babies before the heel prick, with both groups having average pain scores of zero, out of a maximum possible score of seven.

But the pain score of babies who listened to the lullaby was "significantly lower" during and immediately after the heel prick, compared to those who did not listen to music.
