This Day in History

Empire State Building Dedicated

On May 1, 1931, President Herbert Hoover officially dedicates New York City's Empire State Building, pressing a button from the White House that turns on the building's lights. Hoover's gesture, of course, was symbolic; while the president remained in Washington, D.C., someone else flicked the switches in New York.

The idea for the Empire State Building is said to have been born of a competition between Walter Chrysler of the Chrysler Corporation and John Jakob Raskob of General Motors, to see who could erect the taller building. Chrysler had already begun work on the famous Chrysler Building, the gleaming 1,046-foot skyscraper in midtown Manhattan. Not to be bested, Raskob assembled a group of well-known investors, including former New York Governor Alfred E. Smith. The group chose the architecture firm Shreve, Lamb and Harmon Associates to design the building. The Art-Deco plans, said to have been based in large part on the look of a pencil, were also builder-friendly: The entire building went up in just over a year, under budget (at \$40 million) and well ahead of schedule.





Area Lutherans Form Youth Group

Church attendance according to a Gallup poll has shrunk to 30 percent, meaning only three of every 10 people attend church on a regular or near-regular basis. Young adults average about 20 percent while children average about 15 percent.

Considering that the youth of today will be the adults of tomorrow and form the core of church congregations, the outlook is somewhat bleak. A group of Slate Belt Lutheran churches, however, are proactively working to reverse the current trend.

"We are a group of Lutheran churches in the Slate Belt area. Christ Lutheran of Stone Church; Prince of Peace, Johnsonville; Saint Peters, Plainfield; and Trinity (Evangelical, Bangor) are coming together to form a community youth group for kids' 6th grade through 12th," said Christina Hagan of Trinity. "Just to kind of foster community bonding and participation among the congregations."

Just recently on a Saturday morning, youth representing area Lutheran churches participated in a series of activities including, Ice Breakers, Team Building, Tie Dye, Planning, and Worship at Prince of Peace. In one activity the youth enjoyed a game similar to Musical Chairs and in another, they had to work as a team to step through and around a length of rope. "

Today was the first attempt to get kids from each of the individual congregations to come out and start forming kind of the core of a planning team to move us forward," Hagan said. "So we're hoping that these kids will get excited by what they experienced and then they'll go back to their congregations and talk it out to the rest of the kids that they know and continue to build upon the success of today."

The gathering focused on the theme 'It is Good' - based on God's creation and celebrating Earth Day," said Rev. Michael J. Scholtes of Prince of Peace. "This core group of youth will then plan the next youth event that will be open to all."

Pastor Chris Drunkenmiller of St. Peter's echoed the theme of the day.

"It's team building, so they get to know each other a little bit better," he said. "They come from different school districts, different backgrounds so it's a chance to get to know each other and have fun."

Hagan's outlook for the group is focused in the moment.

"(Some people) always say that the youth is the future of the church," she said. "I always cringe when I hear that because I tell people 'no the youth are the now' they are very much a part of what is going on."


The participants were given seedlings to plant which is consistent with the theme of creation, and they were provided by Becks Tree Farm.





Bangor Gets \$2.1 Million for Stormwater & Wastewater

State Senator Lisa Boscola announced today that PENNVEST has approved a total of \$7,611,727 in state investment for projects by the Bethlehem Township Municipal Authority (BTMA) and the Bangor Borough Sewer Authority for improvements in stormwater retention and upgrades to a wastewater treatment plant.

"This PENNVEST funding will enable the Bethlehem Township Municipal Authority to continue its to work to prevent significant and dangerous flooding in Bethlehem Township from the Nancy Run through upgrades and retrofits to three retention basins and the construction a fourth basin," Boscola stated. "It will also allow the Bangor Borough Sewer Authority to make critically needed upgrades to its wastewater treatment plant and collection and conveyance system that will result in the reduction in untreated flow into the Borough's waterways and specifically Martin's Creek. This is another important example of the Commonwealth partnering with local authorities to assist with critically important environmental and public safety projects."

The Bangor Borough Sewer Authority was approved for a low interest loan of \$2,094,727. The Authority's Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project includes upgrades to the wastewater treatment plant include adding a new equalization tank to ensure proper treatment during wet weather flows, replacing the control and monitoring system to allow for real-time operational monitoring, replacing the existing screen screw system, installing an effluent flow meter, and replacing the headworks pump.

Upgrades to the collection system include replacing a pump station and 12,000 feet of sewer main to address inflow and infiltration.

The Tragedy of Distracted Driving

How phones & food take your attention off the road By Joe Nixon (LVHN)

When you drove down the road at 55 mph with your eyes on your cellphone sending a text message, your car traveled the length of a football field.

You essentially drove blindfolded for 100 yards.

You were a distracted driver.

April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month, a time to put the spotlight on something that claims 3,000 lives or more a year in the U.S. Nine people are killed every day in distracted driving crashes, says the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Hundreds of thousands are injured annually.

Did you know?

More than 32,000 people died in distraction-affected crashes over the 10-year period from 2012 to 2021.

At Lehigh Valley Health Network, we see distracted driving accident victims come through the emergency room doors of our hospitals across the region.

Trauma surgeon Katy Wheel, MD, with Lehigh Valley Institute for Surgical Excellence, says vehicle crashes can be devastating. "We see young people with serious brain injuries, college students who will never go back to school. We see other patients who die or have significant orthopedic, chest or abdominal injuries," Dr. Wheel says. "It can change your life completely."

Dr. Wheel says vehicle safety and hands-free driving improvements should not give a false sense of security. "Distracted driving still takes your attention away and you're not focused on what you should be doing," she says.

What distracted driving looks like

While phones can be a prime distraction for drivers, anything that takes your eyes or your attention off the road can distract you from your main job as a driver: driving safely with your eyes on the road and on what's around you. Distractions also can include eating and drinking, talking to people in your vehicle, fiddling with the stereo, entertainment or navigation system, and more.

It can be applying makeup, fixing your hair or rubbernecking at a construction worksite or an accident scene. It can be reaching for something that fell off the seat or simply daydreaming.

The website Opens in new **tabautoinsurance.com** says a study it conducted shows a quarter of drivers admit to regularly texting and driving. It also says 53% of drivers have knowingly broken cellphone laws while driving, and one in three American drivers don't even know their state's rules regarding cellphone use behind the wheel.

The CDC says driving distractions fall into three main buckets:

- Visual: Taking your eyes off the wheel
- Manual: Taking your hands off the wheel
- Cognitive: Taking your mind off driving

Close to home

No place is immune from distracted driving crashes. Newspapers and newscasts carry tragic stories of crashes involving distracted drivers. They tell of lives lost and altered, of families forever changed.



The purpose of this award is to acknowledge individuals and businesses (Architecture Award only) who have performed exemplary acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt.

Candidates may be an individual or group (including businesses as mentioned below) and can be nominated by themselves or by another party.

There are three (3) categories:

1. **Initiative Award:** Applicant who has performed exemplary actions in promoting and preserving the Slate Belt heritage through in-kind actions. This means acts that do not necessarily involve monetary donations, but can be unpaid service for

a preservation cause.

- 2. **Architectural Award**: Applicant (individual property or business) who is saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation; and
- 3. **Special Focus Award**: Applicant who is saving or conserving tradition or a body of knowledge. That individual who contributes to educational information via exhibits, documentation, internet, archival, etc.

Consideration is given to projects with:

- a) specific start and end date;
- b) meet generally accepted preservation or scholar standards;
- c) considered 'complete', i.e. the project had a goal and potentially achieved the goal; and
- d) significant impact with before and after photographs (as proof) that information or a structure that would have otherwise been lost if the nominee had not done the project.

Nominations are now being accepted until March 1st. Nominations should include a description of entry, photos (if applicable), and any pertinent documentation.

The awards are then presented at a special program in June. One prize will be awarded with the possibility of one per category depending on the Committee's review of candidates.


